Pastor's Column

As I begin my journey with the Church of St. Thomas More and become a member of this Faith Community, I share with you the

words of The Most Reverend Daniel Pilarczyk, the now retired, former Archbishop of Cincinnati, taken from his book, *The Parish: Where God's People Live:*

'A Parish, then, is a moment, a chapter in God's love affair with us human beings. And being a member of a Parish does not mean just "belonging to something", but rather, being involved in a loving association with God in Christ Jesus and with each other in Him, and with all the world for Him. Parish is therefore concerned with relationships, our relationship with Christ and our relationship with each other in Him. Consequently, the main participant in every Parish is the Lord Himself. It is He around whom the people gather in worship. It is He whose word the Parishioners hear there. It is His work the Parishioners carry out in the context of the Parish's life and in their activity in the world, activity for which they are enlightened and strengthened in the Parish. It is for the strengthening and expression of His Body, the Church, that the Parishioners build buildings and carry out programs. It is in response to His love that the Parish engages in care for the poor and in outreach to those who have forgotten Christ or have never known Him.

I now have the privilege of joining you, the Church of St. Thomas More, on its Faith Journey, its Love Affair with God, in and through the Lord Jesus Christ. I pray that, because our paths now become one, we will continue to deepen our relationship with the Lord Jesus, and that we will continue to center our lives more completely on Him.

As I begin my ministry as your Pastor, I commit all of my time, talent, treasure, and energy in building on the strong foundation that has already been set, that is, the ongoing creation of a climate and an environment of hospitality that says: "The Church of St. Thomas More is holy ground. The Church of St. Thomas More is a people and a place where God is revered, and all God's People are treated with dignity, respect, and offered the opportunity to be challenged by the Gospel. The Church of St. Thomas More is the home of brothers and sisters in Christ who take time to support each other in deepening their relationship with Jesus the Christ for the purpose of making our world a better and safer place for all people.

I promise all of you that I will do all that I can, during this time of transition, that as a Faith Community, we do not experience "a loss of momentum," but rather, that we experience a "surge of energy."

As we pilgrimage through life, as individuals and as a community of Faith, our book of Life is being written. Some chapters we write. Other chapters are written for us. Chapters end. New chapters begin. Today we begin a new chapter in the Faith Life of the Church of St. Thomas More. With me, I ask that you "look forward to opportunities for growth that change affords."

As we begin to walk together, may our prayer be: "For all that has been—Thank you. For all that will be—Yes!"

"AS WE ACCLAIM"

Who are all these people we are supposed to sing with?

We're back in Ordinary Time, and so I have time to check off another item on my list of things I would like to understand more thoroughly at Mass.

At every Mass, the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer begins with a dialogue between priest and people:

The Lord be with you. / And with your spirit. Lift up your hearts. / We lift them up... etc.

This dialogue leads directly into the Preface, which explains why we are giving thanks to God on this occasion, for example:

For out of compassion for the waywardness that is ours, he humbled himself and was born of the Virgin; by the passion of the Cross he freed us from unending death, and by rising from the dead he gave us life eternal. [*Preface I of Ordinary Time*]

Then we are invited by the priest to sing in the big choir:

And so, with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominions, and with all the hosts and Powers of heaven, we sing the hymn of your glory, as without end we acclaim: Holy, holy, holy...

Sometimes, other groups are mentioned: "the Angels and Saints" or "the great multitude of Saints" or "the Virtues of heaven" or "the blessed Seraphim" or "Cherubim." Sometimes there are many; other times there are few.

I realized early on that, aside from the saints, these are all types of angels, the heavenly host, whom we sing about in "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing":

With the angelic host proclaim, "Christ is born in Bethlehem!"

But there are certainly a lot of different types mentioned. So here is a quick introduction for those of us who missed out the first time.

The Catechism states that "Angels are spiritual beings who glorify God without ceasing and who serve his saving plans for other creatures" (§350). Thomas Aquinas and others have differentiated angels into nine groups, or choirs, divided into three spheres.

The angels of the First Sphere serve as the heavenly counselors. In this group are:

Seraphim (singular "Seraph") are the highest angelic class and serve as the caretakers of God's throne and continuously shout praises: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts. All the earth is filled with his Glory." (Is 6:3)



Luke 10:5

Cherubim (singular "Cherub") guard the way to the tree of life in the Garden of Eden (Gen 3:24) and the throne of God (Ez 28:14-16). These are not the winged human baby/toddler-like beings traditionally used in figurative art, which are properly called *putti*.

Thrones are living symbols of God's justice and authority, and have as one of their symbols the throne.

Angels of the Second Sphere work as heavenly governors.

Dominions are presented as the hierarchy of celestial beings, regulating the duties of lower angels. They are also the angels who preside over nations.

Virtues lay beyond the Thrones. Their primary duty is to supervise the movements of the heavenly bodies in order to ensure that the cosmos remains in order.

Powers are the bearers of conscience and the keepers of history. Their duty is to oversee the distribution of power among humankind, hence their name.

The Third Sphere is comprised of angels who function as heavenly messengers and soldiers.

Principalities appear to collaborate, in power and authority, with the Powers and bequeath blessings to the material world. They are the educators and guardians of the realm of earth.

Archangels are angels of highest rank. Their number is uncertain, but Roman Catholics identify three by name: St. Gabriel, St. Michael, and St. Raphael.

Angels appear frequently in the New Testament, for example, giving messages to Mary, Joseph, and the shepherds; ministering to Christ after his temptation in the wilderness; at the tomb of the risen Christ; liberating Peter and Paul from prison.

Different theologians offer slightly different hierarchies, but this will get us started "as we acclaim."

Sometimes abbreviations don't tell the whole story, so I'm going to try calling LOWC (Liturgy of the Word for Children), "Children's Church."

During the summer months at most 8:30 and 10:30 Masses we are able to dismiss children ages 4-12 with a catechist to go downstairs and listen to and reflect on the Scriptures in children's language rather than adult language. Besides allowing them to get a "stretch break" they are able to relate the Scripture readings to their daily lives through discussion with the group.

This opportunity has been coordinated by our Parishioner, Cathy Meyers, for a great many years and I am indebted to her for her leadership and ministry. Cathy leads "Children's Church" at most 8:30am Masses. We are blest to have Anthony Barela, a faith-filled educator and a great dad, lead the vast multitudes out at the 10:30am Mass. Fr. Mike sometimes offers him a special blessing when there are over 30 children gathering in the middle aisle!

On occasion Cathy and Anthony have other Sunday obligations, so I would really like to encourage other adults to consider this ministry. If you enjoy sharing faith with young children, feel free to go down with the children and see what goes on. If this gives you the confidence and excitement to want to get involved, just let me know. We'll provide some training and support you as you begin.

I want to offer a special word of appreciation to the teens who quietly and quickly assess the "numbers" and join the procession to assist Anthony and the children. . .future catechists, I hope!



The children are separated during the Liturgy of the Word and return for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This is valuable not only to the children, but also to the adults in the assembly since distractions are lessened and focus can be more easily directed to the proclamation of the Scriptures and the homily.

"Children's Church" is scheduled as space in our building permits. As our church progresses, it gives us hope that we will soon have more space available for children's services. During the school year we have less opportunity to dismiss the children because there is no space available on the lower level due to Religious Education for the 3, 4 and 5 years olds, along with RCIA meetings and Confirmation sessions, etc, etc, etc.

It is a wonderful problem to have more children's ministries than we can house! I encourage parents of young families to share your ideas with me so we can continue to develop new possibilities. Perhaps a Parent Co-op for children under 3 during Mass? Many things are possible when we all work together.
