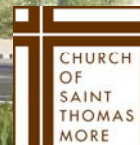

Ministerial Leadership in the Church— The Role of the Pastor

In the last number of years, we have experienced great changes in ministerial leadership in the Church. The shift from priests and sisters providing the majority of service to the community to lay women and men, in the majority, ministering along with priests, deacons, and sisters has created an entirely different "face" to Parish leadership. This new "face" is very evident here at St. Thomas More.

With this in mind, I want to share some thoughts on the role of a pastor taken from Canon Law and then some thoughts on lay leadership and collaboration with clergy. This week I focus on the role of the pastor. Next week, there will be thoughts on lay leadership.

Canon 528.1: A pastor is obliged to make provision so that the words of God is proclaimed in its entirety to those living in the parish; for this reason, he is to take care that the lay members of the Christian faithful are instructed in the truths of the faith, especially by giving a homily on Sundays and holy days of obligation and by offering catechetical instruction. He is to foster works through which the spirit of the gospel is promoted, even in what pertains to social justice. He is to have particular care for the Catholic education of children and youth. He is to make every effort, even with collaboration of the Christian faithful, so that the

message of the gospel comes also to those who have ceased the practice of their religion or do not profess the true faith.

Canon 528.2: The pastor is to see to it that the Most Holy Eucharist is the center of the parish assembly of the faithful. He is to work so that the Christian faithful are nourished through the devout celebration of the sacraments and, in a special way, that they frequently approach the sacraments of the Most Holy Eucharist and Penance. He is also to endeavor that they are led to practice prayer even as families and take part consciously and actively in the sacred liturgy which, under the authority of the diocesan bishop, the pastor must direct in his own parish and is bound to watch over so that no abuses creep in.

Canon 529.1: In order to fulfill his office diligently, a pastor is to strive to know the faithful entrusted to his care. Therefore he is to visit families, sharing especially in the cares, anxieties, and griefs of the faithful, strengthening them in the Lord, and prudently correcting them if they are failing in certain areas. With generous love he is to help the sick, particularly those close to death, by refreshing them solicitously with the sacraments and commending their souls to God; with particular diligence he is to seek out the poor, the afflicted, the lonely, those exiled from their country, and similarly those weighed down by special difficulties. He is to work so that spouses and parents are supported in fulfilling their proper duties and is to foster growth of Christian life in the family.

Canon 529.2: A pastor is to recognize and promote the proper part which the lay members of the Christian faithful have in the mission of the Church, by fostering their associations for the purposes of religion. He is to cooperate with his own bishop and the presbyterium of the diocese, also working so that the faithful have concern for parochial communion, consider themselves members of the diocese and of the universal Church, and participate in and sustain efforts to promote this shared communion.

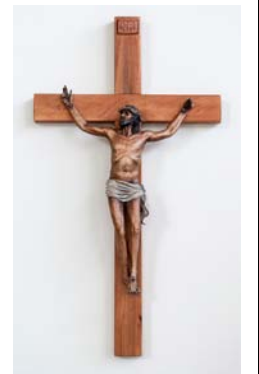

CLOSING THE MUSIC MINISTRY YEAR

In the same way that schools have an academic year, churches have a music ministry year. Although planning and preparation for our weekend liturgies never really stops, the summer months bring with them a slowing of the musical pace.

Here at St. Thomas More, the Handbell Choir, Praise Team, and Sanctuary Choir begin to rehearse right after Labor Day, and continue singing and playing into July. This weekend, they present their final musical offerings of the music ministry year, and will take a well-deserved break until rehearsals and participation in our Parish liturgies resume in September.

The singers and instrumentalists that comprise these ensembles are shining examples of stewardship to this Parish, offering their time and talent to supporting the mission and ministry of our faith community. I am so very appreciative of their dedication to the music of this Parish, and I know from the many comments I have received through the year that you share in my appreciation.

But music ministry never stops completely at a church. Kathy Santy and Sally Fay will continue to lead our musical worship from the

keyboards, our Paschal Choir will continue to sing in support of gathered families and friends at Funeral and Memorial Masses, our cantors will continue to be our psalmists and song leaders at weekend and daily Masses, musicians will soon meet to rehearse for our next Family Night on August 16, and some of our youth have been meeting to experiment in the world of musical bronze.

But even more importantly, music ministry never stops at a church because, Sunday after Sunday, Mass after Mass, we never stop singing in church. The US Bishops have stated, "The musical participation of the faithful...is the primary song of the Liturgy." Put another way, everyone is a member of the BIG choir during Mass. And if the cantor-less Saturday Mass a couple of weeks ago is any indication, the BIG choir is doing very, very well at St. Thomas More.

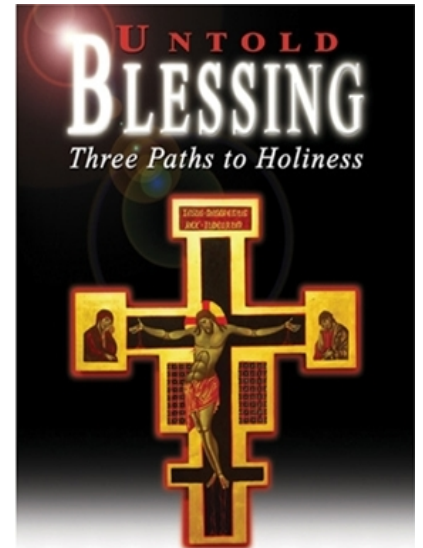

Is It Possible to Be All Things to All People?

Many of us have struggled with the story of Martha and Mary related in today's Gospel from Luke. Our sympathies tend to be with Martha, who seems to be doing all the work, while Mary is enjoying listening to Jesus, but not doing much to prepare food or to serve the Lord and those who are with him.

Jesus, however, has an important stewardship point for each of us. In those times when we feel stressed, when we feel like no one appreciates us, when we feel like we are the only ones who truly understand what is important, we need to hear Jesus saying, "Martha, Martha. You are anxious and worried about many things."

It is very easy to get caught up in the daily struggles of everything we do—working, parenting, serving, ministering, caring, and even loving. And, of course, all of those things are important. But what, according to Jesus, should be the most important thing ("There is need of only one thing.")?

That one necessary thing is at the heart of stewardship—our relationship to the Lord and our trust in Him. That necessary thing fulfills itself in our prayer life and in the other ways we set aside time for God to be a part of our lives. That time is precious, and is the true "food for the soul" about which Jesus often talks.
