# Pastor's Column

As we end 2013 and begin 2014, I share with you thoughts from Fr. Henri Nouwen. May his words be a source of strength and direction for you as we all move along the continuum of time and space!

#### Give Your Agenda to God

You are very concerned with making the right choices about your work. You have so many options that you are constantly overwhelmed by the question, "What should I do and what should I not do?" You are asked to respond to many concrete needs. There are people to visit, people to receive, people simply to be with. There are issues that beg for attention, books it seems important to read, and works of art to be seen. But what of all this truly deserves your time?

Start by not allowing these people and issues to possess you. As long as you think that you need them to be yourself, you are not really free. Much of their urgency comes from your own need to be accepted and affirmed. You have to keep going back to the source: God's love for you.

In many ways, you still want to set your own agenda. You act as if you have to choose among many things, which all seem equally important. But you have not fully surrendered yourself to God's guidance. You keep fighting with God over who is in control.

Try to give your agenda to God. Keep saying, "Your will be done, not mine." Give every part of your heart and your time to God and let God tell you what to do, where to go, when and how to respond. God does not want you to destroy yourself.

Exhaustion, burnout, and depression are not signs that you are doing God's will. God is gentle and loving. God desires to give you a deep sense of safety in God's love. Once you have allowed yourself to experience that love fully, you will be better able to discern who you are being sent to in God's name.

It is not easy to give your agenda to God. But the more you do so, the more "clock time" becomes "God's time," and God's time is always the fullness of time.

# COME, BE MY LIGHT

#### **Scripture Themes for January**

by Patricia Datchuck Sánchez and Rafael Sánchez Alonso, from Celebration January 2014, with permission. Then God said, "Let there be light!" and there was light. God saw how good the light was. God then separated the light from the darkness. God called the light "day" and the darkness was called "night" (Gen 1:3-5).

From the beginning, light has been the supreme symbol of God and the perfect reflection of God's thought. Even the simplest person knows that light is life. Without light, nothing grows. With light we can make our way; in the darkness, we grope and stumble.

How fitting it is that this new year 2014 is ushered in with sacred texts that are shot through with myriad references to light.

On the feast of the Epiphany (Jan. 5), we celebrate the light of God that draws all the nations of the earth to Jerusalem and to God. Just as the light of a star called the magi from the East to come and worship Jesus, so does God continue to light the paths of all who seek truth, justice, peace and salvation.

Jesus' baptism, celebrated on Jan. 12, serves to identify him as God's Son and Servant who was sent to be a light for the nations. Throughout his ministry, Jesus worked diligently to dispel the darknesses that kept people from God and to lead them into the light of God's good and loving presence. In all he did, in all he said, he was the light that brought freedom, integrity and wholeness and holiness to all.

and holiness to all.

On the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (Jan. 19), the second Isaian servant song will also affirm that God purposely sent a servant to be light, not only for Israel but for all the nations. In the Johannine Gospel for that day, John the Baptizer will identify Jesus as the Son of God in whom the Spirit of God remains and shines forth.

As Ordinary Time continues, Isaiah of Jerusalem (Jan. 26) will share a vision of a newly illumined people who, although they had been shrouded in darkness, would once again dwell in the light of God. That light would be celebrated with great rejoicing. Isaiah's words will be referenced in the Matthean Gospel, which announces the presence of Jesus as the promised light of God come among us to serve and to save.

Throughout his ministry, Jesus would surround himself with others whom he commissioned to be, as he was, light for the world. "You are light," Jesus insisted. "Let your light shine for all to see."

Through their words and example, Jesus' followers brought light to bear on every aspect of the human condition. The epistolary writers, whose letters continue to feed our faith and inspire our efforts, shine with brilliance this month as they remind us of our calling to be one with all others in Christ.

In order to bring about this oneness that we are to reflect to the world, we must overcome the divisions that continue to cast shadows and detract from the witness we are to bear. One such witness, Mother Teresa, visibly described the moment she was called to be light for the poorest of the poor. On Sept. 10, 1946, she was on a train bound for her annual retreat as a Loreto Sister, and she experienced what she described as "a call within a call." hearts, she distinctly heard the invitation, "Come, be my light." Later, she referred to that day as "Inspiration Day" and considered it to be the real beginning of the Missionaries of Charity.

From that day onward, Mother Teresa strove to be the light of God's love to those who were suffering the darkness of poverty, disease, injustice, abuse and neglect. "Beyond providing care for the downtrodden and the outcasts of society, she was willing to embrace their material and spiritual suffering, their state of being unwanted, unloved, uncared for, of having no one" (Mother Teresa: Come, Be My Light: The Private Writings of the of Saint Calcutta. Brian Kolodiejchuck, Editor, Doubleday, New York: 2007).

In his biography *Something Beautiful for God*, author and journalist Malcolm Muggeridge said of Mother Teresa that she glowed with a luminosity that flowed from her relationship with God (Harper and Row, New York: 1971).

Today, as we remember such luminaries as Mother Teresa and as we celebrate Jesus, the light for all the world, we too are newly invited by him: Come, be my light! Be the light by which others can see their way and draw ever nearer to God and ever truer to the challenges of the Gospel.

We've all been there. A long day at work, rush hour traffic, and then the thought: "What am I fixing the family for dinner?" We detour to the supermarket, make a mad dash, grab whatever looks easy and filling.

Now, take a deep breath and make a stewardship resolution for the month of January, (or at least one week, and perhaps it will turn into a very good habit for 2014) with its emphasis on food and gratitude. Try to make only one visit to the grocery each week this month, with intentionality and a grateful heart.

- t Lift a prayer of gratitude before you go to the grocery store, gratitude that you are able to meet your loved ones' needs in this way. Those who work with refugee populations tell us the thing that amazes the new arrivals most is the opulence and abundance of a First World supermarket. - Be aware of your fellow shoppers, the elderly lady slowly † taking up the center of the aisle or the man struggling to control his unruly children. Say a prayer for the people you encounter. Have patience and smile generously.
- + Observe the vibrant colors in the produce department, and think of those workers near and far who have labored in the fields and the warehouses, all with the intention of supporting their own families. Say a prayer for them that they may receive wages that are fair, and that they not work under conditions that you would not tolerate for a loved one working in similar circumstances.
- Each week, plan to make a sacrifice out of your family's food + budget, and buy something for your Parish's food drive or a local pantry. Perhaps it means you purchase a less expensive version of your favorite beverage, do without the best ice cream, or plan one vegetarian, low-cost meal. Use the savings to share with the hungry.
- Be present to the cashier who rings up your order. Think of † the difficulty of a job spent standing all day, greeting customers both cheerful and surly. Thank her with a smile.
- Be grateful to the God who has given you so much to meet † your needs and to share. We are blessed!
