Pastor's Column

New Construction Update—July/August 2012

This is the seventh of what will be monthly updates to keep all Parishioners informed in regard to the progress of the construction of our Permanent Church and our Parish Offices.

- 1. Coordination of the interior ceiling mill work and sound system are being reviewed by an independent consultant to ensure that our system is designed for both music and the spoken word. We want to make sure that our acoustic requirements are being met in full.
- 2. Landscape and civil engineering design requirements are moving forward as anticipated in the original baseline estimate.
- 3. Foundation cost estimates have been recently completed and are within the original budget estimate, allowing us to move forward into the final structure design.
- 4. Background noise study of the HVAC equipment was completed and equipment selection was confirmed.

- 5. Final design and coordination of structural, mechanical, and electrical elements for both the Church and the Parish Offices continues to move forward.
- 6. The Interior Design Team (IDT) has selected all the artists for the creation of the various main "pieces" of the Church altar, ambo, baptismal font, tabernacle, Marian shrine, St. Thomas More shrine, and stained glass windows, etc.
- 7. The artists have been commissioned and are beginning their work in coordination with our Liturgical Consultant, Robert Habiger.
- 8. At the August meeting of the IDT, our architect, Renzo Zecchetto, was present and presented the latest review of the interior and exterior of the Church, along with the landscape designs for the outdoor Memorial Garden and the outdoor Meditation Garden.

- 9. The pews and chairs for the Church are in the process of being selected by the architect, Renzo Zecchetto, in consultation with the IDT.
- 10. A Town Hall meeting is being planned for January 25, 2013 from 6:308:30pm, to invite Parishioners to see all of the interior elements of the Church that are now in the process of being created. Mark your calendars for this exciting meeting!
- 11. It is anticipated that actual construction will begin in November 2012.

Update on the LCWR (Leadership Conference of Women Religious) and the Vatican

Thank you for your ongoing prayerful support for the guidance of the Holy Spirit for a constructive dialogue between the LCWR and the Vatican.

More than 900 members of LCWR met from Aug. 7-10 for their annual meeting during which they planned their response to the doctrinal assessment of their organization by the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (CDF).

As the meeting took place in a spirit of sustained prayer and dialogue, the members were fully aware of the thousands of people throughout the country and the world who have been urging the LCWR that the response be one that helps to reconcile the differences that exist within the Catholic Church and creates space for honest and open conversation on the critical moral and ethical questions that face the global community. This is also the intent of the LCWR.

The members charged the LCWR officers with beginning a conversation with Archbishop J. Peter Sartain, the apostolic delegate appointed by CDF to oversee LCWR to include the following elements:

- That "Open and honest dialogue may lead not only to increasing understanding between the church leadership and women religious, but also to creating more possibilities for the laity and particularly for women, to have a voice in the church.
- The assembly articulated its belief that religious life, as it is lived by the women religious who comprise LCWR, is an authentic expression of this life that must not be compromised.
- The theology, ecclesiology, and spirituality of the Second Vatican Council serve as the foundation of this form of religious life and while those who live it must always be open to conversion—this life form should not be discounted.

The assembly instructed the LCWR officers to conduct their conversation with Archbishop Sartain from a stance of deep prayer that values mutual respect, careful listening and open dialogue. The officers will proceed with these discussions as long as possible, but will reconsider if LCWR is forced to compromise the integrity of its mission. . . . "

Response by Archbishop J. Peter Sartain Regarding the LCWR

Archbishop J. Peter Sartain made the following statement regarding the LCWR on August 10, 2012:

The Holy See and the Bishops of the United States are deeply proud of the historic and continuing contribution of women religious to our country through social, pastoral and spiritual ministries; Catholic health care; Catholic education; and many other areas where they reach out to those on the margins of society.

As an association of women religious, the LCWR brings unique gifts to its members and to the Church at large. This uniqueness includes sensitivity to suffering, whether in Latin America or the inner-city; whether in the life of an unborn child or the victim of human trafficking.

Religious women have made a lasting contribution to the wellbeing of our country and continue to do so today. For that they deserve our respect, our support, our thanks and our prayers.

Along with the members of the LCWR, I remain committed to working to address the issues raised by the Doctrinal Assessment in an atmosphere of prayer and respectful dialogue. We must also work toward clearing up any misunderstandings, and I remain truly hopeful that we will work together without compromising Church teaching or the important role of the LCWR. I look forward to our continued discussions as we collaborate in promoting consecrated life in the United States.

Little Rock Scripture Study

Wednesday, September 19 at 9:00am or Thursday, September 20 at 7:00pm we begin our 14-session study of Paul's letters to the Galatians and the Romans. These sessions are



open to all who would like to spend time in a small group growing in love for the scriptures through study and discussion.

Galatians and Romans are pivotal for those seeking to understand the faith and teaching of the Apostle Paul. Many of Paul's themes are shared by Galatians and Romans, but the tone and length of the two works differ sharply.

Galatians addresses Paul's understanding of Christian freedom and justification by faith. He reprimands the Galatians for deserting the Gospel by seeking justification through circumcision rather than through faith in Christ, who achieved our salvation by his sacrifice on the cross. Romans is the longest of Paul's letters. It addresses the universal reality of sin in the world and the need for salvation in Jesus Christ. It explores both the strength and limits of the law of Moses. Paul examines the new life attained in the Holy Spirit as God's gift and proclaims the mystery of God's plan to save Israel. Romans also highlights the ethical demands of the gospel.

SPEAKING TO THE SOUL

It was a cold crisp Michigan evening in January, 1985. My High School Choir had been invited to perform at Hill Auditorium in Ann Arbor. As we performed such classics as "Alleluia" by Mozart and "Lift Thine Eyes" by Mendelssohn in front of a crowd of a thousand patrons, I knew that music would always be part of my life.

I have loved music my entire life. From my first piano lesson in 5th grade to high school choirs and college worship groups, I have always loved making music. In my life, music has served as an inspiration, a form of entertainment, a means of encouragement, a source of motivation and a deep, abiding form of prayer. I have always felt that music speaks directly to the soul, which is why it can have such a profound impact on us all. Music can also bridge generations. I am always enamored at the freedom little children feel when they sing and dance freely at our Vacation Bible School to our songs. Yet the same song, sung at Mass, can move teens and adults to deeper union with God.

Playing music at St. Thomas More is a privilege and an honor. My goal with each Mass is to accentuate the participation in the Eucharist

itself. St. Augustine once said that singing a worship song is like praying twice. You are not just praying the words of the song, but the very act of singing is a form of prayer. And when a room full of people actually participates to the point where you can't even hear the choir or the band, that is when I feel like we have reached the very pinnacle of what liturgical music is meant to be.

My last thought that I would like to share with all of you is one of encouragement. Please continue to join us in participating in the music of the Liturgy. St. Thomas More has a history of great participation already, but I would love to see it grow even more. I remember celebrating the Eucharist in our old Church in the strip mall, and how it felt as if every person was singing fully. When we moved to our current Church, it took a while to fill our vast auditorium. As we get ready to make the move to our new permanent home, let's continue to fill our Church with the sounds of praise such that the hosts of heaven feel compelled to join in!







Blessed John Paul II wrote "Life is entrusted to man as a treasure which must not be squandered, as a talent which must be used well" (*Evangelium Vitae*, 52).

Our late pontiff also wrote:

It is Jesus who stirs in you the desire to do something great with your lives, the will to follow an ideal, the refusal to allow yourselves to be ground down by mediocrity, the courage to commit yourselves humbly and patiently to improving yourselves and society, making the world more human and more fraternal (Prayer Vigil, World Youth Day, August 19, 2000).


