Parish Advent Communal Penance Service: The Sacrament of Reconciliation—

God's Unconditional Love for Us!

In recent years, a name change has taken place with the "Sacrament of Confession." We no longer call the act "Confession," but rather "Reconciliation" and/or "Penance."


This name change better reflects what happens in this celebration. We do not go to the priest just to list our sins, have them forgiven, and receive a penance; but rather, and most importantly, we come to the priest to celebrate the forgiveness of God that we experience in our lives. We come to the Sacrament with a sense of joy for what God has already done in our lives and what God continues to do—showering us with unconditional love.

The verbalization of our sins, the verbalization of the words of absolution, and the acceptance of a penance are steps in the process of celebrating God's forgiveness and unconditional love for us.

If we are open to God's love, we begin to experience the many ways in which God forgives us our sins in the daily occurrences of our lives.

When we ask forgiveness from someone we have offended, our sins are forgiven. When we accept the forgiveness of another, our sins are forgiven. Each time we talk to God in the silence of our hearts and sincerely seek forgiveness from God, our sins are forgiven. Each time we celebrate the Eucharist, we hear the words of the priest shortly

before the reception of Holy Communion— "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the lamb!"—our sins are forgiven.

So why go to the priest? We do so in order to celebrate the forgiveness of God we experience in our daily lives, to ritualize it, sacramentalize it and, as in all things, to place our lives and God's involvement in our lives within the context of the Church, the Body of Christ.

The priest "stands in" for the community. As we verbalize our sins, we are mindful that there is no such thing as a personal sin. Our sins, no matter how personal we may think them to be, affect others—"No Man Is an Island." We live in community. Our lives always touch the lives of others.

Telling our sins, hearing ours sins from our own lips, helps us to be real and to acknowledge our weakness and our dependence upon God. It is so easy to rationalize our sinfulness when we talk to ourselves "in our heads." It is an entirely different experience when we hear ourselves verbalize our sinfulness. Those sins become much more real! We become much more aware and sensitive of our responsibilities to others.

The priest "stands in" for Christ. Hearing the words of absolution, the forgiveness of God, from the lips of the priest is indeed comforting. You know how wonderful it feels when a family member or friend says, "I love you!" In the Sacrament of Reconciliation we allow God to say those words to us in and through the person of the priest.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is not something to be feared but to be celebrated with trust and confidence because of God's unconditional love for us.

Next **Sunday, December 15, at 4:00pm,** our Parish celebrates her Advent Communal Penance Service. In this Parish celebration, a number of our young people will be celebrating this Sacrament for the first time. Your presence will also be a sign of support to them.

About fifteen priest/confessors will be available for you. They will be in Church waiting for you so that through the words of absolution God will once again say to you:

"I forgive you and I love you unconditionally!"

Will you be there to hear God's words?

NFP makes use of periodic abstinence from sexual intercourse based upon the observation of the woman's natural signs of fertility, in order to space births or to limit the number of children when there is a serious reason to do so. NFP methods require that couples learn, accept, and live with the wonders of how God made them. This is essentially different from contraception." ADVENT

A Sense of the Season

Have you ever traced your family tree? Looked at old photos, read letters from grandparents, checked your family bible for births, marriages, and deaths? We use the tree symbol to help us sort out relationships and how we got here. The symbol of a tree is a vehicle to tell the story of God in the Old Testament, and to connect the Advent season with the faithfulness of God across 4,000 years of history. The branch is a biblical sign of newness out of discouragement, a way to talk about the expected messiah. It is therefore an appropriate symbol of Jesus Christ, who is the revelation of the grace and faithfulness of God in his Incarnation.

The story begins with 1 Samuel 16, in which Samuel follows God's direction and anoints David, the youngest son of Jesse. Samuel said to Jesse, "Send for him; we will not sit down to eat until he arrives here." Jesse had the young man brought to them. He was ruddy, a youth with beautiful eyes, and good looking. The LORD said: There—anoint him, for this is the one! And Isaiah 11—a prophecy of God's deliverance of the chosen people from exile and cessation of enmities: A shoot shall come out from the stock of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.

Advent reminds us that we need to be alert to the signs of the times, the signs when Jesus is truly present. Advent teaches us that we first need to be patient. We can't be alert if we are in too much of a hurry. We need to slow down, look around, and see when, where, and how Jesus is present. When we hurry we miss opportunities and moments to see and make Christ present. Advent teaches us humility. We can't be alert if we think that Jesus cannot be found in certain places and faces, like the silence of our hearts or in the faces of the lowly, the poor, the aged, or those different from us. And Advent teaches us about hope. We can't be alert if we think that this world of ours is beyond hope.

Our environment reveals the color purple for Advent, the branch at the foot of the cross, and the Advent wreath with four candles to count the weeks until we celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Thank you to our banner team led by Joe Buhlert, Rosanna Eppich, Mary Castle, Kathy Quinn, and Tony Arciero for implementing the design for our celebration. Thank you all for your stewardship of time, talent, and treasure!

On Sunday, December 22, after the 10:30am Mass we will transform our worship space for the Glory of Christmas, please join us...and again on Monday, December, 23 after Morning Mass, the Poinsettias arrive! 

Christian Stewardship

Some sixty years ago, a pastor named Robert Goodrich was assigned to a church in El Paso, Texas. He had not been there long when he noticed a letter that had arrived with several offering envelopes in it. On each envelope the words "My Tithe" were written in red. Pastor Goodrich noticed a short note which read simply: "I can't attend church any longer; I am bedfast now, but here is my tithe."

The pastor's interest was stirred. He asked someone about the sick man and learned that he lived in a small lean-to shack behind someone's house. His name was Joe Prime and he had severe tuberculosis. Fortunately for Joe, a Christian nurse volunteered to stop and see him each morning on her way to work. She prepared his food for the day and gave him whatever medical help she could provide.

Soon, Rev. Goodrich went to pay a visit to the suffering man. Upon entering the one room house, he saw only Joe, a bed, a refrigerator, a table, and a couple of chairs. Obviously, Joe had very few material goods. The pastor learned that he had a small pension of only thirty dollars a month.

What impressed the pastor most, however, was the spiritual depth of Joe Prime. Immediately, he could tell by Joe's upbeat demeanor and his expressed love for God and the church that Joe Prime was a person who knew God intimately. Joe was a man of gentle love, a man of prayer, and one who gave a tithe even of his meager income. Spiritually, he was a very healthy man.

The Christmas Gift ~

The pastor was so impressed by the ailing man that he thought he deserved a Christmas gift from the church's fund for the needy.

A few days before Christmas, Rev. Goodrich went to see Joe with \$100 in an envelope. When he entered the little shack, he handed the envelope to Joe, telling him that the church wanted him to have \$100 for Christmas. He could spend it anyway he wished, he was told

Joe's eyes lit up, the tears began streaming down his cheeks. "This is so wonderful," he said, "Now I'll be able to do something I've never been able to do before. I'd like to give \$50 to the orphanage and \$50 to the missions." And that is what was done.



One day, not long afterward, the nurse came to prepare his food and give him his medicine. Upon entering the little room, she found Joe Prime had gone to be with the Lord. Near his body, on the table, she found three or four church envelopes and on each of them the words "My Tithe" were written.




