The Culture of Encounter

Since his election as Bishop of Rome, Pope Francis has, in his various homilies and talks, been using the language of inclusion which he calls "the culture of encounter."

He described it this way in a homily during one of his morning Masses at the Domus Santae Martae:

Doing good is a principle that unites all humanity, beyond the diversity of ideologies and religions and creates the "culture of encounter" that is the foundation of peace...The Lord has redeemed all of us, all of us, with the Blood of Christ: all of us, not just

Catholics. Everyone! "Father, the atheists?" Even the atheists. Everyone! And this Blood makes us children of God of the first class! We are created children in the likeness of God and the Blood of Christ has redeemed us all! And we all have a duty to do good. And this commandment for everyone to do good, I think, is a beautiful path towards peace. If we, each doing our own part, if we do good to others, if we meet there, doing good and we go slowly, gently, little by little, we will make that culture of encounter: we need that so much. We must meet each other doing good. "But I don't believe, Father. I am an atheist!" But do good: we will meet one another there.

Speaking to the Italian Association for the Blind and Visually Impaired in June, he said:

I also wish the best for your association. Spread a culture of encounter, solidarity, and hospitality towards persons with disabilities, not just asking for the proper social services but also encouraging their active participation in society.

At World Youth Day in Brazil in July, Pope Francis gave these remarks:

Promote a culture of encounter. In many places, and in general in this economic humanism that has been imposed throughout the world, the culture of exclusion, a "throwaway culture," is spreading. There is no place for the elderly or for the unwanted child; there is no time for that poor person in the street. At times, it seems that for some people, human relations are regulated by two modern "dogmas": efficiency and pragmatism...have the courage to go against the tide, against this throwaway culture. Let us not reject this gift of God which is the one family of his children. Encountering and welcoming everyone, solidarity—a word which is hidden in our society, as if it were a bad word, solidarity and fraternity: these are what make our society truly human... Be servers of communion and the culture of encounter! And do so without being presumptuous, imposing "our truths." What must guide us is the humble yet joyful certainty of those who have been found, touched and transformed by the Truth who is Christ, ever to be proclaimed.

What is a "culture of encounter" from the Catholic perspective? One anonymous blogger put it this way in words with which I very much agree:

The culture of encounter is the opposite of the fortress mentality. Instead of being defensive and shying away from others, we engage them where they are at, letting our actions speak for us and observing the others' actions to learn what good they know.

Encounter is a loaded word because Catholics speak of liturgy, scripture, sacraments, etc., as moments of encounter with Christ. Through these encounters we grow in holiness and grow closer to God.

The implication here is that encounter with non-Catholics, even non-Christians or the irreligious can be of benefit to us. The benefit is not only to us; we see ourselves as leaven in the dough of humanity.

Immigration Reform Action

Our church is one of many sister Parishes throughout San Diego County participating in the Action for Immigration Reform. This aggregation of churches, working with the San Diego Organizing Project, is currently involved in a residential outreach to encourage support for the passage of an immigration bill and asking individuals to call Congressmans Issa (888-979-7506) or to write his office (1800 Thibodo Rd., #301, Vista, CA 92081).



A team from St. Thomas More is leading the effort to encourage local businesses to contact Congressman Darrell Issa's office to express their support for passage of legislation in the House of Representatives. The U.S. Senate has already submitted its own bill.

During the month of August, while Congress is in recess, this campaign will be focusing on generating letters, emails, and faxes from business owners to Congressman Issa's office. We will also be collecting petitions to the Congressman from the business community to be forwarded to him.

We encourage our business leaders to express their support for immigration reform, following the example of our diocese and Parish leaders, as well as the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. According to a *Field Research Corporation* poll published on February 22, 2013 (#2439) there is now nearly universal support among California voters in favor of allowing undocumented immigrants who have lived here for a number of years to stay and become citizens if they have a job, learn English, and pay back taxes. Statewide, 90% of voters now favor this policy.

SINGING "THOSE" SONGS

As the Parish's Director of Liturgy and Music, I get questions about the songs we sing, and the most intriguing questions go something like, "Why do we sing *those* songs?"

For some, the question is a serious inquiry about how music for the liturgies is chosen. For others, the clear implication is that the song or songs in question should be stricken from the rolls permanently.

For some, "those" songs refer to the hymns we sing—"Alleluia, Sing to Jesus" or "How Great Thou Art" or "O God, Our Help in Ages Past"—
"Not Catholic enough," they say.

For others, it is the recently penned praise songs—"Here I Am to Worship" or "Lord, I Lift Your Name on High" or "Mighty to Save"—that one hears on Christian radio stations and over the internet. "Too pop-like."

For another group, it is the many of the songs written by the three H's (David Haas, Marty Haugen, and Bob Hurd) and their contemporaries which cause eye-rolling and a strong desire for something that we haven't been singing for at least 20 years. "Boring!"

A quick read through the Catholic music blogs illuminates wideranging discussion on the relative merits of every style now present in the grandly multi-cultural, multigenerational entity we call the Roman Catholic Church. On these "pages" there are fierce proponents of Gregorian chant in seemingly mortal combat with those championing songs written in the past decades and even today.

At this Parish, one word that could be used to describe the musical choices made within out liturgies is "universal." Not in the sense that everyone likes them, or even that everyone can sing them the first time around, but that the body of music we call ours has something for almost everyone in this Parish.

At St. Thomas More, we sing songs penned by Christians centuries ago. We sing songs that our younger generations hear on their phones and mp3 players. We sing songs that some of us discovered as the Church explored new musical territory after the Second Vatican Council.

We sing songs accompanied by piano...and organ...and guitars...and drums...and nothing—the voice alone.

Our Parish song list, the music we sing as part of our conversation with God, is a living entity, growing and changing over time as our faith community grows and changes over time. Songs are added to the repertoire list. Older songs may be removed. Some new songs are tried a few times and discarded. Other new songs are actually "oldies" that haven't pinged our musical radar until just recently.

Each week, each year, we keep singing—one faith, one hope, one Lord, and one universal and everchanging body of song. *Those* songs. *All* those songs. For the glory of God.



Good Christian Stewards Avoid "Compassion Fatigue"

One of the spiritual maladies Christians face today is "compassion fatigue." The media inundates us with details of disasters, natural and manmade, far and wide. We can't turn on the television without being assailed by news stories of another event that cries to us for help, and our mailboxes are full of pleas from worthy charities.

We try to give out of a sense of compassion, but the needs of the world overwhelm us. Generous givers become "fatigued" and grow weary. We can't respond to all the problems and crises in the world, can we?

Of course we can't respond to the cries of a suffering world with our comparatively meager resources. If we try to respond to every crisis, to say "yes" to every loud or consistent plea for help, it is no surprise that we feel tired and discouraged. Our efforts to respond generously can become scattered and not well thought out, and sometimes our giving becomes motivated by guilt rather than compassion. Eventually, we may stop giving.

Christian stewards prayerfully discern how they are able to respond to the needs of the world. They budget their time and resources so that their response can be generous but focused, sacrificial but not overwhelming.

They begin with a prayerful commitment to their immediate family of faith. Being generous to one's faith community can go a long way toward meeting the needs of others. Their response to the diocesan annual appeal and to special collections also makes them part of a larger faith community's response to the poor and marginalized. For some, this focused generosity may be the extent of their ability to give financially. The decision to give is made prudentially and without guilt.



For some, a well thought out approach to supporting other charitable causes can be part of their stewardship planning as well. But for Christian stewards the giving does not stop there. Good stewards realize that the greatest gift they can give is the gift of prayer. Compassion, in its Latin roots, means "suffering with," and through prayer we can be drawn powerfully into solidarity with those who suffer.

The Parable of the Good Samaritan in the Gospel of St. Luke is often seen as Jesus' example of compassionate giving. The Samaritan saw the man near death lying at the side of the road not just with his eyes, but with a compassionate heart. It is the kind of compassionate heart good stewards seek to cultivate within themselves through prayer, planning and focused generosity; ready to respond, without experiencing fatigue or weariness, to the cries of the world.


