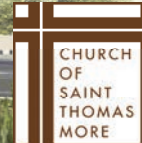

Love Deeply

The Christian call to be people of love is ever before us. We can experience many negative and/or discouraging forces, pressures, and people in life that can supply us with the motivation to not love, or to love less than what our capabilities allow, and to not give our all for God.

May these words of Fr. Henri Nouwen, taken from his book, *The Inner Voice of Love*, strengthen us to be faithful to our Christian vocation:

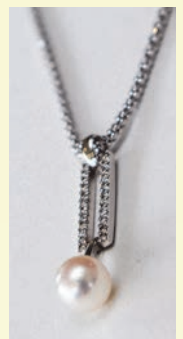
Do not hesitate to love and to love deeply. You might be afraid of the pain that deep love can cause. When those you love deeply reject you, leave you, or die, your heart will be

broken. But that should not hold you back from loving deeply. The pain that comes from deep love makes your love ever more fruitful. It is like a plow that breaks the ground to allow the seed to take root and grow into a strong plant. Every time you experience the pain of rejection, absence, or death, you are faced with a choice. You can become bitter and decide not to love again, or you can stand straight in your pain and let the soil on which you stand become richer and more able to give life to new seeds.

The more you have loved and have allowed yourself to suffer because of your love, the more you will be able to let your heart grow wider and deeper. When your love is truly giving and receiving, those whom you love will not leave your heart even when they depart from you. They will become part of your self and thus gradually build a community within you. Those you have deeply loved become part of you. The longer you live, there will always be more people to be loved by you and to become part of your inner community. The wider your inner community becomes, the more easily you will recognize your own brothers and sisters in the strangers around you. Those who are alive within you will recognize those who are alive around you. The wider the community of your heart, the wider the community around you. Thus the pain of rejection, absence, and death can become fruitful. Yes, as you love deeply the ground of your heart will be broken more and more, but you will rejoice in the abundance of the fruit it will bear.

In today's Gospel, we hear the words of Jesus: "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

May our Eucharist today strengthen us to be faithful to these words!

Children with a parent in prison are usually cared for by relatives, often grandparents. Many caregivers are unable to afford either the time or money to take these children to visit parents. Get On the Bus offers a priceless opportunity—a mother's touch, a father's hug, a private conversation and a connection with hope and healing.

Did you know?

- Approximately 2/3 of women who go to prison have minor children at the time of their incarceration.
- Most mothers report that they do not see their children throughout the entire time they are in prison.
- Regular visits between children and their incarcerated parent lower rates of recidivism for the parent and improve family reunification following the parent's release.

The Bishops' Letter on Marriage—Annulments: "We encourage divorced persons who wish to marry in the Catholic Church to seek counsel about the options that exist to remedy their situation, including the suitability of a declaration of nullity when there is no longer any hope of reconciliation of the spouses. Such a declaration is a finding by a church tribunal, or court, that no valid marriage bond was formed because the requirements for valid consent were not met at the time of the wedding. WHEN THE SPIRIT NUDGES

It seems this is meant to be an opportune time for recruitment to the liturgical ministries.

Last week, I discussed the perception that the men of the Parish may not be pulling their weight. A cursory analysis of the numbers of liturgical ministers showed that while the men of the Parish may be as involved as the women, their public ministry—their day-to-day and week-to-week visibility at daily and weekend Masses—may not be perceived as significant in comparison to the women of the Parish.

On Sunday, as part of the prayers offered before the Mass by the assembled liturgical ministers, there was a specific intention for additional Eucharistic ministers for the Parish by one serving in that capacity. (I believe he may have been prompted by his wife, or by the team leader, whom had been trying to find additional ministers to fill empty positions, or both.)

This morning, a registration form for the Diocese of San Diego's Minister Formation Workshops crossed my desk. After a significant hiatus, the diocese is once again offering formation classes for people interested in becoming a Minister of the Word (Reader) or an Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (Eucharistic minister).

Three nudges from the Holy Spirit. Who am I to go against the flow?

There continues to be a great need for liturgical ministers at our daily and weekend Masses, as well as in the areas of ministry that are less visible. We always have the required eleven Eucharistic ministers for each weekend Mass, but sometimes this means grabbing a "willing" volunteer (or two) as they walk in the door minutes before Mass

begins. Last-minute recruitment happens at almost every weekend Mass, as we attempt to find the necessary number of Altar Servers, Hospitality ministers, Eucharistic ministers, and Readers. No one likes running around at the last minute to find additional people, and a full complement of ministers allows the liturgy to flow more smoothly.

Additional ministers (new or returning) would be very, very welcome. Please consider participating, and if you feel the Spirit nudging you, contact me, and we'll get you trained and set up to serve.

But for the previous seven years he had given away some \$26,000, mostly in \$1,000 parcels. He endowed a \$1,000 annual scholarship at the Hampton Institute . . . and much more.

A Responsibility to Share

To many Americans, wealth is the house on the hill, overlooking the town. But to many wealthy Americans, wealth means a responsibility to share.

Traces of this large-scale giving are all over America. For example, it is difficult to imagine what Emory University's medical center in Atlanta would be without the more than \$100 million contributed by Coca-Cola magnate, Robert W. Woodruff.

Each One Wants to Give

The likes of the Mellons, the Carnegies, the Rockefellers are called philanthropists. Their bequests to society are numerous.

But what of the postal worker who lived in the slums and endowed a \$1,000 scholarship? He is among a large group of ordinary Americans, many anonymous, simply known as givers.

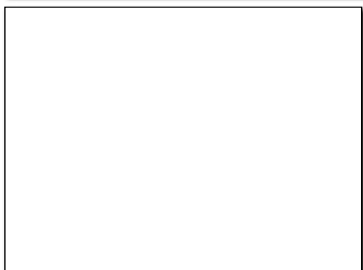
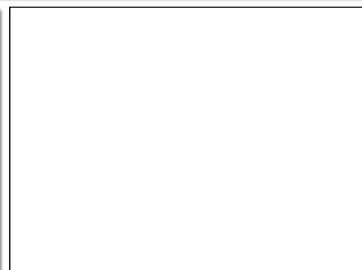

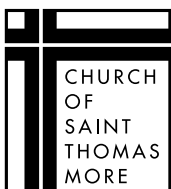
