Did You Know?

Our hardwood floor on the upper level gets much use and abuse. It is a floor that is meant for basketball and not all the other activities that now take place on it. The floor is professionally cleaned monthly, and until recently, it was "re-surfaced" once a year. In this yearly process, old layers of varnish need to be sanded off and new layers applied.

This resurfacing has not been done in two years due to budget constraints. The cost for this once a year resurfacing is about \$6,000.

We need to resurface soon in order to protect our floor. Your gift to the "Did You Know?" Campaign will help us to achieve our goal.

Our New Youth Advocate

It was with great sadness that I accepted the resignation of Marc Raymundo as our Youth Advocate in January 2012.

Marc accepted an offer from Junipero Serra High School in San Juan Capistrano, to join their High School Ministry Team on a full-time basis.

J Serra's gain was definitely our loss! Marc did much in his short time with us to bring the youth, not only of our Parish but from the surrounding area, closer to Jesus and to the Church.

We are so grateful for the strong foundation that Marc created on which we will now build for the future.

In my discussions with Kathleen Bell, our Faith Formation Director, it became clear to us that we needed to make the Youth Advocate Position a full-time position. To best serve the Youth of our Parish, we need a person who would be with us full time to minister to our Youth and to integrate them more and more into the life of our Parish Family.

With that decision made, we began to advertise for a full-time Youth Advocate in early February.

We advertised nation-wide, and we had forty applicants!

An Interview Committee was created—Kathleen Bell, Christy De La Cova, Rory Griffin, Stacey Griffin, Will Mueller, Emma Stringer, Kathy Wilson, and me.

adults, whether at the Diocesan Pastoral Center or projects at the US/Mexican border.





Through the power of the Holy Spirit, bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ, and we who receive it are empowered by that same Spirit to be Christ to the world.

FAIR TRADE CHOCOLATE

Did you know that chocolate starts to melt at 93 degrees Fahrenheit—that's why it melts in your mouth? Did you also know that the majority of chocolate brands employ child slavery in the harvesting of their cocoa beans?


