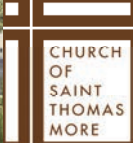

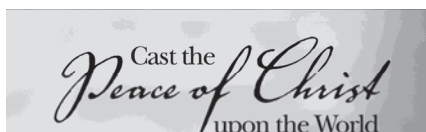

One beneficiary of the program is Nazareth Boys Town in Mbare, Rwanda, which received assistance from Pope Benedict XVI to take in abandoned orphans who are victims of genocide and civil war.

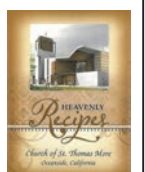

LITURGY WITHOUT WORDS

Prayer is not an effort to make contact with God, to bring God to our side. Prayer, as a discipline that strengthens and deepens discipleship, is the effort to remove everything that might prevent the Spirit of God ... from speaking freely to us and in us. The discipline of prayer is the discipline by which we liberate the Spirit of God from entanglement in our impatient impulses. It is the way by which we allow God's Spirit to move freely.

—Henri Nouwen, from *Compassion: A Reflection on the Christian Life*



Most Catholics associate the term “liturgy” with formal Christian community rituals—the Mass, Eucharist, prayer services and administration of sacraments—in which we pray, sing, gesture, and receive Christ together—a weaving together of scripture, music, vocal prayers, spoken reflections, holy food and holy drink. We touch and hear, sing and pray, taste and see that God is good. Words, water, wheat and wine; incense, oil, candles, and vestments; hands lifted to praise or to share peace; thoughts, feelings, and insights—all form our tapestry of worship.

There is also, however, a kind of “liturgy without words” that requires no spoken prayers, tangible objects, or focused mental reflections. It is not intended to replace the other more well-known form of liturgy, but it can bring a new depth and dimension to it. It involves a prayer that is, according to Trappist priest Thomas Keating, “the opening of mind and heart—our whole being—to God, the Ultimate Mystery, beyond thoughts, words, and emotions.” One sits quietly for twenty to thirty minutes, alone or with a group, and simply consents to the presence and action of the always-indwelling Trinity. We gently let go of the internal chattering, plans, and reflections that constantly swim inside our minds by returning to one silent sacred word, such as “Jesus” or “Love,” whenever we notice that we have become distracted or caught up in any particular train of thought. Over time, when practiced consistently, this prayer of consent helps to nourish the soul, purify intentions, reduce resistances to grace, and deepen one’s relationship with Christ. And, in the words of Gail Fitzpatrick-Hoppler, it can enable us to “live ordinary lives with extraordinary love.”

Over the centuries, this prayer has been known by many names: Prayer of the Heart, Prayer of Simplicity, Prayer of Simple Regard. Its primary scriptural inspiration is Matthew 6:6—“Whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father in secret, and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.” It also draws upon

teachings provided in the anonymously-written fourteenth-century classic, *The Cloud of Unknowing*. Today, the term “Centering Prayer”—a phrase first coined by Thomas Merton in the twentieth century—refers to this daily contemplative practice that invites us to surrender to God who dwells deep within our hearts as our “Center,” holding and sustaining us through a wondrous and silent gravity of love.

Though I try hard, I still find it difficult to describe this prayer and its effects. Experience of the prayer itself is a much better teacher. If you would like to learn more about Centering Prayer, come join us in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel at 1:00pm on Thursdays. We can introduce you to the prayer and provide you with more resources about it.

One more thought about Centering Prayer as “liturgy without words.” It is a kind of liturgy—and even a subtle form of intercessory prayer—whether we pray with a group or alone in our own room. This is because our persistent, loving, silent consent to the divine presence—our “resting in God”—cannot help but be communal, reaching out to both God and neighbor. As Fr. Keating notes, “just to BE with God is to be with everyone else and with everyone else’s needs, because that’s where Abba [God as loving Father] IS and where the Divine concerns are also.” Perhaps this is why some of our best-known contemplatives—Mother Teresa, Dorothy Day, Henri Nouwen, to name a few, also lived lives of service with and to the poor, embracing both Martha (“action”) and Mary (“contemplation”).

Through grace, says Keating, we can open our hearts wide to God, whom we know by faith is within us, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than consciousness itself. Acquaintanceship with Christ can flower into friendship, trust, and love. Blockages to the Holy Spirit can dissipate. Conversation with Christ can simplify and deepen, giving way to communion. These are some of the fruits of Centering Prayer, which can build and strengthen communities of faith.

The Search to Believe in China

with Fr. Eugene Geinzer, SJ



What is the condition of Christianity in China today? Fr. Gene has experienced many Chinese people who call themselves Christian, their faith is very strong, but they have not been baptized. He asks, "Is this a new example of Baptism by Desire?"

Fr. Gene will lead a conversation in regard to the 1500 year-old tradition of Christianity in China, with its "ups and downs," conflicts, and purges. He will also talk about Pope Benedict's recent "Letter to China," and give some first-hand anecdotal information on the practices and policies of the conflict between Church and State in present day China, as well as stories about Christians in China today.

Rev. Eugene Geinzer, SJ has been a Jesuit for fifty years and was ordained a priest in 1974. His studies have included Classical Languages, English Literature, Fine Arts, and Theology.

He was Chairman of the Fine Arts Department at Loyola University in Chicago before taking up his new challenge in China. He is the local superior of the Jesuits working in Beijing and, at the Beijing Center, he supervises four annual Academic Excursions for 80 to 125 students.

These journeys have taken him across the breadth of China by train, boat, bus, camel, and taxi.

He has been in China for six years and hopes to stay for many more years.

Marriage & Family Life Corner

On April 12, the Ad Hoc Committee on Religious Liberty of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) issued a document, “Our First, Most Cherished Liberty,” outlining the bishops’ concerns over threats to religious freedom, both at home and abroad. The bishops called for a “Fortnight for Freedom,” a 14-day period of prayer, education and action in support of religious freedom, from June 21-July 4. Find out more at: www.fortnight4freedom.org.

The Bishops’ Letter on Marriage—Responsible Parenthood: Natural Family Planning: “Natural family planning (NFP) methods represent authentic family planning. They can be used both to achieve and to postpone a pregnancy. NFP makes use of periodic abstinence from sexual intercourse based upon the observation of the woman’s natural signs of fertility, in order to space births or to limit the number of children when there is a serious reason to do so. NFP methods require that couples learn, accept, and live with the wonders of how God made them. This is essentially different from contraception.”
