



LITURGY IS...

Each Church gathers regularly to praise and thank God, to remember and make present God's great deeds, to offer common prayer, to realize and celebrate the kingdom of peace and justice. That action of the Christian assembly is liturgy.

ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The prophet Ezekiel, writing in exile from Babylon, speaks words of comfort and promise to the exiles. God speaks of transplanting a "tender shoot" (v 22) to his mountain. This shoot will "become a majestic cedar" (v 23), a tree known for its strength, and provide a place of refuge. These words offer Israel the hope that they will be restored as a nation and become a source of blessing for others.

Writing to the church at Corinth, Paul reminds us that "we walk by faith" (v 7); our destiny is in the hands of God. Because God has called us, we must strive to live as disciples of Christ as long as we are in this world. We long to be with the Lord, but as long as we are in this world and away from him, let us serve him faithfully.

Jesus's parables often employ agricultural imagery. In today's text we are presented with the parable of the seed that grows in secret. Though we have much better knowledge of the processes of germination and plant growth today, the process remains the same: we plant and the seed slowly comes to life if conditions are agreeable. The growth is gradual and predictable. So it is with the reign of God, Jesus tells us. God's word will produce a harvest, and to the outsider its growth is a mystery. But Jesus has revealed to his disciples that the growth is the consequence of cooperation between God and the believer. If we work with the word of God planted within us, then we will produce a good harvest. The mustard seed, starting out small, is destined to become a mustard plant. The church is called to become a mustard plant, where God's children can find refuge and welcome "in its shade" (v 32).

For Reflection: When have I experienced the hope of the exiles, knowing that in my darkest hour, God is still with me? How have I seen God at work in my spiritual growth and in my service to others?

Pope to Parents: Teach Children to Pray

VATICAN CITY

If children do not learn to pray from their parents, it will be difficult for them to ever learn to communicate with God naturally, simply and deeply, Pope Benedict XVI said. "In the family, children from the tenderest age can learn to perceive the sense of God thanks to the teaching and example their parents give of living in the presence of God," the pope said at his weekly general audience Dec. 28.

Continuing a series of audience talks on prayer, Pope Benedict looked at the Holy Family as a model of family life marked by faith, work, and regular moments of prayer together. "The Holy Family is the icon of the domestic Church called to pray together. The family is the domestic Church and must be the first school of prayer," he said.

While the Gospels do not give many details about Jesus' childhood, he said, the Bible is clear that Mary and Joseph were observant Jews, which means they prayed at regular times throughout the day and before meals.

The Measure of a Good Steward

An old priest who had visited the Holy Land as a younger man described how he saw Jesus' example put into actual practice. Women came to the market for grain, he said, and they would be wearing flowing garments covered by a large apron. They would sit and hold their aprons open and the merchant would pour their measure of grain into the apron. If the woman had found a good and generous merchant, he would allow her to shake down the grain to make room for more; he would pack it in until the apron was ready to overflow.

Jesus was masterful at using examples with which his listeners could identify. And cannot the Christian steward readily identify with the women at the market? When we encounter someone who goes out of their way to be generous with us, it warms the heart. We feel a glow of gratitude that brightens our day and propels us to pass on that generosity.

We are bathed in generosity by a God who never fails to give more than we expect or deserve. With a grateful heart, we thank God for these gifts by extending a full measure, a good measure, of our lives' resources to serve Him in others.

Jesus concluded by saying, "For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you." Jesus wasn't just assuring us of some heavenly reward, some pie-in-the-sky benefit to generosity. He was declaring that the generous heart of a steward is rewarded every day by a growing awareness and closeness to the God who can never be outdone in generosity.

In today's Gospel, Jesus compares the beginning of God's kingdom to a mustard seed. This tiny seed, which fits in the palm of a hand, can grow to fifteen feet with sprawling branches!

Like the mustard seed, the Christian community had a tiny, seemingly insignificant beginning. The church, which began with about 120 followers, added 3,000 people on Pentecost Day following the descent of the Holy Spirit. Since then, the number of Christ's disciples has grown incalculably and continues to grow throughout the world. Good stewards go about God's business of "planting seeds" among all those they encounter.

What will we do this week to add to God's kingdom?
