

It wasn't until 1907 when Anna Jarvis, from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, began a campaign to establish a national Mother's Day. Miss Jarvis persuaded her mother's Church in Grafton, West Virginia, to celebrate Mother's Day on the second anniversary of her mother's death, the second Sunday of May. By the next year, Mother's Day was also celebrated in Philadelphia.

She and her supporters began to write to ministers, businessmen, and politicians in their endeavor to establish a national Mother's Day. In 1910, the governor of West Virginia proclaimed the second Sunday of May as Mother's Day, and a year later every state celebrated it. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson made the official announcement proclaiming Mother's Day as a national holiday that was to be held each year on the second Sunday of May.

But Jarvis' accomplishment soon turned bitter for her. Enraged by the commercialization of the holiday, she filed a lawsuit to stop a 1923 Mother's Day festival and was even arrested for disturbing the peace at a war mothers' convention where women sold white carnations—Jarvis' symbol for mothers—to raise money.

"This is not what I intended," Jarvis said. "I wanted it to be a day of sentiment, not profit!"

When she died in 1948, at the age of 84, Jarvis had become a woman of great ironies. Never a mother herself, her maternal fortune dissipated by her efforts to stop the commercialization of the holiday she had founded. Jarvis told a reporter shortly before her death that she was sorry she had ever started Mother's Day.

She spoke these words in a nursing home where every Mother's Day her room had been filled with cards from all over the world. Today, because and despite Jarvis' efforts, many celebrations of Mother's Days are held throughout the world.

As we remember and pray for our mothers, living and deceased, I share with you this quote from Washington Irving: "A father may turn his back on his child; brothers and sisters may become inveterate enemies; husbands may desert their wives and wives their husbands. But a mother's love endures through all; in good repute, in bad repute, in the face of the world's condemnation, a mother still loves on, and still hopes that her child may turn from his evil ways, and repent; still she remembers the infant smiles that once filled her bosom with rapture, the merry laugh, the joyful shout of his childhood, the opening promise of his youth; and she can never be brought to think him all unworthy."





## **Immigration Survey: A Snapshot of Our Parish**

In 2011 our Parish hosted an Immigration Reflection Day attended by members of many congregations throughout North County. It was a wonderful experience for each of us sharing our family immigration stories. Listening to each other's stories helped us get in touch with what we held in common and what was unique to each family. Through the use of a time line, we were able to see from which countries we had come to the United States and when—from early times to the present.

Although we cannot replicate that day, the Parish Social Justice Committee is offering a survey to our Parishioners to help us get a "snapshot" of the history of our Parish families, so that we too can celebrate who we are and from where we have come. Parishioners with an email address on record have received a message with the online survey link. The paper surveys can be returned to the people at the table, to the Parish office, or in the offertory collection basket.) Please respond as soon as you can.

In the survey, we are asking questions about you and your family and the way they came to the United States. From the results, we will compile some facts and stories that we will share with you in the Parish bulletin. Ultimately, we would like to work out a time line to show how we all came to be in this place, at this time.



## FOUR SOLEMNITIES (AND A CONFIRMATION)



The church of Christ does not so much have a mission as the mission of Christ has a church.

> —Stephen Bevans and Roger Schroeder, Constants in Context: A Theology of Mission for Today



Next Sunday marks the Ascension of the Lord, the first of four consecutive Sunday solemnities, two that mark the end of the Easter season and two that begin Summer Ordinary Time. Taken as a set, they offer a powerful transition from the celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord to that of the mission and ministry that necessarily follow from it.



#### The Ascension of the Lord



The solemn festival of the Ascension directs our attention to the risen Jesus who takes his rightful place in glory. At the same time, however, the Ascension reminds us that the risen Lord's saving work on earth continues now through his disciples, whom he sends "into the whole world [to] proclaim the gospel" (Mark 16:15). The Ascension is not an abandonment of the disciples by Jesus but a way for Jesus to be present in a new way, continuing the saving mission given to him by the Father. The double consequence of this festival of the Ascension is Jesus entering into glory and us taking up his mission as our own.

Praise Team Sanctuary Choir On this Ascension Sunday, Bishop Cirilo Flores will administer the sacrament of Confirmation at the 10:30am Mass.

Confirmation completes the grace of Baptism by a special outpouring of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, which seal or "confirm" the baptized in union with Christ and equip them for active participation in the worship and apostolic life of the church.

#### **Pentecost Sunday**

Pentecost Sunday marks the end of Easter Time. We celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and the beginning of the church, the beginning of our new life in Christ.

In the second creation account in Genesis we are reminded of the creating power of the breath of God. Formed from the clay of the earth, the first humans were simply a lump of clay until the Lord God breathed divine life into them (Genesis 2:7).

In the Pentecost story in John's gospel, Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit into the disciples and by doing so he recreates them (John 20:19-22). The life-giving breath poured forth at the dawn of creation is now the Spirit-breath, the very indwelling of God.

As with those receiving the sacrament of Confirmation, we receive the Spirit in order to be strengthened to take up Jesus' mission. This mission/discipleship motif is what occupies us during the coming weeks of Ordinary Time. The solemnities the church celebrates following Pentecost are solemnities in Ordinary Time—solemnities are connected to the Easter mystery, but not of the Easter season.

## **The Most Holy Trinity**

The gospel reading for Trinity Sunday (Matthew 28:19-20) is sometimes called the "great commission":

Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.

And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.



The life of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—the very power of God to bring salvation to others—is poured into us at Baptism. This life is gift. We share in God's life and mighty deeds, the same deeds that form the pattern of our daily living and bring God's presence to all we meet.

## The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

This solemnity is all about giving oneself, completely. Christ offering his body and shedding his blood on the cross were total self-gift. His gift of the Eucharist is an ongoing expression of this gift of self.

As we share in Christ's Body and Blood, we surrender ourselves to be like Christ—a Passover Lamb for our world today. For the most part we don't need to look for opportunities for total self-giving; the circumstances of daily life generously present them to us. 


