Timothy McVeigh and The Hound of Heaven*

*The Hound of Heaven, a poem by Francis Thompson (1859-1907).

October is Respect Life Month. It is a time when we are called to look at a variety of life issues. This column raises the issue of the death penalty. I first wrote this in May 2001.

Timothy, my son! Why? For what reason? How could you, with such calm and reason, kill 168 innocent people, especially infants and children? Doesn't life mean anything to you?

I know that you were trying to make a point, trying to get your perspective across to the world. I know it had to do with Waco, Texas and the Branch Davidians. But taking revenge on innocent people in Oklahoma City is not justifiable. I do not understand the logic. Two wrongs do not make a right! Killing people in order to say that killing people is wrong just doesn't make sense to me!

Timothy, I continue to love you. You are my son. I created you. I love you just as much as I love those 168 men, women, and children whose lives you cut short. They are with me now in my Reign, but they still had so much life to live! Some of them were going to make tremendous contributions to society.

You didn't know, of course, but one of the infants you killed was going to find the ultimate cure for cancer. Now it will take decades more before that happens. And another child would have created the technology to harness the sun's energy. In your

lifetime, solar energy would have ended the need for nuclear power, coal, oil, and natural gas. Now it will take several more lifetimes before that happens. And in the meantime, nuclear waste is going to cause much damage to the human race and environment.

You killed those gifts when you killed those children. You took away my rightful opportunities to work with and inspire those people on behalf of the human race that I love so much. You do not yet understand that life is my gift. Life belongs to me. It is not yours to take, for any reason.

Timothy, my son, you must be held accountable for your actions. I am compassion and love, but I also am justice. Your life spent for its entirety in prison is the price for your actions. It will never equal, in punishment and pain, what you did, but it is the most just response, from a human perspective.

You do not know this yet, Timothy, but your years in prison will be the space in which a great gift will be created and given to the human race. I am the Hound of Heaven. I am not going to give up on you. And you know what? Finally, after many years, you will open your arms wide to my love. You will experience an earth-shattering conversion. Your years in prison will be a time of great spiritual growth. Your discoveries about the gifts of my life (Continued on page 2) and love will be shared with the world through the books you will write and the speeches you will give from your prison cell. Your immense sin will result in profound virtue and gift for the human race. Believe it or not, because of your unwavering witness to the gift of life from your prison cell, you will help more and more people to appreciate life. Amazingly, your witness will help to bring an end to the legalization of abortion in the United States, because the law will no longer reflect the beliefs of most Americans.

Oh, but Timothy, my son, this will never happen, because my people are doing to you what you did to my 168 loved ones! You are being killed in order to send the message that killing is wrong. That just doesn't make sense to me.

I am being deprived of my opportunity to be the *Hound of Heaven* and to bring you into my circle of light and love. I just need more time with you. They are taking that time away from me just as you took that time away from the 168 in Oklahoma City.

How the world suffers and deprives itself of what I can do for it when anyone cuts life short.

I am so sad. I want to love all of you into peace, joy, and freedom, but you, humans, keep killing my chances to help.

Please, please, my people! Stop depriving me of my opportunities to be the *Hound of Heaven*.

Please let me be God!

Nationwide Immigration Rallies

Thousands of supporters of an immigration overhaul held rallies on Saturday, October 5 at more than 150 sites in 40 states, calling on Congress to pass a comprehensive Immigration Reform Bill. Over 3,000 people marched through the streets of San Diego at an event sponsored by many groups, including Interfaith Committee for Worker Justice and San Diego Organizing Project. In keeping with the position of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, we are seeking passage

of a bill that is comprehensive: includes an earned pathway to citizenship, protects rights of workers, keeps families together, and avoids over militarization of border communities. 

MOVING WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT

Is Liturgical Dance a Ministry?

Our article this week is written by Parishioner Evi Quinn. The inspiring and uplifting music during our liturgies here at St. Thomas More has me frequently swaying my body ever so lightly to that contagious rhythm. I feel a genuine joy in my heart and at times have to restrain my feet and hands from moving with the song. Has that



strange feeling ever surfaces in any of you? Granted, I have been exposed to liturgical celebrations like that at Masses with large attendance, but God-praising music seems to always bring an urge from my soul to my body to move.

I once visited the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem and saw the people in deep vocal prayer, moving their bodies, as to wanting to be in total communion with God in body and soul.

Likewise a Mass I attended in Hawaii, with the congregation in native attire and moving their bodies in Hawaiian dancing in sync with their beautiful music, was a deep inspiration for me.

So I ask myself many times during Mass, why do we have to stand there stiff and unmoving? My pastor in a previous parish always raised his arms when the Gloria was sung. Ever since then I feel sad that I cannot do that, because I have to fit into this calm and proper-looking mold.

But since I read a report of the big Mass, celebrated with Pope Francis and 3.5 million Catholics on World Youth Day on Copacabana Beach in Rio this summer, I have given much thought to Liturgical Dancing. The theme song was "Christ invites us: Come to me, be my friend" is not about bowing down in adoration to a distant deity, but an invitation to move with Christ as our friend.

The very many bishops there from all around the world became our example, dancing freely along with all their sisters and brothers. You can view a short video of these moments by going to www.ncronline.org/news/art-media/ wisdomdances and clicking on the arrow in the picture of the bishops. It features an article with comments from renowned dance performers, saying "there is a song in our hearts and the Holy Spirit moves us." John West, who has led the Valvermo Dancers, based at St. Andrew's Abbey in California and who frequently helps thousands at the Los Angeles Religious Education through Congress movement, acknowledges the contribution of Gloria Weyman from the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo to the liturgical dancing at the many events at World Youth Day.

This all motivated me to bring up the subject of Liturgical Dance or at least some kind of modest body movement with fitting music during our Eucharistic celebrations. I think it is worth our giving it some thought and consideration. I always try to be open to the nudgings of the Holy Spirit, which is also quite apparent at St. Thomas More, a Parish so very much alive.



Letting God Use Us: Humility as a Christian Stewardship Virtue

There was a time when my understanding of humility was actually a stumbling block to my growth as a disciple. I believed that humility required that I embrace an overly timid stance in life. The result being a struggle with the tension between remaining humble while at the same time confidently responding to the call to be a disciple and to share the hope that I have in Christ with others.

I found a renewed vision of humility in the words of C.S. Lewis, "Humility does not mean that we think less of ourselves...it simply means that we think of ourselves less." In these words I discovered what I like to call a healthy-humility. My gifts are not of my own doing; they come from and belong to God. This humble disposition should give us the God-grounded confidence, and the courage, to boldly, yet kindly, use our gifts to glorify God; that's healthy-humility.



Jesus said, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). Note that Jesus puts denying ourselves as the first requirement.

The humble person denies that their opportunities, talents, and abilities have anything to do with themselves.

The "deny self" motto is, "It's not mine and it's not about me!" Now you're ready to take up any challenge and follow Christ.

Some may think that adopting the attitude of unworthiness is being humble. So often you hear people say "I am not good enough to get involved in ministry;" this is false humility.

Sometimes we need to just get over ourselves, get out of the way, and humbly let God use us. We can do this by confidently, generously, and joyfully, sharing our gifts.

Blessed Mother Teresa said, "If you are discouraged it is a sign of pride because it shows you trust in your own power. Your selfsufficiency, your selfishness and your intellectual pride will inhibit God's coming to live in your heart because God cannot fill what is already full. It is as simple as that". Humility is so much more productive than pride.
