MORE ON THE FUNERAL RITES

What happens when I donates my body to science?

I received a follow-up question to the two November bulletin articles on the three-part Funeral Rites, and I thought that it might be helpful to some to share the answer here.

Douglas, I have been following your articles and I came to realize that there would not be cremains or remains at my funeral since I have donated my body to science. After they have finished with me, the remains will be cremated and sent to my family. Does this mean the funeral will have to wait till then?

A family does not have to wait until their loved one's cremains are returned before celebrating the funeral rites, but they may. There are a number of options.

When one doesn't know when the cremains will be returned, it is most common to celebrate a Memorial Mass in place of the Funeral Mass. The main difference between the two liturgies is that in the Funeral Mass, there are prayers said over the cremains before they are taken to their final resting place, whereas in the Memorial Mass there are no sending prayers, as the cremains are not present. Aside from the prayers that the presence of the ashes necessitates, the two rites are the same.



Bible Study

A new session of Little Rock Scripture Study will begin February 6 and 7. Consider joining us to learn more about the women in the Old Testament.

While the men of the Old Testament often garner the most attention, the women of the Old Testament become all the more worthy of our interest because we have to dig deeper to recover their special contribution to the annals of faith.

Their stories are all the more remarkable in that they arise from historical eras that crimped their options in influencing or changing the flow of history.

The women of this study can be bold and decisive, also meek and faithful, but they are always compelled to act in ways that bring about change. We are most grateful to our parishioners who step up each year to facilitate the nearly 100 ministries that make St. Thomas More such a vibrant Faith Community. More hands are always welcome! **Did you know that ...**

It Takes:

- + **75** Liturgical Ministers to cover three Masses on any given weekend, including Eucharistic ministers, Hospitality ministers, Greeter, Readers, Altar Servers and Sacristans for each Mass.
- + **422** Masses to fill our Parish's liturgical needs each year judging by the past 12 months.
- + 5-6 People to set up the 600 chairs and arrange the Upper Level on Saturday mornings for Mass, once a month.
- + 16 Eucharistic Ministers to bring communion to Tri-City Hospital, on a weekly basis, each month on Tuesdays (four teams of four people).
- + **12 Eucharistic Ministers** weekly to administer communion to our Parish's shut-in members and to the convalescent and retirement homes we serve.
- **† 66** Handbells to make up the 4-1/2 octave set that 10 to 12 ringers use to play during Mass. We're grateful for the surprise Parishioner Handbell donation, which has made this choir possible!
- + 6 Artisans, and their helpers, on our Art & Environment team to prepare and maintain our worship space for our various seasons, feasts, and solemnities.
- + **83** Musicians to make the music we currently hear at the Parish during the year.
- 6 Weeks of rehearsal for every song that any of our choirs presents during a liturgy, an average of about 1-1/2 total practice hours each.
- + **275+ Stewards** to help our Faith Formation and Evangelization Ministries flow so seamlessly.

- + 35 Catechists and Assistants (plus more helpers) to share faith in the RE.A.CH program for our youth twice a month. 250 children are enrolled in this program which covers youth from 3 to 18 yrs. old.
- **+ A team of young adults** to support youth ministry of middle school and high school teens.
- + **50+ Parishioners** make our annual Vacation Bible School a success each summer. Enrollment is 160!
- + **8** Adult Facilitators for Liturgy of the Word for Children to allow our young parishioners, ages 4 through 12 yrs., to share God's Word on their level during the first part of Sunday Mass. *Adult Facilitators are needed to help with this ministry!*
- + **Many Hands** to help facilitate our celebration of the "Year of Faith" which offers multiple opportunities for adult faith formation throughout the year, including videos with discussion, men's and women's ministry, bible studies, and more!
- **6-Hour and 10-Hour Faith Formation Courses** to cover the needs of our teens. These are presented by those who enjoy interacting with teens. Help is needed to expand the courses offered. A team of young adult facilitators is a great alternative.
- **†** Great Faith for 40+ Parishioners to participate in our weekly morning and evening sessions of Little Rock Scripture Studies.
- **Faithful Stewards** to help facilitate our RCIA team. Sponsors are welcome to journey with and prepare new members for initiation into the Catholic Church.
- + **3** Catechists to help with monthly classes to prepare parents presenting infants for Baptism.
- + **10 Baptism Banner Makers** to make a special banner for each new Catholic.
- + **8 STM Parishioners** to staff the serving line at Brother Benno's on the first Saturday of each month.
- **† Many People** to provide dinners, on the last Sunday of each month, to North County Solutions for Change homeless shelter in Vista. Individual families, and/or ministerial groups provide the monthly dinners, which serve 35-40 people.

It takes nearly 1,500 stewards to continue the mission and ministry of Jesus at STM!

- **† 6-8** Stewards to stuff our bulletins every week!
- + **5** People to handle table linen duty after receptions.
- **60-75** Stewards, depending on the size of the funeral, to help the Bereavement Ministry cover details of a funeral from start to finish, including: Core Team Ministers who work with the family Liturgical Ministers for Mass or Memorial Service Bakers and Salad Makers for the receptions Kitchen/Reception Area set up/clean up crews Ushers and Greeters (*More needed please!*) Paschal Choir Members provide musical support at every funeral.
- **† 6 People a weekend** to sell Scrip after each weekend Mass. It takes 26 people to run the Scrip program and a minimum of 1,000 families using Scrip to make this program worthwhile.
- + 120+ People to coordinate all the details of our annual STM Gala. June 2, 2013 marks our second Annual STM Gala and includes: Happy Hour, Dinner, Raffles/Live/Silent Auctions Childcare provided (with dinner/entertainment)
- + **8-10** Parishioners to promote our Culture of Life efforts with Birth Choice in San Marcos, Life Walk, and collections for newborn infants.
- + **50+** People to make our Christmas Angel Program a success with collections for North County Solutions for Change homeless shelters in Vista, children of Camp Pendleton families, stockings for local families in need, and infant items for Birth Choice.
- Numerous Knights of Columbus to help: 30-45 facilitating Sunday Breakfasts,
 22 weekly facilitating Lenten Fish Dinners,
 6 per weekend to work table for sale of Christmas cards, stickers and entertainment book sales.
- + **10 Spirited Seniors** to plan and organize multiple annual events to enhance the spiritual, educational and friendship needs of all its members.
- Multiple Women's Guild Members:
 56 to facilitate Bake Sales,
 10 quilters to provide for annual raffle,

- + **14 Stewards** from our Membership Committee to host semi-annual Welcome Receptions for our newest members.
- *** 8 Women** to promote the work of Project Linus by making blankets for children undergoing physical or emotional difficulties. *Help welcome!*
- + **5** Certified Instructors to train and certify 400+ Parishioners in CPR/AED with the American Red Cross classes offered at the Parish.
- + **10** Stewards with San Diego Organizing Project to assist our local community organizations to improve the quality of life and neighborhoods.
- + **14 Interior Design Team Members** to attend to the numerous details involved with the Interior Design of a Roman Catholic Church!
- + **13 Development Council Members** assist the pastor in creating a "culture of development" within the parish, serving as a catalyst for growth and providing the means for us to meet our long term goals and objectives.
