Pastor's Column

We Need a Quieter, Listening Church

I share with you this information taken from "NEWS.VA—THE VATICAN TODAY." The article gives the comments of Cardinal-designate Luis Antonio Tagle, the Archbishop of Manila in the Philippines.

In my opinion, many statements of religious leaders today are conveyed in a very triumphal fashion. I find this unfortunate.

I resonant with Cardinal-designate Tagle's words. I find them refreshing and hopeful!

(Vatican Radio)—Cardinal-designate Luis Antonio Tagle of Manila in the Philippines is one of just six Church leaders named by Pope Benedict to receive the red hat in a consistory to take place on November 24.

Archbishop Tagle is currently here in Rome taking part in the Synod of Bishops on the new evangelization which comes to a conclusion this weekend.

Reacting to the announcement of the consistory on Wednesday, the new Cardinal said he was grateful to the Pope for his trust and confidence in the Church of the Philippines, spread throughout the world with the many migrant workers who take their Christian faith with them.



He also spoke of his message to the Synod fathers calling for a humbler, quieter Church that is not afraid to admit its mistakes but is able to share more deeply the sufferings of the people today:

"The Church of Asia is often a minority Church, like John the Baptist crying in the wilderness...even in the Philippines, if the Church is a majority, I realize that the sufferings of people and the difficult questions they ask are an invitation to be first in solidarity with them, not to pretend that we have all the solutions...they can resonate and see the concrete face of God in a Church that can be silent with them, as confused as they are...it becomes a home for them...I believe that the Church should contribute in

the public square but we in Asia are very particular about the mode...so you may be saying the right things but people will not listen if the manner by which you communicate reminds them of a triumphalistic, know-it-all institution...I know that in some parts of Asia the relative silence, calmness of the Church is interpreted as timidity, but I say 'no'—it makes the Church more credible."

FAITH, NOT FEAR

Scripture themes for November

by Patricia Datchuck Sánchez and Rafael Sánchez Alonso, excerpted from Celebration November 2012, with permission. Each November, the church, in its wisdom, reminds believers that ours is a transient existence and that the world, as we know it, will be no more at some unpredictable moment.

Although ours is not a perfect world -any one of us could construct a lengthy list of its problems, sins, and failures—no one is particularly eager for it to end. In fact, many of us tend to go through our lives oblivious to the notion that life is a fragile gift we borrow for only a while before offering it back to God. Or we fritter away our time, energy. and peace of mind worrying about where, when, and how the end shall come, for the world or for our own lives. But November brings with it the challenge to focus on our present existence and our commitment to God, to Christ, to the church, and to one another.

Setting the tone for our renewed commitment are the first reading (Deuteronomy) and Gospel (Mark) for Nov. 4. Both texts focus on what is to be every believer's daily agenda. Both texts set the priority we are to embrace, and inspire the attitude and the actions that will identify us as Jesus' disciples: Love God with all your heart, soul, understanding and strength. Love your neighbor as yourself.

As William J. Bausch has noted, this teaching, forever enshrined in our texts and in our liturgies, must also be enshrined in our lives (*Once upon a Gospel*, Twenty-Third Pub., New London, Conn.: 2008). Our love for God and for our neighbor needs the flesh and blood of everyday-ness to get into our hearts, into our conduct.

Teresa of Avila (1515–1582) urged her sisters and brothers in the faith to take this teaching to heart and make it come true in their daily lives. She wrote: "Christ has no body but yours, no hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes which he looks compassionately on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands with which he blesses all the world." If we allow grace to convince us of the great Spanish mystic's insight, and if, by grace, we begin to live in accordance with the conviction her words express, then the challenge of Jesus will be enshrined within us and, through us, in our world. This being so, thoughts of the end time should not fill us with dread but with hope and joy.

Daniel's visions, which are revisited on Nov. 18 and 25, and the vision of John the Seer (Nov. 25) tell us that the end for which we wait in hope will be ushered in and presided over by the glorious Son of Man. As the Gospels attest, this Son of Man is Jesus, whose salvific death and conquest of sin have given redeemed sinners a reason to hope for eternity. On Nov. 4, 11, and 18, we hear the author of Hebrews celebrate Jesus' unique and perfect sacrifice and peerless high-priesthood. At each Eucharist. we remember celebrate Jesus' saving sacrifice and are fed with the bread of the word and the eucharistic bread that sustains us on our way.

Sometimes our way seems fraught with difficulties that shake our confidence and dim our hope. During those times, we might recall the two widows featured on Nov. 11. One widow and her son were about to die of a famine in their land. They could have refused what seemed to be a rather thoughtless request from Elijah. But when the prophet asked for food, they gave him the little they had. They held nothing back. So it was with the woman of Mark's



Gospel. She could have kept one coin of the two she offered to the temple treasury. But she did not; she held nothing back.

Some of us might think these women were foolish and not very practical. We are always trying to secure our futures: we tend to place practicality above the utter abandon that arises from hope and trust in But authentic Christian commitment is, more often than not, quite impractical. Loving God fully and holding nothing back will require frequent departures from our comfort zones. Loving our neighbor as ourselves will lead us to places of vulnerability we may never have chosen to venture. But such is the challenge set before each of us today.

Holding nothing back, placing our trust in God and finding our base of security only in lasting realities, we surrender the liturgical year now passing and embrace the new year with hope. With courage and strength that can only be found in grace, let us dare to take Jesus at his word and love fully and freely. Leaving prudence and practicality aside, let us dare to live the Gospel with such conviction that our goodness and holiness will become contagious. Then, when the end does finally come, faith will allay all our fears.

Christian Stewardship On Our Way to the New Jerusalem

In the Eucharistic celebration's first reading on the Feast of All Saints, we hear proclaimed John's vision of the glory of the New Jerusalem. Here, all things will be made new, washed by the blood of the Lamb, in perfect love, peace and justice—a new heaven and a new earth.

We who live in this war-torn world and divided country know that we have not attained the New Jerusalem for which our Christian hearts long.

But Christian stewards are people of hope. They participate in their duties of citizenship because they believe democracy provides the best opportunity to make a better world.

Some Christians decline to vote because no candidate aligns perfectly with their Christian convictions. They hold that Jesus would not have us vote for "the lesser of evils." And we know that neither party nor candidate offers us a complete, clear Christian vision.

But we do not yet live in the New Jerusalem. Our choices are not always easy in this imperfect world. But exercising good stewardship over our right to vote remains our duty in meeting the challenge of those enduring words of Edmund Burke, the Irish statesman who said, "All that is necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men (and women) to do nothing."

The Catholic Catechism (CCC, no. 2240) makes it clear that Catholics have a moral responsibility to vote.

We also have a responsibility as Christian stewards to pray before we journey to the polls; pray that the Lord will grant us wisdom as we cast our ballot; pray that God's will be accomplished in this election.

We pray that those who hold positions of authority over us, both now and after the election, will seek God's will as they confront a myriad of complex issues.



2012 . . . "A Time to Build"

(Transcript of Capital Campaign Chairman Bill Ipsen's update on November 3-4, 2012)



Good morning!

I'm Bill Ipsen, and as Chairman of the Capital Campaign, I am pleased to provide our parish with a current update as we begin the building of our new Church and Parish Offices.

And speaking of beginning

construction, as you were able to see on your way into Mass today...and it is no illusion...we are in the beginning stages of preparation to commence the building of our new Church and Parish Offices. I have been walking through the construction site to view the activity, and will have more on that shortly.

But first, on behalf of all of the people working on our capital campaign, and most especially our Pastor, I would like to extend a sincere THANK YOU to all of our Parish family, for the many years of sacrifice and giving which has allowed us to finally reach our goal. We have been successful in obtaining this great site, building and completely paying for our current multi-purpose center, acquiring and paying for the five acres of adjacent land for future expansion; the success of the numerous capital campaigns throughout the years, including, I am pleased to announce, our last campaign 2012: Phase 2.1, which reached our goal of \$500,000!!! Of course, I need to have everyone continue to finish their pledge payments completely, in order to collect the entire \$500,000.

So much credit goes to so many members of our congregation over these years. This not only includes all those involved in the pledge process, but all those involved in the myriad of fund raising activities that have contributed monies toward our campaigns. We are greatly indebted to all of you! And perhaps even better news, we will now begin the transition from

capital campaigns and pledges to our mortgage phase. This means that after ten years, I will no longer be asking you to become involved in another one- or two- or three-year fund raising event. I think this bears repeating...I will no longer be asking you to become involved in a one- or two- or three-year fund raising event. I know that alone will put a smile on many faces in the congregation...including mine! However, you have not heard the last from me, because with construction comes a mortgage! I will touch on that subject later in this update.

The work of the Interior Design Committee is nearing completion, which means that all of our artists are hard at work creating all of the interior elements for the Church; like the altar, the ambo, the crucifix, the tabernacle, the Marian shrine, the St. Thomas More shrine, as well as many other pieces. Please refer to last week's bulletin or the Parish website (www.stmoside.org) for exciting news and information regarding these plans.

In a recent announcement in our bulletin, Fr. Mike has indicated that our last fiscal year budget was balanced. However, as most of us know, we have had a small deficit from fiscal year ending 2010 of approximately \$28,000, which must be carried over to this year's operating budget. While balancing our operating budget is the first priority, it should be noted, and I have discussed this on several

occasions, that once our new Church and Parish Offices are complete, we will have more building space to maintain, which will require additional funding through our annual budget. This means there will need to be an increase in our weekly/ monthly offerings in order to maintain our campus. We are confident once our new Church is complete that we will attract new Parishioners to our Parish community. At the same time, we as a community must plan for this additional expense in our annual budget. The simple fact is, we will have three buildings on our campus, one of which is now almost 12 years old. Paul Ibbetson and our Finance Council will be busy planning for the additional expense in our operating budgets following completion of construction. As we look down the road, the congregation must be aware that our ability to continue the support of our Parish community through weekly/monthly contributions will be even more important.

As we look forward to the phasing out of capital campaigns, we must also address the long term support needed to retire the \$5.4 million dollar mortgage we now assume from the Diocese. At this point, I would like to address what we will now call our mortgage phase.

We are all familiar with mortgage payments and interest or credit card interest, and we all know that the more we can place as a deposit toward our mortgage, the greater amount we will save in interest over a long period of time. I'm sure many of us here today have all experienced at one time or another that purchase of a \$1,500 refrigerator which we put on a credit card and paid off in three or four years...all \$4,000 of it!

So today as we prepare for the beginning of our build out, I am going to ask everyone in our congregation to please give some prayerful consideration to CONTINUING to provide financial support in the same manner we did when we had capital campaigns, in an effort to reduce the initial amount of principle of our mortgage, which will save us many thousands of dollars in interest over the life

of the mortgage. All additional funds collected will continue to be directed toward our initial deposit. And please remember, checks of any size are appreciated...NO check is too small, and certainly no check is too large!

Many of us have been accustomed to providing a specific amount of our giving to the capital campaign and we are hopeful that the majority of our Parishioners will continue to direct those specific funds toward our down payment program. And for those of you who have not been able to be involved in our capital campaigns up to this point, I would encourage you to please consider making a monthly offering and direct it to the down payment program of our mortgage phase. On that subject, I have some great news to share with you. We recently received a very generous gift in the amount of \$147,500 which was directed to our mortgage deposit fund from the estate of a Parishioner through the Towers of Faith. With our Towers of Faith program, there are several other pending estate gifts also to be directed to our mortgage phase.

In future updates, we will provide you with all the information regarding our monies on deposit, our mortgage, and our mortgage payments to the diocese, as well as building updates throughout our construction phase. Also, we will keep you informed about the Finance Council and its efforts regarding the operations budget in light of an expanded campus of not one building but three!

As I close, I would again like to thank the members of all the Councils and Committees who have worked very hard to get us to this exciting place, our Pastor, Fr. Mike, for his leadership over the last nine years; but most of all to you...our congregation...for your continued support and belief that one day we would really be building a new Church. That time has now come! The time is now! Let us all drink in the excitement of the coming months as we see the buildings rise in our midst. Buildings that will be used to give glory and praise to our God!
