Pastor's Column

Who and What Rules My Life?

During this Season of Lent, we enter into the desert as Jesus did and face, head-on, the demons with which we struggle.

On the First Sunday of Lent, we were reminded that immediately after his Baptism, the Spirit drove Jesus into the desert where he spent forty days among the wild beasts and the angels of the Lord ministered to him.

Before Jesus began his public ministry, he had to struggle with his demons. He had to face temptation and conquer it.

His task is our task as well! As his disciples, continuing his mission and ministry, we must deal with and conquer our demons if we are to worthily and responsibly preach the Gospel.

If we take advantage of these Forty Days, through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we are given an opportunity to renew and refresh ourselves in order to be more faithful to our Baptismal Promises.

You are encouraged to take these questions with you into the

desert this Lent. May these questions help you live more honestly, responsibly, and worthily as Disciples of the Lord Jesus:

Am I living in the image and likeness of God?

Do I see myself as a daughter, as a son of God?

Do I think about Jesus on a daily basis?

Do I regard him as my brother?

What passions rule my life?

In what area(s) of my life, am I living a lie?

What is making me a slave?

...alcohol, other drugs, food, money, cigarettes, anger, jealousy, unhealthy relationships, prejudice, stereotyping and judging groups of people of other races, religions or different sexual orientation...

If we want to live in God's Kingdom, we must be willing to struggle with and, trusting in God's grace, be willing to conquer our demons!




A Retreat at Sea!

JOURNEYING TO THE EASTER VIGIL

Signs and Symbols of the Holy Night

PASCHAL CANDLE

The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night is greatest and most noble of all the Church's liturgical celebrations. As part of our Lenten journey, I offer these meditations on the signs and symbols we will encounter during this most holy night.

Luke 9:33

What is this great paschal candle that stands in our midst?

It is the pillar of fire by which God led the children of Israel from slavery to freedom, through the dusty desert to the land flowing with milk and honey. Behind it, we will

With it, we will lead those chosen for the sacraments of new life to the font of baptism that is both tomb and womb.

It is the holy sign of Christ our Light. (Thanks be to God!) On it. we trace the sign of Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, the alpha and omega. Into it, we press five jewels that are the wounds of divine hands and feet and side. For it, we sing our song of consecration and praise: "Accept this candle, a solemn offering, the work of bees and of your servants' hands, an evening sacrifice of praise...Let it mingle with the lights of heaven." From it, we take our own light, a flame divided but undimmed. All who are baptized walk in its glow.

For fifty days it will shine gloriously in the assembly of the church. Then, held in a place of honor near the font, it is brought out and lit for every baptism and every funeral, every birth and every birth unto eternal life. And as the days and seasons turn, slowly this pillar of finest wax and strongest wick is consumed, burned down, eaten up by fire, sacrificed-like Christ himself-and never truly extinguished. And so it measures our days and seasons until it is Easter again, until once more we

sing in the light of a new paschal candle: "May this flame be found still burning by the Morning Star, Christ your Son, who, coming back from death's domain, has shed his peaceful light on humanity." Thanks be to God!

Christian Stewardship Begins with Humility

For most people, the virtue of humility is complicated.

Simply defined, humility is a quality by which a person considers his own defects, has a humble opinion of himself, and willingly submits himself to God and to others for God's sake.

Christian Stewards are happy to be humble.

Being modest, and unpretentious are hallmarks of humility. It's no wonder that in America, where we value power, money, happiness, and success, understanding this particular virtue can be even more confusing.

We want to be successful. We want our children to be happy. We want to chart the course of our lives in a way that allows us to best achieve our goals. And, deep down, most of us believe we know exactly how to do that, and that we are the masters of our own destiny.

According to the great Catholic writer and Trappist monk Thomas Merton, we may want to rethink that notion. "We ought to have the humility to admit we do not know all about ourselves, that we are not experts at running our own lives," Merton said.

As stewards, we must realize that God is in control. We are called to follow Christ, not the world, to give up a portion of our resources for the benefit of others, even if that means we have less time, money, or energy for our own personal gain.

Proverbs 3:5-6 tells us to "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him and he will direct your paths."

As a steward, we must place our ultimate trust in God. This can be easy when things are going smoothly. It seems like when everything is going the way we would like and God is providing for everything, we feel peaceful.

However, when things get a little rocky and spiral out of our comfort zones, we can get nervous, and all of our trust flies out the window. Lent is a good time to reflect on all these things.



Scripture reminds us on many occasions to not give in to our internal panic buttons and to offer our troubles to the Lord, who will always take care of our every need. *When we do, we let go and let God.*
