We hear much about "coming home" for the holidays. My Christmas greetings and prayers for you and yours are contained in these words from Fr. Henri Nouwen:

Coming Home

There are two realities to which you must cling. First, God has promised that you will receive the love you have been searching for. And second, God is faithful to that promise. So stop wandering around. Instead, come home and trust that God will bring you what you need. Your whole life you have been running about, seeking the love you desire. Now it is time to end that search. Trust that God will give you that all-fulfilling love and will give it in a human way.

Before you die, God will offer you the deepest satisfaction you can desire. Just stop running and start trusting and receiving.

Home is where you are truly safe. It is where you can receive what you desire. You need human hands to hold you there so that you don't run away again. But when you come home and stay home, you will find the love that will bring rest to your heart.

Many of us have found our way home. Many of us continue to search. The Faith Community of St. Thomas More is here for all of us.

As Pastor, I pledge that I will do all that I can to ensure that our Parish will be a place and a people where you are truly safe; where you can share your story in trust; where, with other seekers, you will find human hands to hold you so that you don't run away again.

Oplatki – Christmas Wafers

The word Bethlehem means "House of Bread." The breaking of bread is a sign of charity, unity, and friendship.

Religious family traditions and customs bring the truths of Faith into the home.

One of these beautiful Christmas customs is the Christmas Wafer. A



wafer bearing a simple design commemorative of Christ's birth is given to everyone present gathered together for the Christmas meal.

With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of the present and absent members of the family, the designated family member then invites everyone to go to another person, and with a gesture of a hug, kiss, or handshake, ask forgiveness for anything they may have done to hurt that family member in the past year, and to seek God's blessings upon them in the coming year.

Each person, as the words are said, then breaks a piece off of each other's wafer and consumes the piece that has been broken off.

The spiritual lesson in this age old custom is unity of the family—the main pillar of society. The bond of unity is the Christ-like charity that should exist among the members of the family.

The members of the family are the links in the unbroken chain of One Body, One Bread, One Christ, and the One Church. The family is part of the eternal procession no matter where they are. For there is a universal longing to be always with one another, with God.

All this brings to mind clearly our charity for one another, to seek salvation together. Family customs remind us that we seek and obtain salvation with the help of others at all times.

These Christmas Wafers, and the home ritual surrounding their use, originated in Poland. This custom and ritual is also popular in Slovakia, Lithuania, Ukraine, and other parts of Catholic Eastern Europe.

Here are some things you need to know!




Christmas Eve Mass Added at 4:15pm





Christian Stewardship and Generosity


With all the giving that will be taking place this month I felt it an opportune occasion to reflect on the virtue of generosity—one of the hallmarks of Christian stewardship.

Authentic generosity is born out of the virtue of gratitude, and we in North America certainly have much for which to be grateful. In fact, we do well to always and everywhere give thanks to God, because all that we possess is his gift. When we are grateful to God we are inspired to give, not out of a sense of obligation or duty, but because giving is one way we can say thank you to God.

For generosity to be authentic it needs to be sacrificial and at the same time joyful. We need to give up something! Giving what we do not need is nice; but, it is not necessarily being generous.

Sacrifice means that we give out of our own need and not simply from what is left over. When we sacrifice it makes the generous act more joyful because by saying no to something that we need or want, we are able to say yes to the greater good. There is nothing more life-giving than knowing that someone less fortunate is benefiting from your sacrifice.

Whether you are giving your time or money, when the virtue of gratitude is behind the gift, the spirit of joy will



A simple formula for authentic generosity could be—share ten percent, save ten percent, spend eighty percent, in that order. I call it the 10-10-80 lifestyle. When we live well within our means we cultivate an acute awareness of our abundant blessings and this creates the desire, and the confidence, to share our gifts with authentic generosity.

In gratitude our generosity is then rooted in our needing to give rather than giving to a need.
