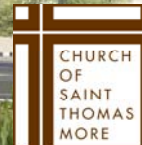

Did You Know?

Our hardwood floor on the upper level gets much use and abuse. It is a floor that is meant for basketball and not all the other activities that now take place on it. The floor is professionally cleaned monthly, and until recently, it was "re-surfaced" once a year. In this yearly process, old layers of varnish need to be sanded off and new layers applied.

This resurfacing has not been done in two years due to budget constraints. The cost for this *once a year* resurfacing is about \$6,000.

We need to resurface soon in order to protect our floor. Your gift to the "Did You Know?" Campaign will help us to achieve our goal.

Pastor's Column

Our New Youth Advocate

It was with great sadness that I accepted the resignation of Marc Raymundo as our Youth Advocate in January 2012.

Marc accepted an offer from Junipero Serra High School in San Juan Capistrano, to join their High School Ministry Team on a full-time basis.

J Serra's gain was definitely our loss! Marc did much in his short time with us to bring the youth, not only of our Parish but from the surrounding area, closer to Jesus and to the Church.

We are so grateful for the strong foundation that Marc created on which we will now build for the future.

In my discussions with Kathleen Bell, our Faith Formation Director, it became clear to us that we needed to make the Youth Advocate Position a full-time position. To best serve the Youth of our Parish, we need a person who would be with us full time to minister to our Youth and to integrate them more and more into the life of our Parish Family.

With that decision made, we began to advertise for a full-time Youth Advocate in early February.

We advertised nation-wide, and we had forty applicants!

An Interview Committee was created—Kathleen Bell, Christy De La Cova, Rory Griffin, Stacey Griffin, Will Mueller, Emma Stringer, Kathy Wilson, and me.

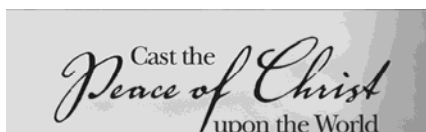

Peter's Pence Collection for the Holy Father

The annual Peter's Pence Collection enables Pope Benedict XVI to offer emergency assistance to those suffering because of war, oppression, and natural disasters. The theme of the collection this year is *Cast the Peace of Christ upon the World*. Through works of charity, Catholics provide a quiet but powerful witness of love and deeds to empower the weak, the defenseless, and the voiceless, and to sustain those who suffer.

One beneficiary of the program is Nazareth Boys Town in Mbare, Rwanda, which received assistance from Pope Benedict XVI to take in abandoned orphans who are victims of genocide and civil war.

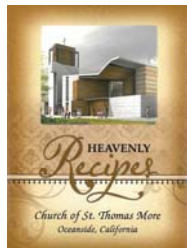

Take, bless, break and share. These actions are at the heart of what the Church does when we celebrate the Eucharist. This weekend we celebrate this action and also the Blessed Sacrament itself. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ, and we who receive it are empowered by that same Spirit to be Christ to the world.

How do we take Christ to the world?? By teaching, evangelizing, healing, serving and acting in good faith to one another. A good example would be the work of the many orders of nuns all over the world who sacrifice daily to achieve on earth what Christ has sent us all to do. As individuals, we can look to our Parish for ways to share our faith in stewardship to insure Christ's message is delivered right here in our community. Every week we are given information on how to reach out of ourselves to others. Confucius said: "It is impossible to help another without helping yourself." Now is the time to help others and feel good about it!
