### **Pastor's Column**

#### Proposition 35—The Human Trafficking Initiative

Sr. Sheila Novak and Sr. Jean Schafer, Sisters of the Divine Savior, are members of St. Thomas More Parish and their ministry is to those who are victims of human trafficking. I have asked them to share "their story" as my Pastor's Column for this week.

The California Conference of Catholic Bishops is supporting Proposition 35—"The Human Trafficking Initiative."

An insert in today's Bulletin describes the Initiative.

As Election Day draws closer, Republicans and Democrats have their sound bites to get our attention. When Jesus began his public ministry, he announced who would be getting his attention. He

stood up in the synagogue and declared his work would bring "release to the captives... freedom for the oppressed." (Lk. 4:18) This was no attention-getting device. It was Jesus' whole reason for coming among us.

Centuries later we still struggle with the need to "release the captives." In our country, it came with the Emancipation Proclamation of 1863 and the 13th amendment to our Constitution. We continue to struggle with it today. Now we call it human trafficking. Despite whatever

name we give, it is modern-day slavery. Today's tragic statistic-there are more people enslaved in our world now than ever before. The interplay of growing global poverty, global overproduction of

cheap consumer goods, and the lure of over-sexualized, overglamorized life styles set the stage for human exploitation. Desperately poor people look to the U.S. for jobs and security. Exploiters use such people as objects for profit.

At first we Americans thought this was an overseas problem, happening in countries far from our borders. Now, as more incidences have been uncovered, we see that human trafficking is



happening throughout the U.S.—in our own state, even in our own neighborhoods. The victims are not just immigrants looking to survive. Victims include our very own youth, by the thousands, also caught in this violence and coercive exploitation. We are beginning to pay attention.

Many efforts are in place to raise awareness about human trafficking, to provide healing and services so victims regain their lives.

One of the needs, especially for immigrant survivors, is housing. In exchange for testifying against their trafficker, they are given a special visa and the permission to work. This process may take between 18 months to two years. Until their status is regularized, they are not allowed to work and therefore have no means of supporting themselves. We have responded to this need by establishing SDS Hope House in North County as a refuge for these persons. It is our way of giving the vulnerable among us a chance at life, following the mission of Jesus—"I have come that you may have life and have it in abundance." (John 10:10)

Members of the St. Thomas More Community sponsored an awareness session and volunteered to help when needs arose. Despite the magnitude of this injustice, each of us can be involved in reversing this terrible crime against humanity. Learn about human trafficking. Look up "human trafficking" on the internet. You will find a wealth of information to raise your awareness. Talk about what you learn with your acquaintances to spread that awareness. Work for legislation that addresses the issue. As you explore, you will get other ideas. What we each choose to do does make a difference! It is a practical way to live our call of following in the footsteps of Jesus.

### ALL YOU HOLY MEN AND WOMEN

#### Surrounded by the Communion of Saints

Not long ago I sat among a crowd of mourners at a funeral Mass and listened to a granddaughter proclaim the second reading. This adult granddaughter, large with child, walked to the ambo with quiet dignity and began to read Paul's first letter to the Corinthians in such a way that made it clearly a love letter to her grandmother. The young woman had made the connection between the word of God and her lived experience, and the word was indeed alive in our midst.

As Katy read, "Love is patient and kind, love is never jealous...it is never rude and never seeks its own advantage," I heard the message anew. My initial thought was that this reading is wasted on weddings. It is used so often that I don't think anyone listens anymore, unless the lector is far beyond the norm. And because it is so frequently read at weddings, we presume it is intended only for newly married couples.

But that is not the case. Paul wrote the letter to the people of Corinth, not to their newlyweds, and its message was intended for all the faithful. So as Katy continued to read, I had a more jarring second thought: This is the measure of a faithful life. These are the criteria against which I will be judged at the moment of my own death. I will be asked, "Have you been kind and patient? Have you been rude or conceited? Have you rejoiced in others' wrongdoings? Have you found joy in the truth, and lived with trust and hope? Have you loved above all else?"

Have I lived such a generous love? Examples to the contrary ran amok in my brain during that funeral reading. How will I be judged? It was a moment of stunning inner silence and examination of conscience. May I suggest that it is a good time of year for such introspection and review?

For November is soon upon us. Thanksgiving dinners loom large at the end of the month. But before we celebrate this feast of great gratitude, we in the Catholic community will gather on the first day of the month to remember the communion of saints, their stories and inspiration, their intercession and assistance, and their presence yet among us.

I am not quite sure when the saints began to reappear in my adult spirituality. I was intrigued by a homily on Teresa of Avila and subsequently read her biography as I made my only-ever trip to Spain and her home in Avila. My interest in the saints was further encouraged as I stood amid the Los Angeles Cathedral's tapestries that, with breathtaking realism, give human form to named and unnamed saints. And as I stood at the altar in San Salvador where Oscar Romero surrendered his life for his people, I was haunted by the sacrificial love that imitated Christ's own. The saints are indeed among us.

And then there is this. Over 30 years ago a group of six young mothers began the practice of praying together each month. Distance now separates us, but each year we gather for a retreat at an East Coast monastery. A few years ago, the 23year-old daughter of one among us died inexplicably in her sleep. As we gathered for the annual retreat some months later, we wept, we prayed



and we felt the deep anguish of our friend who mourned her beloved Sheila. On the last evening together, we sat in the silence that is our prayer habit, and then talked about where the silence had led us. I am not sure how it happened, but after a few moments we started to sing the litany of saints. As the first name filled the room, we all invoked her intercession: Sheila Eileen...pray for us. The prayers continued for several minutes. Somewhat incredulous, we were nonetheless aware that the Spirit was present in our midst and we were surrounded by God's communion of saints.





### Christian Stewardship Three Stages of the Dollar

A generation ago, William Allen White was the brilliant editor of a newspaper in Emporia, Kansas. He was also a very generous person. One day he decided to give a fairly large piece of land to his city.



In doing so, he wrote that he always found three kicks in a dollar. The first kick, he explained, was in making a dollar. "I dearly love to make a dollar," he said.



The second kick he indicated is in having a dollar. His father had been a frugal Yankee who had taught the importance of saving money. Therefore, Mr. White said, "I greatly enjoy having it."



Then the wise editor went on to say, "The third kick is when you give the dollar away." With exultation, he told his fellow citizens that he was getting a big kick that day in giving them the dollars represented by the piece of land he had turned over to the city.

### It's OK to Have Money

Christians would do well to remember those three kicks Mr. White mentioned. There is nothing wrong with making a dollar legitimately. It is not the quest for money that is wrong, it is making an idol of money. It is putting the quest of wealth ahead of the quest for obedience to God.

It is also permissible for Christians to have money. Better to be in a position of having resources than being dependent upon the government or beholden to people who misuse power and authority.

There is a certain healthy freedom that comes to those who have proper resources. If we are proper stewards of money, there is a legitimate "kick" in having it.

### **Stewards Always Share**

But, of course, being a good steward of money always involves sharing it with God's Church and with others. Those who practice such giving invariably testify as to the enjoyment of being able to give. They know that it is indeed more "blessed to give than to receive."

That, too, is a "kick."

### CALIFORNIA BISHOPS SUPPORT PROPOSITION 35 THE HUMAN TRAFFICKING INITIATIVE

The following statement was issued by the Most Reverend Gerald Wilkerson, auxiliary bishop for the San Fernando Pastoral Region of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and President of the California Catholic Conference of Bishops:

"Human trafficking, which involves the enslaving of individuals in order to use them for financial gain, is an intolerable affront to human dignity.

"As Catholics, we are called to listen to the wisdom of Pope Paul VI in the Vatican II document, *Gaudium et Spes*:

'...[W]hatever is opposed to life itself...whatever violates the integrity of the human person...whatever insults humanity—such as subhuman living conditions, arbitrary imprisonment, deportation, slavery, prostitution...all these things...poison human society...Moreover, they are a supreme dishonor to the Creator.'

"As President of the California Catholic Conference of Bishops, I speak for my brother bishops when I call upon all people of good will to support those who are working to eradicate this violent and oppressive practice—especially our Catholic women religious, who besides their advocacy for the elimination of trafficking, have provided healthcare and social services for those rescued from their enslavers

"In particular, this November, we are supporting a ballot measure—Proposition 35, *Californians Against Sexual Exploitation Act*—which will both increase criminal penalties for human trafficking and direct fines to enhanced victim services and law enforcement.

"We ask that you also prayerfully consider supporting Proposition 35."
