Happy Mother's Day

As we continue our celebration of the Feast of the Resurrection, we mark the Second Sunday of May as a national holiday, Mother's Day.

In the United States of America, Mother's Day was first suggested in the year 1872 by Julia Ward Howe, who wrote the words to the Battle Hymn of the Republic, as a day dedicated to peace. She would hold an organized Mother's Day meeting in Boston, Massachusetts every year.

It wasn't until 1907 when Anna Jarvis, from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, began a campaign to establish a national Mother's Day. Miss Jarvis persuaded her mother's Church in Grafton, West Virginia to celebrate Mother's Day on the second anniversary of her mother's death, the 2nd Sunday of May. By the next year, Mother's Day was also celebrated in Philadelphia.

She and her supporters began to write to ministers, businessmen, and politicians in their endeavor to establish a national Mother's Day. In 1910, the governor of West Virginia proclaimed the 2nd Sunday of May as Mother's Day and a year later every state celebrated it. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson made the official announcement proclaiming Mother's Day as a national holiday that was to be held each year on the 2nd Sunday of May.

But Jarvis' accomplishment soon turned bitter for her. Enraged by the commercialization of the holiday, she filed a lawsuit to stop a 1923 Mother's Day festival and was even arrested for disturbing the peace at a war mothers' convention where women sold white carnations—Jarvis' symbol for mothers—to raise money.

This is not what I intended, Jarvis said. I wanted it to be a day of sentiment, not profit!

When she died in 1948, at the age of 84, Jarvis had become a woman of great ironies. Never a mother herself, her material fortune dissipated by her efforts to stop the commercialization of the holiday she had founded. Jarvis told a reporter shortly before her death that she was sorry she had ever started Mother's Day.

She spoke these words in a nursing home where every Mother's Day her room had been filled with cards from all over the world. Today, because and despite Jarvis' efforts, many celebrations of Mother's Days are held throughout the world.

As we remember and pray for our mothers, living and deceased, I share with you this quote from Washington Irving: A father may turn his back on his child; brothers and sisters may become inveterate enemies; husbands may desert their wives and wives their husbands. But a mother's love endures through all; in good repute, in bad repute, in the face of the world's condemnation, a mother still loves on, and still hopes that her child may turn from his evil ways, and repent; still she remembers the infant smiles that once filled her bosom with rapture, the merry laugh, the joyful shout of his childhood, the opening promise of his youth; and she can never be brought to think him all unworthy.

SHOW US THE PATH OF LIFE

The Psalms of May

We often use the language of "being on a journey" during Lent, drawing on images of Jesus' journey to Calvary, walking the stations, or praying the way of the cross. Our Easter season continues the theme of journey with strong images.

The psalmist's words entreat, "Lord, you will show us the path of life" (Psalm 16:11) on May 4, setting the stage. He is confident that God guides his steps; she knows God protects her from all danger, even death. God is the safety net providing sustenance and nourishment, refuge and security. In return, we respond with gladness and rejoicing, for we truly are protected on the path to follow God. God will only show us the way that will bring us life, a path where we experience the abounding joy of being in God's very presence.

On such a path, the disciples experienced a burning in their hearts as thev found themselves accompanied by the unrecognized Lord on their way to Emmaus. Their companion was the Christ, who not only set their hearts on fire with his words and teachings but also opened their eyes, leading them back to their community to proclaim the good news. Confident that God shows us the path of life, we have the same opportunity for proclamation and witness.



The well-known responsorial sung God's protection on the path: "He



guides me in right paths for his name's sake. Even though I walk in the dark valley I fear no evil; for you are at my side. With your rod and your staff that give me courage" (Psalm 23:3-4). Like the flock, which the shepherd's staff protects from danger and wild animals, we are protected from darkness or death and have nothing to fear: "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want" (v. 1).

The Gospel tells us that the sheep recognize the shepherd's voice; they will not follow a stranger. To whose voice do we listen? We know God deep in our bones. We have been made in God's very image. We know God offers the path of righteousness and justice. We know the way we journey is under the loving-kindness (hesed) of God. We are guarded, guided, provided for, loved, and promised a dwelling place with God forever. Surely this is a path of life.

In the Gospel of May 19, Jesus asks his followers to trust and believe his promise to prepare a dwelling place for them. "I am the way and the truth and the life" (John 14:6). Once again God opens the path by being the very way to follow. The Gospels are not just the accounts of Jesus' experiences as he walked among humanity. They are the witness of of the members the early communities who followed Jesus to his death and resurrection but then had to find a new way to follow and believe in the risen Lord. The responsorial psalm for this Sunday reminds us of our need to find our way to follow and believe: "Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you" (Psalm 33:22). Why do we follow? The psalm tells us: because the Lord is upright, trustworthy, loves justice and righteousness, and fills the earth with loving-kindness. God's word is

John 10:2

true (v. 4), and in Jesus, God's word became manifest for all time.

On May 26, we hear what we must do. Jesus tells his disciples, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments" (John 14:15). But the promise of accompaniment on this journey toward loving and keeping God's commands is clear: The Spirit will be a sign of Jesus' abiding presence. We are not abandoned, alone, or orphaned, but we are loved, treasured, and have reason to hope in this promise. The sign of a new age, a new dawn, is already present if we conform our lives to God's command to love.

The psalm recounts the journey the Israelites took in their sojourn in the desert. The path opened before them as they fled slavery. The Lord changed the sea into dry land and guarded their way. In the face of such a God, all they could do was shout joyfully, sing praise, and proclaim God's mighty deeds. In the wilderness, those who were enslaved became a nation, a new creation, as they began their passage with the Lord. "Let all the earth cry out to God with joy" (Psalm 66:1).

Journeys are often funny and unexpected things. Paths can lead in many directions. The way is not always clear. But with the promise of the Spirit's abiding presence, we set forth confident and trusting because we know we are safely guarded and steadfastly loved.

Mother's Day 2014 ~ A Stewardship Reflection

May 11 is Mother's Day in the U.S., and similar holidays are celebrated in most countries. After all, what theme is more universal than the importance of motherhood?

We Catholics prize that nurturing relationship so highly that we call our church, "Holy Mother," and we venerate Mary, the mother of Jesus, for her pivotal role in the life of the savior.

Yet, Mother's Day can bring with it a plethora of emotion and memories. Any mother can attest to the difficulty and challenge of the task of parenting. And mothers come in all shapes and sizes.

- * Some mothers are birth mothers, some are adoptive.
- * Some mothers are the grandmas or aunts who raised us.
- * Some mothers left us far too soon, and no matter when they leave, they always leave us orphans.
- * Some mothers are the people we rebelled against; some mothers are the women we idolized.
- * Most often, our mothers were probably both.

It's a complex relationship, this parenting. As Christian stewards, many of us are mothers, but all of us are sons and daughters.

During May, we honor and remember not just our own moms, but Mary, the Mother of God. We see her as the great symbol of motherhood and as our role model.



At her knee, Jesus learned his prayers and the faith of his ancestors. At her hearth, Jesus grew in wisdom and grace and developed his sense of manhood and destiny.

And all mothers should resist comparing themselves to Mary. It's tough enough being a mom without setting the barrier that high. But we all should ask Mary's intercession, so that in our endeavors to be good stewards and to raise good stewards, to nurture in the faith those entrusted to us, she might come to our assistance and guide us with her motherly understanding.

And on Mother's Day, we ask Mary to bless all mothers, especially our own. —*ICSC May 2014 e-Bulletin (with permission)*




