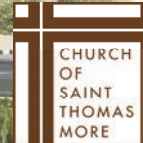

Pastor's Column

New Construction Update—June 2012

This is the sixth in a monthly series of updates to keep all Parishioners informed in regard to the progress of the construction of our Permanent Church and our Parish Offices.

Did You Know?

Fiscal Year Ending (FYE) 2010 ended in a deficit of \$28,000. We carried this deficit with us into FYE 2011.

FYE 2011 ended with a balanced budget, in the black, except for the \$28,000 deficit carried over from FYE 2010.

FYE 2012 has ended "in the red" with a deficit of about \$30,000 (we are still in the process of "final figures.") We also still have the deficit from FY 2010 of \$28,000.

This means that as we begin FYE 2013, we are carrying a deficit of about \$58,000 that needs to be resolved.

Your contributions to the "Did You Know?" Campaign help greatly! We would not have balanced our FYE 2011 without your help! And your contributions in the FYE 2012 helped greatly as well.

When you have "a little extra," please remember the "Did You Know Campaign?" It does make a difference and we will need your help in this new fiscal year!

1. The Renzo Zecchetto Architects Firm is completing the interior architectural woodwork design.
2. An Audio/Video consultant has been retained and is presently designing a state of the art sound and video system for the Church.
3. A Landscape Architect has been retained and is currently completing a site landscape plan with the civil and electrical engineer.
4. An Acoustical Engineering Firm has been retained to study background noise of HVAC equipment to ensure the correct equipment is selected.
5. The final design and coordination with the structural, mechanical, and electrical elements for the Church and the Parish Office Building continues.
6. The Interior Design Team (IDT) continues to coordinate with our Liturgical Consultant, Robert Habiger, and the various artists who have been retained to create the altar, the ambo, the tabernacle, the baptismal font, the ambry, the Blessed Sacrament Lamp, the candlesticks, the Marian Shrine, and the St. Thomas More Shrine.

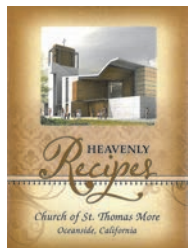

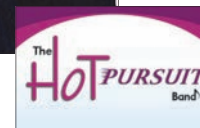

Our Faithful Servers— Our Sacristans

Whenever you come to Mass, do you ever wonder who unlocked the church door for you? That would be the sacristan. The Catholic Encyclopedia defines a sacristan as an officer who is charged with the care of the sacristy, the church and its contents. The sacristans at St. Thomas More faithfully open the church doors and make everything ready for the Eucharistic Celebration.

Matt Abrahms, Stephen Abrahms, Rebecca Eyer, Robert Fay, and Brendan Hamill (weekends), as well as Elaine Cassidy, Zachary Cornwell, Rebecca Eyer, Beverly Kowallek, and Edith Noel (weekdays) serve our faith community as sacristans. Duties include arriving at Church at least an hour and a half before Mass time to insure all is ready for our Eucharistic Celebration—unlocking doors, turning on lights and sound system, setting up necessary tables and displays on the Plaza, setting up the Credence Table to ensure that necessary books—Sacramentary, Lectionary and Book of the Gospels are properly set using the Ordo. The Sacred Vessels; the Chalices, Patens, and Purificators; the cruet of water, tray, and hand towel are all in place.

The sacristans are also responsible for ensuring that the candles are lit, binders for the Celebrant and Lectors are set in their appropriate locations. There are many more duties and responsibilities our sacristans are called to provide especially during Advent, Christmas, Lent, Holy Week, and the Fifty Days of Easter. They also prepare for Baptisms, Weddings, and Funerals. After the last Mass on the weekend they put everything back in its place before turning off the lights and locking the doors. Their duties are ancient and have been performed in every corner of the world in Cathedrals and small rural Parishes across the country. Our Eucharistic Celebrations are enriched as these men and women perform their Liturgical Duties.

Please join me in thanking them for a job well done.

Exercising Good Christian Stewardship During the Summer

July is the heart of a hot, languid summer. It's vacation time for many, time to rev up the grill, or skip out to the swimming pool. We shed heavier clothes in favor of hot weather informality.

Even our reading material changes with the heat and light: that heavy biography becomes an easy-on-the-beach thriller.

So it's probably true that our approach to stewardship changes with the seasons as well—it changes but doesn't disappear. In fact, July can be a wonderful time to re-examine our own attitude towards our faith and our stewardship commitments.

Sunday Mass and an occasional weekday liturgy are just as important as ever. But we are freer in the summer, especially if you have kids in Sunday faith formation classes in the winter, to try different Mass times, visit a neighboring Parish, or experience a new Parish while on vacation. Get out and experience the Church from a different perspective.

But remember that summer offers a Parish no respite from its bills. Our Parish needs our consistent commitment of support. St. Thomas More offers electronic giving. 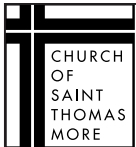
Marriage & Family Life Corner

Parenting Pointers—Teaching politeness, Part 2: If your child interrupts you, uses crude language, pushes someone aside, etc., Stop and take the time to teach a “do over” like, “Excuse me, may I interrupt you?” The answer might need to be, “As soon as I finish this phone conversation.” Yes, this is an interruption in itself, but also a teachable moment.
