# Pastor's Column

### What Kind of King Is He?

We gather together this weekend to celebrate the Eucharist on the Feast of Christ the King. Jesus is our King. We are his servants.

But what kind of King is he? The answer to that question will determine what kind of servants we are called to be.

As we read the Scriptures, we see that Jesus' Kingship is not of the kind we see, or have seen, in our world. His is a contradiction to power, status, position, and privilege. Do we dare be called his servants?

The playwright, Eugene Ionesco, once said,

The human comedy doesn't attract me enough.

I am not entirely of this world...I am from elsewhere.

And it is worth finding this elsewhere beyond the walls.

But where is it?

How do we go beyond the walls that this world builds? Is the "elsewhere" worth searching for? Jesus says, "Yes, it is." He

helps us in the search, and makes the search worthwhile. He gives meaning to all of life, meaning that the world is not able to give.

Philip Yancey, in his book, *The Jesus I Never Knew*, describes how Jesus leads us to the Kingdom in the midst of this world:

I feel convicted by this quality of Jesus every time I get involved in a cause I strongly believe in. How easy it is to join the politics of polarization, to find myself shouting across the picket lines at the 'enemy' on the other side. How hard it is to remember that the kingdom of God calls me to love the woman who has just emerged from the abortion clinic (and, yes, even her doctor), the promiscuous person who is dying of AIDS, the wealthy landowner who is exploiting God's creation. If I cannot show love to such people, then I must question whether I have truly understood Jesus' gospel.

Pastor's Column (continued from page 1)

A political movement by nature draws lines, makes distinctions, pronounces judgment; in contrast, Jesus' love cuts across lines, transcends distinctions, and dispenses grace. Regardless of the merits of a given issue—whether a pro-life lobby out of the Right or a peace and justice lobby out of the Left—political movements risk pulling onto themselves the mantle of power that smothers love. From Jesus I learn that, whatever activism I get involved in, it must not drive out love and humility, or otherwise I betray the kingdom of heaven.

As we honor our King, let us not betray Him. Let us be a people of love and humility in all situations, not a people of power, a people of domination. Let us never draw lines, make distinctions, or pronounce judgments.

As His servants, we allow Him to lead us to the elsewhere, beyond the walls of this world!

#### THE LORD OUR JUSTICE

#### **Scripture Themes for December**

Anticipation is palpable during this month of December. Believers remember Jesus' first coming in human flesh and hope for his second appearance in glory. For the young ones among us, Jesus' coming coincides with the annual visit of Santa or Los Reyes Magos, whose gifts are eagerly awaited.

Throughout Advent, our yearning for Jesus will be stoked by the sacred texts and hymns that call us to watch for him with joyful, practical, and prayerful readiness. In our waiting and watching, we followers of Jesus are also called—as individuals and as a community—to embrace and promote justice. Jeremiah (Dec. 2) and Baruch (Dec. 9) will remind us that we are to be just because God is just, and we who are created in God's image are to be authentic reflections of God in the world.

Prior to Vatican II, as Philip Land has pointed out, a discussion of justice would not have begun with scripture but with the definition of legal justice, Suum cuique tradere, "to render to each what is one's due" ("Justice," The New Dictionary of Theology). But with Vatican II and the subsequent 1971 synod "Justice in the World," justice becomes a call to the believer from the God of the two Testaments. About a decade before Land's observation, his fellow Jesuit and biblical scholar John Donahue formulated what has become an excellent working definition of biblical justice as "fidelity to the demands of a relationship" ("Biblical Perspectives on Justice," The Faith That Does Justice). Called to share a covenant relationship with God and one another, believers enjoy both the privileges and responsibilities that are intrinsic to the covenant. Justice demands that these responsibilities find their fullest expression in

"fathering the fatherless, mothering the motherless, welcoming the stranger, feeding the traveler, and offering hospitality to the resident alien, not because the orphan and the outsider deserved it but because this is the way God would act" (Walter Burghardt, *Preaching the Just Word*).

Justice also demands that those bound to one another in faith do their utmost to foster the well-being of all their brothers and sisters. When John the Baptizer (Dec. 16) was asked how best to prepare for welcoming the Son of Justice, he called for sacrificial sharing ("those with two coats should share with the person who has none and whoever has food should do likewise"). He called for honesty from tax collectors and soldiers who used their positions to extort and mistreat others. Echoing John, Paul called his readers to be blameless and holy (Dec. 1), so that their love for one another may increase (Dec. 9). Your kindness, insisted Paul, should be known to all (Dec. 16).

What might Jeremiah, Baruch, John, Paul, and Jesus have to say to contemporary believers who are waiting for the Son of Justice? Our answer to this question might be aided by an image offered by Frederich Buechner, who compared humankind to the web of a spider: "If you touch it anywhere, you set the whole thing trembling. ... As we move around this world and as we act with kindness, perhaps, or with indifference, or with hostility toward the people we meet, we too are setting the great spider web a-tremble. The life that I touch for good or ill will touch another life and that, in turn, another, until who knows where the trembling stops or in what far place and time my touch will be felt" (The Hungering Dark).



Our covenantal belonging to God and to one another requires that our touch be reverent, tender, caring, and kind. Justice demands that our touch be protective and provident, without malice or prejudice. Justice also requires that our touch be steady, not seasonal or intermittent. The hungry, the homeless, the sick, the poor, and marginalized have needs that extend beyond a Christmas handout or food basket.

Charity, though virtuous, is an insufficient response to the poor and needy of this world. What is needed is justice, that is, fidelity to the demands of our relationship with God and one another. Those who suffer injustice should not have to wait until heaven for relief. Rather. they should be able to know here and now the justice that Jesus came to establish. Thoroughly convinced of the church's call to justice, Pope Paul VI (Evangelii Nuntiandi, 1975) insisted that preaching the good news of Christ's coming among us "cannot be complete unless account is taken of the links between the Gospel and the concrete personal and social life of men and women. ... The Church cannot allow herself or her mission to be limited to the purely religious sphere while she ignores the temporal problems of the human person."

Therefore, while we eagerly await the coming Christ, let us hear his voice in the cry of the poor, serve the needs of those who suffer, and work unrelentingly until the worldwide web of humankind feels the touch of God's good justice.

#### Christian Stewardship In Everything We Give Thanks

Every November, the United States celebrates a great national holiday: Thanksgiving. Canada celebrates a similar feast in October. Although the origins of the U.S. festivity are somewhat historically murky, it is evident that some of the earliest immigrants to America celebrated this day as an expression of gratitude to God for bringing a healthy harvest which would ensure their colony's survival through the winter. It was the most primal kind of thankfulness: you have spared our lives, O Lord, and we are grateful.

Over the years, Thanksgiving in the U.S. has become a national expression of gratitude, but sometimes it veers into the neighborhood of cliché, and often it strays away from the source of our gifts. Television hosts will remind us we should be thankful for all the "stuff" we have, including some non-tangible items like freedom, but to whom are we grateful? In some circles, it's unfashionable to mention that it is God, the source of life and goodness, to whom we owe our deep, humble sense of appreciation.

The faith of the Christian steward, on the other hand, proclaims gratitude to God as its wellspring and cornerstone. The Christian steward is aware of thankfulness to God twelve months of the year, not just in November.

The steward knows, as St. Ignatius of Loyola taught us, that we "find God in all things." Therefore, we find reason to thank God in all things—for health of mind and body, for our families, our livelihoods, our successes, and the gifts of education, intelligence, and freedom that make our lives full and rewarding.

We also thank God for the embarrassing moments of our lives, for the disappointments, the sorrows, even the mistakes, because we know that God was present in each of those moments, ready to teach us and to guide us.

The Christian steward can go deep in prayer and thank God for lessons learned in times of trouble as well as times of bounty. Gratitude, for the Christian steward, is not just rendered in times of plenty, but in times of sadness and deprivation. The God of all is present in all situations.



Perhaps the challenge for us, as Christian stewards during November, is to be a source of reminder to all those around us that thanksgiving is truly a fundamental lifetime habit, rendered to the God of mercy and plenty.




