

PERSISTENT NOURISHMENT

I have two plants in my office, given to me by wife, Gail, for Valentine's Day the past two years, and I forgot to take them home when I was out of the office for most of the summer. You can imagine the consequences, for the plants, I mean. One has completely dried up; one hangs on by a thread. Their state of health directly reflects the quality of nourishment that I gave (or didn't give) them over the summer.

For church musicians, there are different ways of gaining nutrition from one's repertoire. I know a number of colleagues who prefer to establish a regular schedule of songs that their choir really enjoys, cycling through them year after year—what choir doesn't love to sing music it knows really, really well? I have other colleagues who refuse to program music they have done before, arguing once they've sung something, there is nothing more to learn from those titles.

My personal musical nourishment requires a little of both, incorporating music that I've done before and music that is completely new. An encounter this past week illustrates why.

This past Monday, at the rehearsal of the choir I sing with at the California Center for the Arts, Escondido, we were rehearsing a modern classic, a piece written not quite twenty years ago that has become, in just a few years, the quintessential unaccompanied choral piece of its era. I had not had the opportunity to sing it until our first rehearsal a couple of weeks ago. At that rehearsal, the bass sitting next to me confided in a resigned tone that he must have sung it in some twenty concerts since its premiere. But last night, he leaned over at one point and pointed to a note in the alto part and whispered with a big smile,

"That's the note that makes this piece so special." One note among thousands; for him, it is the reason to sing the piece over and over and over. For me, it is another reason to be singing it for the first time.

There is a story I have heard, probably apocryphal, about a priest who faithfully celebrates a very early Sunday Mass every week at one of our diocesan parishes and who reads his homily from a prepared resource, reusing the same homily every time the three-year cycle of the lectionary returns to a particular scripture passage. For those who have encountered this type of preaching, it is obvious that it misses a critical element of the role of the homily, to connect Sacred Scripture to our current realities, balancing what we have heard before with the headlines in today's newspapers, providing us with the nourishment that God's eternal word can offer here and now.

For Christians, going to church, singing the songs, praying the prayers, and hearing the word of proclaimed all provide For nourishment. Catholic Christians, the additional celebration of the Paschal sacrifice, receiving the Body and Blood of Christ, also provides nourishment each time we step up to the altar for Communion. God offers us food for our journey over and over and over again.

Without the persistent nourishment that comes from gathering week after week in community around the table of the Word and Eucharist, partaking of this spiritual food, we might miss that special note God has written specifically for us, or we might become like the plants in my office, hanging on by a thread, or worse.



10 Basic Things You Should Know About...

Suicide, Treatment, and Prevention

- 1. Every 16.2 minutes someone in the U.S. commits Suicide; and, every 17 minutes someone is left to make sense of it.
- 2. There are 18 Veteran suicide deaths per day. Male Vets are more likely to use firearms as means.
- 3. Substance abuse/misuse is a key risk factor for suicide.
- 4. Suicide rates are highest in the older (50+), single, male, Caucasian population who have a mood disorder and/or are abusing alcohol.
- 5. Individuals with certain *non*-cancer pain-related conditions are at greater risk for suicide than those without these diagnoses.
- 6. OEF/OIF/OND Veterans who have mental health conditions are at increased risk for suicide. The increased risk is associated with diagnoses of depression, bipolar disorder, substance use disorders, anxiety disorders, and schizophrenia.
- 7. Individuals with a diagnosis of Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) are at greater risk for suicide than those without this diagnosis.
- 8. A suicide crisis is time-limited and, with appropriate intervention, the risk for harm can be thwarted.
- 9. If you think someone is at risk: Open up a dialogue, listen; Don't judge, try to understand the problem driving the crisis; Convey a message of hope that the crisis will pass; Offer to contact a chaplain or mental health provider; Provide a safe environment by removing the means; and, Escort the person to a behavioral health facility ASAP.
- 10. Immediate help and/or treatment is readily available to Veteran's via
