



THE OTHER THREE DAYS

The Order of Christian Funerals - Part II

This article is adapted from a variety of sources, all © Liturgy Training Publications, with permission. Last week, we explored the role of the Christian funeral in the life of the faith community, and the first part of the three-day rite, the vigil.

The second part of the three-part Christian funeral is the funeral liturgy itself. Through its ministry at the time of death, the church shows reverence for the body of the deceased and offers comfort and hope to the mourners. The funeral liturgy is the central celebration of the church at the hour of death.

The funeral Mass begins with the reception of the body at the door of the church. The casket or cremains are sprinkled with holy water. The casket is clothed with the pall in reminder of baptism, and other Christian symbols may also be placed on the casket once it is brought to rest in the assembly. The Easter candle burns before the body, silently proclaiming Christ as light in our darkness. It reminds us that in baptism we died with Christ so that we might also live with Christ. Family and friends are nourished with the word of God and the body Christ. and blood of After communion comes the final commendation. Signs of farewell are made to the body of our loved one: It might be sprinkled again with the holy water of baptism and enclosed in a cloud of perfumed smoke which rises to the heavens. We sing a song of farewell as this is done. Then we process to the door, and beyond, to the place of rest, for the third and final part of the Christian funeral.

God the Creator made Adam and Eve out of the dust of the earth, breathing into each of them divine fire, the spark of life which we call the soul. It is fitting, then, when one of our loved ones has died, that we return the body to God through committing it to the ground, to the

fire, or to the sea. And we mark this momentous act with a rite, the third and last part of the Order of Christian Funerals, the rite of committal. It is a brief and poignant gesture whereby we "give back" this one whom we have loved so much in sure hope that one day again we will be together, with all the saints and angels in the city of God. The rite of committal begins with an invitation to prayer, a kind of reassembling after the procession. A short verse from scripture is proclaimed. A prayer is said over the place of committal. Some final intercessions for the loved one and the mourners are said, summed up the Lord's Prayer. This is a significant moment—the last time we will say the prayer that Christ taught us over the body. A concluding prayer is said and a blessing offered over the people.

Accompanied by words of scripture and blessing, the actual interment of the body or inurnment of the cremains takes place in the presence of the mourners. This is the core of what we have come to do. In this way the church invites us to see our loved one's final resting place not as a place of despair, but as a sign of

hope and promise. A simple gesture such as placing a flower or soil upon the casket, or sprinkling the casket or urn with holy water may conclude the ritual, serving as the final farewell of the assembly and each person in it. Stewards Keeping God in Thanksgiving

Every December, we hear much talk of "keeping Christ in Christmas." But sometimes in the national discussion of Thanksgiving in the United States, we talk about being thankful but leave out God as the source of all. Good stewards never miss an opportunity to thank God. Here are some suggestions for "keeping God in Thanksgiving."

- † Many Parishes see as many people attend Mass on Thanksgiving Day as on holy days of obligation. Make sure you're in the crowd, and bring your kids to say thank you to God on this special day.
- † Food banks and shelters need food all year long, but many launch special drives on Thanksgiving. Fill up your trunk with donations, and make clear you are acting out of a spirit of gratitude to God.
- † Line up a trip to help at a soup kitchen, food bank, or meal delivery service on Thanksgiving or sometime near the feast. This can be especially beneficial to children, but everyone who experiences the needs of others appreciates not only what they have, but the fellowship they share with those who may have less.
- † Make grace at your family feast especially memorable. Let people know ahead of time that they will be asked to name a person, a situation, an experience, for which they are grateful to a loving God.
- † Make that phrase, "thank God," a little more frequent and sincere in your conversation. Don't be afraid to use the language of a grateful steward.
- † Set time aside this month to pray over some experience in your life that was difficult for you. Let God show you His presence in this moment and feel your heart respond with gratitude.
- † Set aside another time in which you recall an experience of deep happiness and joy—the birth of a child, a special moment with a loved one, a gift you received that was beyond your expectation. Let God be with you in these moments and express your deep thankfulness.


