## **New Construction Update—April 2012**

(This is the fourth in a monthly series of updates to keep all Parishioners informed regarding the progress of the construction of our Permanent Church and our Parish Offices.)


- 3. Electrical and mechanical engineering design continues.
- 4. The civil engineer is working to design the deep utilities including sewer, water, and storm drain site improvements.
- Proposals from various landscape architects are now being reviewed.
- 6. The Interior Design Team (IDT) has decided that the Stations of the Cross will be located outside in the garden area on the north side of the Church. We will continue to use the John Paul II version of the Stations of the Cross.
- The IDT will continue to discuss the possible location of another set of the Stations of the Cross in the Daily Mass Chapel.
- 8. The IDT has decided that Stephen Hirt, who will be designing the altar, ambo, and baptismal font, will also create the candle holders, the ambry, the processional cross, the sanctuary lamp, the Paschal Candle Stand, and the ossuary.
- The IDT is considering tapestries for the St. Thomas More Shrine. That discussion continues.
- The discussion regarding the Presider's Chair and the Associate Chairs continue. The discussion revolves around what kind of elements will be used in the creation of the chairs.
- 11. The IDT continues the discussion of the way in which all donors will be recognized. It has been decided that the names of all donors will be included on a "wall" in the Memorial Garden which will be located on the southwest side of the Church.
- 12. As we prepare for the sound system for our Church, we will include the "loop system." This technology will allow for many who are wearing "hearing aids" to be able to automatically connect to our sound system without the need for an extra "hearing device."

Each Sunday at Mass we pray for all the people who are working "behind the scenes." As you can see, much is happening, and soon, and very soon, construction will begin!

Continue to pray for the success of our building program. Also, if you have not yet made your pledge or given your gift to this year's "Our Journey Into The Future . . . Together" Phase 2.1 Capital Campaign, now is the time. We need you!



## **Immigration Survey: A Snapshot of Our Parish**

In 2011 our Parish hosted an Immigration Reflection Day attended by members of many congregations throughout North County. It was a wonderful experience for each of us sharing our family immigration stories. Listening to each other's stories helped us get in touch with what we held in common and what was unique to each family. Through the use of a time line, we were able to see from which countries we had come to the United States and when—from early times to the present.

Although we cannot replicate that day, the Parish Social Justice Committee is offering a survey to our Parishioners to help us get a "snapshot" of the history of our Parish families, so that we too can celebrate who we are and from where we have come. Parishioners with an email address on record have received a message with the online survey link. (For those without an email address on record, go to the Parish website (www.stmoside.org and click on Quick Clicks) or pick up a copy at our table on the Plaza or at the Parish Office. The paper surveys can be returned to the people at the table, to the Parish office, or in the offertory collection basket.) Please respond as soon as you can.

In the survey, we are asking questions about you and your family and the way they came to the United States. From the results, we will compile some facts and stories that we will share with you in the Parish bulletin. Ultimately, we would like to work out a time line to show how we all came to be in this place, at this time.

## HARNESSING THE POWER OF A HEARTFELT HELLO

Shortly before I accepted my position at St. Thomas More, my wife and I attended Mass to get a feel for the place. We attended the 5:00pm Mass since I was usually at church on Sunday mornings.

The ushers welcomed us and gave us a worship aid with the music printed on it-we saw this as a sign of the Parish's commitment to music. Fr. Ken Kieffer was the celebrant, starting off a solid homily with his trademark humorous opening story—we remarked that if the "number two" guy was this good, hearing a good homily wasn't going to be a problem. We were sitting in the middle of one of the center sections as we like to do when visiting a church when the lady sitting next to us noticed we were unfamiliar, gave us a big smile, and said hello.

I am sure we stood out during that Mass, two people singing strongly, sometimes in harmony, probably sitting in someone else's usual seats, but this lady had turned to us, saying she didn't recognize us, asking if we were new before Mass began. At the end of Mass, she said she hoped we might come back next week. "You really should sing in the choir," she said. Little did she know!

#### This is hospitality at its finest!

St. Thomas More is a powerhouse of hospitality. When members of our Welcome Ministry meet with people who are interested in joining the Parish, one of the most common reasons people give for wanting to join up is the welcoming spirit that permeates this faith community. The chatter before Mass begins, the heartfelt passing of the Christ's peace, and the milling crowd on the plaza after the final song finishes are all indications of our vibrant Christ-centered energy.

## So why are we perpetually short of Hospitality Ministers at Mass?

Recently, we have had just *two or three* people taking care of the *three to five* hundred people who celebrate Mass together. Ideally, we should have *five* Hospitality Ministers at every liturgy.



#### Are we too shy?

Not a chance. Well, maybe, but how much can smiling and saying "Good morning" or "Good evening" hurt us?

#### Are we too busy?

Perhaps, but surely some of us can arrive twenty minutes ahead and stay ten minutes after two Masses each month to welcome the stranger and friend alike.

## Is there danger of paper cuts from the worship aids and bulletins?

Some, but our first aid kits have lots of antiseptic and adhesive bandages to fix you right up.

So, think about becoming a Hospitality Minister. Yes, you!

Ponder it in your heart!

Pray about it!

## Or, maybe, just do it!

Someone once smiled and held out their hand to you the first time you visited this faith community. They said hello. It probably was one of the reasons you joined up.

Is it your turn? We certainly need you right away!





