#### Pastor's Column

#### Lift High the Cross of Christ!

This past Friday, September 14, we celebrated the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Here are some thoughts upon the cross which is at the heart of our faith as Christians.

The Cross is the major symbol of Christians. It is on the foundation of the cross that our faith is built.

The Cross and Jesus' approach to it shows us the way in which we are to approach our crosses whatever they may be.

Jesus had a choice. He could either embrace his cross or run away from it. In faith, trusting in the Father, he embraced the cross. He did not fight it, resist it, or run away from it. He surrendered. In that faithful surrender and embrace of the Cross, evil was transformed and changed into Good News—the Resurrection new life, new hope, and new beginnings for the entire universe!

We human beings spend so much time running away from the crosses that come into our lives. We deny them. We pretend and

lie to others that they do not exist. We medicate them. We abandon them. In all these ways, though, they are still there.

The suffering, the pain, the illness, the death, or the sin is still very much present. The more we try to ignore or run away from our crosses, the more ill health, physically, emotionally, and spiritually we cause for ourselves and others.

It is only in our embrace of the cross that transformation and healing can take place.

When we acknowledge and embrace our crosses and lift them high in faith, they become the very instruments that bring new life, new hope, and new beginnings. The instrument of death becomes the instrument of life.

M. Scott Peck writes, "I cannot be any more specific about the methodology of love than to quote these words of an old priest

who spent many years in the battle: 'There are dozens of ways to deal with evil and several ways to conquer it. All of them are facets of the truth that the only ultimate way to conquer evil is to let it be smothered within a willing, living human being. When it is absorbed there like blood in a sponge or a spear into one's heart, it loses its power and goes no further.' The healing of evil—scientifically or otherwise—can be accomplished only by the love of individuals. A willing sacrifice is required...I do not know how this occurs. But I know that it does...Whenever this happens there is a slight shift in the balance of power in the world."

Embrace your crosses, unite them to Christ, and lift high the Cross of Christ!

# St. Bonaventure Clothing Drive: Where Does All That Clothing Go?

What happens to that truck-load of clothing that is collected during the St. Bonaventure Clothing Drive? Volunteers drive the truck to the mission located near Gallup, New Mexico. The donations are sorted by gender, size, and function. Warm jackets and blankets are the most sought-after items. The items are put in a storage room awaiting the big Christmas event.

On the first Saturday of December, over 2,000 adults and children from the Navajo reservation show up at the St. Bonaventure Indian Mission and School for the free, annual Christmas party and clothing give-away. They are served a complete turkey dinner and then have an opportunity to select much-needed clothing.

Our donated items are spread on tables and families can select clothing that will get them through the bitter winters and sizzling summers. The Mission receives small clothing donations throughout the year, but the **largest quantity**, and the **best quality**, come from the Parishioners of St. Thomas More. Your donations make a difference in the lives of needy families on the Navajo Reservation. Ask your family and friends to save for the November 10-11 clothing drive.

#### Little Rock Scripture Study

Wednesday, September 19 at 9:00am or Thursday, September 20 at 7:00pm we begin our 14-session study of Paul's letters to the Galatians and the Romans. These sessions are open to all who would like to spend time in a



small group growing in love for the scriptures through study and discussion.

Galatians and Romans are pivotal for those seeking to understand the faith and teaching of the Apostle Paul. Many of Paul's themes are shared by Galatians and Romans, but the tone and length of the two works differ sharply.

Galatians addresses Paul's understanding of Christian freedom and justification by faith. He reprimands the Galatians for deserting the Gospel by seeking justification through circumcision rather than through faith in Christ, who achieved our salvation by his sacrifice on the cross. Romans is the longest of Paul's letters. It addresses the universal reality of sin in the world and the need for salvation in Jesus Christ. It explores both the strength and limits of the law of Moses. Paul examines the new life attained in the Holy Spirit as God's gift and proclaims the mystery of God's plan to save Israel. Romans also highlights the ethical demands of the gospel.

#### Spending Time in the Desert

Jesus said to his disciples, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." (Mark 6:31)

Spiritual retreats have a long history in Christian practice. Following Jesus' example of retreating to the desert before beginning his public ministry (see Matthew 4:1-11, Mark 1:12-13, Luke 4:1-13) and the Desert Theology of the Old Testament, the wandering in the desert for forty years that was meant to bring about a change of heart, religious hermits throughout Christian history and up to the present day live a life entirely given to the praise of God and the love and, through the hermit's penance and prayers, also the service of all humanity.

Others follow a less extreme path in their spiritual retreats and there are many variations in the practice. Some spend a single day while others an entire week or weeks. Some spend time in silence, others in community. Some work toward individual goals, perhaps with the guidance of a spiritual director, others seek growth through group endeavors.

This month, two retreats are on tap for groups at St. Thomas More. The Confirmation class will be at Kamp Kuper in Escondido for a couple of days as they embark on their final catechetical year before Confirmation in the spring. The Sanctuary Choir will spend a Saturday at Vina de Lestonnac in Temecula sharing time together in extended rehearsal, prayer, and teambuilding activities. The specific goals for these group retreats are likely to be widely divergent, but the general methods by which their time together away from the normal activities of their lives promises to

be very similar.



#### Christian Stewardship Eric McArdle: Half-Hearted Stewards

We all like to negotiate.

Why else would there be so many sales on a daily basis at every store imaginable, from cell phone providers to fast-food chains? After all, who doesn't like a bargain?

If we purchase one item at a discount, we have more money to purchase another desired item. And, if money is tight, sales allow us to purchase what we may not be able to otherwise.

Do you ever find yourself negotiating with God?

As stewards, we commit to tithing a percentage of our income each week, but we may find that an unexpected event occurs that prevents us from fulfilling that commitment in full or in part—the lawnmower breaks, we need extra medicine for our kids, or a travel opportunity that we can't pass up presents itself. Perhaps we rationalize that God will understand.

But what happens is that instead of trusting in God and giving Him our first fruits, we become inverted stewards. We rationalize and decide for ourselves when and how we are going to return our resources to God based on what is left over after satisfying our wants and needs. We keep the control and continue the planning and put God in the backseat, because we know, "God will understand."

When we allow ourselves to remain in control, we do ourselves a huge disservice and we begin to lose the trust we have in God. We don't let God take the wheel because we are just too afraid to let it go.

Giving to God out of what we make isn't about tabulating a list of what we need and seeing what is leftover for God. It's not about fearfully placing an envelope with a tithe of our first fruits in the offertory collection each week.

Giving to God is about gratefulness – wanting to return a portion to God for all the blessings He has given us. In doing so, we know we will never match His generosity, but we receive graces knowing that we are putting God first and trusting He will never let us down.

Don't be a half-hearted Steward. Don't negotiate with God. After all, whatever He has planned for our lives is far better than what we could ever buy for ourselves.







# **CPR – Everyone Can Do Something**

# The St. Thomas More CPR Program Offers Three Levels of Training –

#### 1. Full CPR

Three-hour classes provide American Red Cross certification good for two years. The adult course includes management of heart attack, stroke and breathing emergencies as well as use of the AED (Automated External Defibrillator). The Infant/Child course covers emergencies likely to occur in young persons.

#### 2. Hands-Only (Compressions-Only) CPR

In this 90-minute class participants will learn how to recognize a cardiac emergency and provide chest compressions without having to do mouth-to-mouth breathing.

This class also gives each participant hands-on experience with the AED (Automated External Defibrillator).

#### 3. What to Do in a Medical Emergency If You Don't Know CPR

A 90-minute PowerPoint presentation that explains how to recognize an emergency even before a collapse, how to properly and quickly get trained medical responders to the scene and what to do while waiting for the ambulance to arrive.


