Pastor's Column

Prepare the Way of the Lord

As we continue our journey through the Season of Advent this weekend, we focus upon John the Baptist, who prepared the way for Jesus.

The voice in the wilderness cries out: "Prepare the Way of the Lord." In John, we see and hear a message of urgency and immediacy.

So often, as we make our journey of Faith, we become dulled and deadened to life around us. We "sleepwalk" through life, missing the presence of God in our midst, and we take for granted the love and care of family members and friends.

Advent is meant to be a time to shake and arouse us to God in our midst and life around us. Time is marching on! Unfortunately, we often lack that appreciation and only become aware when some event, usually tragic or difficult, shakes our foundations. And only then, do we look at God, others, and ourselves with a fresh set of eyes, the eyes of Faith.

During this Season of Advent, we, as a Faith Community, are reminded of our common vocation to follow in the footsteps of John the Baptist and to prepare the way of the Lord, to remind the world around us that the Kingdom of God is at hand.

We do so through our activities and involvements in the community of life around us, specifically in the areas that we call home, Carlsbad, Oceanside, and Vista. We are to be a voice, and a beacon of light, that points to Jesus, and his healing message of love.

In a very physical way, even our Parish Campus becomes a symbol and reminder of what the future holds for each of useternity. When people see a Church, when they hear a bell toll, when they see a tower with a cross, they are instantly jarred into remembering that life on Earth is temporary. We have come from somewhere and we are going somewhere. With this faith

Oplatki – Christmas Wafers

The word Bethlehem means "House of Bread." The breaking of bread is a sign of charity, unity, and friendship.

Religious family traditions and customs bring the truths of Faith into the home.

One of these beautiful Christmas customs is the Christmas Wafer. A Wafer bearing a simple design commemorative of Christ's birth is given to everyone present gathered together for the Christmas meal.

With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of the present and absent members of the family, the designated family member then invites everyone to go to another person, and with a gesture of a hug, kiss, or handshake, ask forgiveness for anything they may have done to hurt that family member in the past year, and to seek God's blessings upon them in the coming year.

Each person, as the words are said, then breaks a piece off of each other's Wafer and consumes the piece that has been broken off.

The spiritual lesson in this age old custom is unity of the family the main pillar of society. The bond of unity is the Christ-like charity that should exist among the members of the family.

The members of the family are the links in the unbroken chain of One Body, One Bread, One Christ, and the One Church. The family is part of the eternal procession no matter where they are. For there is a universal longing to be always with one another, with God.

SINGING A NEW SONG

I recently received an email from a Parishioner asking about the Mass settings we introduced in October, and why we sing new songs. Continuing our liturgical education, I share with you my response:

Congregations are called to be active participants in the liturgy by means of prayers, acclamations, and singing. The reasons we learn new songs to complement the ones we have learned before are all connected to this congregational imperative, but the basic reasons for broad and ever-changing а congregational repertoire are these:

First, there is the formal reason, a concept the Church calls *progressive* solemnity, in which the style and amount of music varies depending on the level of solemnity (or celebration). The greater feasts and liturgical seasons call for music that is capable of expressing greater solemnity. As a consequence, the settings of the parts of the Mass assigned to the congregation-the Gloria, Alleluia, Holy, Amen, Memorial Acclamation, and Lamb of God-are called to be more celebratory during the Easter and Christmas seasons than in Ordinary Time, when we might sing a simpler setting.

Practically speaking, this means that we need a variety of settings for different levels of solemnity. Usually Parishes have a single, most solemn setting that they use for the Easter and Christmas seasons (and, sometimes, Christ the King Sunday) with a variety of others for the differing needs of Advent, Lent, and Ordinary Time. Before the new Roman Missal texts were introduced, we were singing six different congregational settings of the Mass on a rotating, seasonal basis. With the change in the texts of the Roman Missal last year, we had to retire all the familiar settings. We are in the process of learning new musical settings of the Mass texts, slowly building our way back up to five or six settings. We have learned two settings since October 2011, and we have recently embarked on our third. Since it takes time to learn each new setting, we will learn no more than two each year.

Second, it is important that we be open to the workings and guidance of the Holy Spirit made manifest in the new creations of authors and composers. The quantity of new texts and songs that cross my desk every week is quite staggering (and not a little daunting), but I think we have an obligation to delve into some of it as best we can. A mentor of mine likes to remind me that at one point "Amazing Grace" was new, and had pastors and musicians not taken the chance of choosing it as part of their Sunday morning music, we might never have had the opportunity to hear it, let alone be moved by it. Certainly, there has always been the need to let the cream rise to the top, musically speaking, but unless we sing the new songs, we won't encounter those songs that eventually rise to the top, which bring us closer to God. The music ministry probably introduces a new song to the Parish every two or three months. Some of these songs have found a firm place in our Parish's regular repertoire; others have left the repertoire list quietly after a few singings.

Third, there is a need to honor the "big tent" that we worship under, recognizing that St. Thomas More is comprised of a diverse group of people and that our music must support everyone, as best it can, in their worship of God. It is for this reason that our music ministry offers a variety of musical forces at every





Mass: choir, praise team, cantor, handbells, flute, piano, and organ. It is also why we (congregation and music ministers) sing a variety of styles of music: hymns, contemporary praise songs, psalms, Gregorian chant, classic Catholic folk-style songs, and litanies. It is important to note, though, that the texts that are the most important consideration, and that, for the most part, all the words that we sing at Mass relate to the scriptures proclaimed at that liturgy.



Christian Stewardship and Christmas: Turning the World Upside Down

For women in the ancient world, motherhood was prized and desired above almost all else. Sacred scripture tells of many women who pleaded with God to let them conceive. From Sarah, the mother of Isaac, to Elizabeth, the mother of John the Baptist, the Bible is replete with women who finally, in old age, were granted the gift of motherhood for which they had begged God.

How marvelously significant it is, that in the town of Nazareth those many years ago, a young girl named Mary, unmarried and probably feeling altogether unready for motherhood, was visited by an angel who delivered God's plea: would she give God a child? Mary's response is a model *par excellence* for all those who aspire to be good stewards: "Behold, I am the Lord's servant. Let it be done to me according to your word" (Lk. 1:38).

And so the real mystery and beauty of Christmas is delivered: God turns the world upside down. In the words of the *Magnificat*, Mary proclaims the hope of every good steward: "My soul magnifies the Lord" (Lk. 1:46). He has dispersed the arrogant of mind and heart, lifted up the lowly, filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty.

Here is a new understanding of the God who desires not our begging and our pleas, but our 'yes' to God's invitation to be active stewards in His plan of salvation. For the Christian steward, the consumerism, the gaudiness, the excesses of our cultural Christmas can be overcome by answering the call to live simpler lives, to use less, to feed the poor, to quiet ourselves in stillness rather than grow louder in frenzied activity.



In her book *The Vigil: Keeping Watch in the Season of Christ's Coming*, Professor Wendy Wright from Creighton University writes: "The ancient desert dwellers of our early Christian communities tell us that the surest way into the heart of God is to be still. In

being still we learn to be attentive to the vast and hidden stillness that permeates all things."

In a world which prizes and desires wealth above so many things, the Christian steward finds in the stillness the true hope which lies at the heart of Christmas. Christ has come, and he comes again and again, and finally in the end, Christ comes. Once again, God implores us to receive this child in the stillness of our hearts, and respond to his call to transform the world's values—to turn the world upside down.
