Pastor's Column

Go Up the River and Beyond the Bend

This parable is taken from Fr. Ronald Rolheiser's book, *The Holy Longing – The Search for a Christian Spirituality*:

Once upon a time there was a town that was built just beyond the bend of a large river. One day some of the children from the town were playing beside the river when they noticed three bodies floating in the water. They ran for help and the townsfolk quickly pulled the bodies out of the river.

One body was dead so they buried it. One was alive, but quite ill, so they put that person into the hospital. The third turned out to be a healthy child, who they then placed with a family who cared for it and who took it to school.

From that day on, every day a number of bodies came floating down the river and, every day, the good people of the town would pull them out and tend to them—taking the

sick to hospitals, placing the children with families, and burying those who were dead.

This went on for years; each day brought its quota of bodies, and the townsfolk not only came to expect a number of bodies each day but also worked at developing more elaborate systems for picking them out of the river and tending to them. Some of the townsfolk became quite generous in tending to these bodies and a few extraordinary ones even gave up their jobs so that they could tend to this concern full-time. And the town itself felt a certain healthy pride in its generosity.

However, during all these years and despite all that generosity and effort, nobody thought to go up the river, beyond the bend that hid from their sight what was above them, and find out why, daily, those bodies came floating down the river."

This parable says to me, "Get to the root causes. Don't just treat the symptoms."

So often, though, we are afraid to get to the root of things, because, subconsciously, we know that to do so will mean a change in our own attitudes, gestures, and behavior.

Finding the real solution more often than not means not only a change in the "opponent" but it also entails the need for a change in the one seeking the solution.

There is an old Jewish proverb that says, "Listen to your enemies. God is speaking."

Whether it is a marital conflict, a family difficulty, community relationships, or even national policies from immigration to health care to the War in Afghanistan, if we want to deal with more than the symptoms and get to the root cause of things, we must have the courage to listen to our critic, our opponent, and, yes, even our enemy. In their criticism, in their stridency, or even in their hateful words and actions, there is a message waiting for us to hear and a lesson to be learned. "Listen to your enemies, God is speaking."

Whatever controversy or difficulty we are facing, be it at home, at work, in the local, national, or international community, let us have the courage to move beyond treating the symptoms. Let us be willing to go up the river, and beyond the bend!

Answering a Life-Altering Question

Scripture Themes for June

In his work of *Essays*, published in 1625, Francis Bacon said, "A sudden, bold, and unexpected question doth many times surprise a man and lay him open." On the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time (June 23), the Lucan Jesus will ask such a question. Despite the centuries that have elapsed since Jesus first made his query, it remains a "sudden, bold, and unexpected question" that lays us open before its challenge: "Who do you say I am?"

Before all else—before preaching one word of the Gospel, before being willing to bear witness to him with our lives—potential disciples then and now have to consider that question seriously and deliberately. For the answer to that question is not a once-and-final response. On the contrary, we enunciate that answer from moment to moment and day to day, as it defines not only who Jesus is for us but who we are for him and for others.

To mentor believers as we consider and answer Jesus' question, the sacred texts for this month offer various ways of appreciating Jesus, the Christ event and its impact on us and our faith. This, in turn, will determine how our responses to Jesus will impact our world, with all its peoples and needs.

June's sacred celebrations begin (June 2) with the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Luke retells the narrative of the feeding of the multitude, while Paul offers the earliest rendering of Jesus' gift of himself in Eucharist. "Who do you say that I am?" You are food for sinners; you are food that fed not only those present that long-ago day, but all the hungry who would come after them. In the 12 baskets of leftovers and in Jesus' directive "Give them something to eat yourselves," we recognize that any

truthful answer to Jesus' question will include a willingness to be blessed and broken so that all others may be nurtured, as well.

On the Tenth, Eleventh, and Twelfth Sundays of Ordinary Time, (June 9, 16, 23), Jesus will reach out to help those whom others of his day might have avoided, e.g., a dead son and a woman known to be a sinner. "Who do you say I am?" You are of universal mind and heart; none are excluded from God's salvific plan fulfilled in you. Our acknowledgement of Jesus' inclusiveness challenges the human penchant for bias and prejudice. As Paul will affirm on June 23, there is neither slave nor free: Jew nor Greek; male and female; all are children of God in Christ Jesus. If we are to belong to Jesus, we are to be similarly ecumenical, excluding none, reaching out indiscriminately to every human being.

On the last Sunday of June (30), the sacred texts will encourage our perseverance in remaining faithful to Jesus. Our commitment to him and to the continuation of his mission will require a single-hearted determination to stay the course and not look back with longing or regret. "Who do you say I am?" You are the Christ who plunged ahead even when the specter of the cross loomed so large in your future. A similar daring determination is the only worthy response to the gracious gift of salvation Jesus wrought.

Usually, caution would dictate that those setting out on a mission have a backup plan or a means of safe return. But daring commitment would preclude such a plan. In ancient times, the Roman armies were known to burn their bridges behind them or scuttle their boats after crossing by sea into a land they wished to conquer. With no means

of retreat, the soldiers fought their hardest to survive and achieve victory. Similarly, Muslim leader Tariq ibn Ziyad ordered his ships burned when he and his armies invaded the Iberian Peninsula in 711 C.E. Eight centuries later, in 1519, Hernán Cortés burned his ships upon arriving in Mexico. In that way, his soldiers had nowhere to go but forward. While ours is not a military mission, nor should we be about the business of war, there is surely a lesson here for believers. That same lesson is taught by Elisha (June 30), who, when called to take up Elijah's prophetic ministry, burned his plowing equipment. In that act, he left all behind to commit himself to God's word.

Our answer to Jesus' question "Who do you say I am?" must be similarly life-altering. Our response is not only spoken but lived, not only intellectual but passionate, for when we commit ourselves to living out our response to Jesus, we are to leave all else behind and entrust ourselves fully to wherever Jesus may lead. 

Christian Stewardship: Living Our Trinitarian Faith

This weekend we celebrate The Most Holy Trinity. This reminds us that the doctrine of the Trinity is not some abstract theology. It is part of every day life as it recalls for us that three persons in one God, father; Jesus, son; and Holy Spirit, exist in perfect communion, in perfect unity.

Christian stewards are called by Christ and gifted by the Spirit to participate in God's transforming work in the world. Christ walks with us on our individual journey, teaching us and sending us.

Stewards are the hands, the feet and the eyes of God and serve as co-redeemers with him.

Sometimes the Spirit moves us and our Church in directions that challenge us and take us and our Church in directions that instill anxiety and fear. But the heart of the steward remains open to the movement of the Spirit.




