

Pastor's Column

Let Whoever Is Simple Turn in Here!

"Let whoever is simple turn in here!" (Proverbs 9:4) This one line is taken from today's First Reading.

I think it would make a great message for a sign in front of our Church or any Church, for that matter!

But I wonder how many people would turn in because of it? Would more people "turn away" rather than "turn in" because they would not want to be considered "simple?"

"Simple" has a negative connotation in our world today. When we say that someone is "simple-minded," it describes a person who seems to be unable to fully cope with life; someone who has less than what is necessary to properly navigate through the waters of this life.

Yet, here is the dictionary definition of "simple:" ...easy to understand, deal with, use; not elaborate or artificial; not ornate or luxurious; unaffected, unassuming, modest; not complicated.

Reflecting upon that definition, I would be happy to call myself "simple," and I would see "simplicity" as a goal worthy of achievement!

Wisdom calls: "Let whoever is simple turn in here." To the one who lacks understanding, she says, "Come, eat of my food, and drink of the wine I have mixed! Forsake foolishness that you may live; advance in the way of understanding."

This piece of Scripture tells us that if we are to enter into God's presence and to be fed and nourished by our God, we must let go of artificiality, ornateness, luxuriousness, and to experience God, we must be unaffected, unassuming, modest, and not complicated.

All of this so goes against the world in which we live! We create artificial shells in which we live, and we pride ourselves in trying

to have more, be more, and do more than others. We live in an environment of competition rather than in a spirit of cooperation.


We are constantly comparing and judging others against ourselves. Material possessions, educational background, income status, titles and degrees, all seem to be the qualities by which we judge ourselves and others.

And yet, all of this is foolishness! None of it lasts. None of it is important in the eyes of our God.

All that matters is our "simplicity." Our willingness to accept life on its terms and not ours, to see ourselves as pilgrims on a journey of faith, to realize that we have come from God and that we are making our way back to God.

"We are spiritual beings having a human experience, not human beings having a spiritual experience." (Rev. Pierre Teilhard de Chardin)

Along the way, we need to be fed and nourished, and this is what our God desires to do for us, and will do for us, if we heed the advice of Wisdom, as she speaks to us: "Let whoever is simple turn in here!"

Little Rock Scripture Study

Wednesday, September 19 at 9:00am or Thursday, September 20 at 7:00pm we begin our 14-session study of Paul's letters to the Galatians and the Romans. These sessions are open to all who would like to spend time in a small group growing in love for the scriptures through study and discussion.



Galatians and Romans are pivotal for those seeking to understand the faith and teaching of the Apostle Paul. Many of Paul's themes are shared by Galatians and Romans, but the tone and length of the two works differ sharply.

Galatians addresses Paul's understanding of Christian freedom and justification by faith. He reprimands the Galatians for deserting the Gospel by seeking justification through circumcision rather than through faith in Christ, who achieved our salvation by his sacrifice on the cross. Romans is the longest of Paul's letters. It addresses the universal reality of sin in the world and the need for salvation in Jesus Christ. It explores both the strength and limits of the law of Moses. Paul examines the new life attained in the Holy Spirit as God's gift and proclaims the mystery of God's plan to save Israel. Romans also highlights the ethical demands of the gospel.

TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME*Bread of Life Discourse—Week Three*

The Book of Proverbs consists of material that spans many centuries of biblical Israel's history, primarily the days of the monarchy from the 11th to the 6th centuries BCE. The first nine chapters, including today's reading, are thought to be from a later century when the writings were compiled, sometime after the Exile. These texts, along with other "Wisdom" writings, give us some insight into the centuries leading up to Jesus. Wisdom is personified as a woman who is hosting a feast. She invites the naive to partake of her banquet and "advance in the way of understanding". As an ancient textbook for young men living in Israel, the book encourages them to choose the better of the two ways: the way of life. Wisdom is offered to all, but not everyone accepts the invitation. Early Christianity came to understand Wisdom as a foreshadowing of the Word-made-flesh, Jesus Christ.



The Ephesians are warned not to live foolishly but to be wise, "making the most of the opportunity, because the days are evil." Today's reading exhorts the community to dedicate itself to striving to grow in wisdom and acting in holiness in their relations with one another. We too need to heed these words as we are also called to be God's light to the world.

In the Gospel today, Jesus tells us that he is "the living bread that came down from heaven". But John tells us that some had a hard time understanding this. Since Jesus has not yet instituted the Eucharist, they think that he means they must eat and drink his actual flesh and blood. John's church understands this, as their weekly celebration of the Lord's Supper is a sharing in the body and blood of Christ. Jesus says that there are two benefits in eating his flesh and drinking his blood: it unites the believer to him, and it leads to eternal life.

Our First Christian Steward: The Blessed Virgin Mary

On August 15 we celebrated the Feast of the Assumption; the day we recall Our Blessed Mother being assumed into heaven and crowned queen. The Gospel reading on that day proclaims once again the Canticle of Mary, recorded in the Gospel of Luke (1:46-55). It is the Virgin Mary's song of joy in response to her cousin Elizabeth's greeting (*Luke 1:41-45*) and summarizes Mary's deep faith and trust in God.

This joyous song is also known as the *Magnificat*, from the opening line of scripture's Latin translation which means "My soul magnifies the Lord" (*Magnificat anima mea Dominum*). The *Magnificat* is a beautiful stewardship prayer used by the Church every day since the fifth century. It is a hymn at Evening Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches us that the *Magnificat*:...is the song both of the Mother of God and of the Church; the song of the Daughter of Zion and of the new People of God; the song of thanksgiving for the fullness of graces poured out in the economy of salvation and the song of the "poor" whose hope is met by the fulfillment...(#2619).

Among the many stewardship themes in this reading, the prayer helps us realize that God's stewardship plan turns the world's values upside down. And for those who entrust their lives to the Lord, they are filled with good things.

As a very young woman, humble and poor, Mary becomes an interpreter of God's plan of salvation, she reveals to us the fundamentals of good stewardship, and she becomes a prophetic witness to social justice for all future generations who "will call me blessed" (*Luke 1: 48*).

Mary was the first disciple, the first Christian steward of God's plan. Consider its implications for your life.






