Pastor's Column

"Every Person on Earth Plays a Central Role in the History of the World"

I share with you a "parable" taken from the book, "The Alchemist," by Paulo Coelho. It is a conversation between the alchemist and a young shepherd boy:

"In ancient Rome, at the time of Emperor Tiberius, there lived a good man who had two sons. One was in the military, and had been sent to the most distant regions of the empire. The other son was a poet, and delighted all of Rome with his beautiful verses.

One night, the father had a dream. An angel appeared to him, and told him that the words of one of his sons would be learned and repeated throughout the world for all generations to come. The father woke from his dream grateful and crying, because life was generous, and had revealed to him something any father would be proud to know.

Shortly thereafter, the father died as he tried to save a child who was about to be crushed by the wheels of a chariot. Since he had lived his entire life in a manner that was correct and fair, he went directly to heaven, where he met the angel that had appeared in his dream.

'You were always a good man', the angel said to him. 'You lived your life in a loving way, and died with dignity. I can now grant you any wish you desire.'

'Life was good to me,' the man said. 'When you appeared in my dream, I felt that all my efforts had been rewarded, because my son's poems will be read by men for generations to come. I don't want anything for myself. But any father would be proud of the fame achieved by one whom he had cared for as a child, and educated as he grew up. Sometime in the distant future, I would like to see my son's words.'

The angel touched the man's shoulder, and they were both projected far into the future. They were in an immense setting, surrounded by thousands of people speaking a strange language.

The man wept with happiness.

'I knew that my son's poems were immortal,' he said to the angel through his tears. 'Can you please tell me which of my son's poems these people are repeating?'

The angel came closer to the man, and, with tenderness, led him to a bench nearby, where they sat down.

'The verses of your son who was the poet were very popular in Rome,' the angel said. 'Everyone loved them and enjoyed them. But when the reign of Tiberius ended, his poems were forgotten. The words you're hearing now are those of your son in the military.'

The man looked at the angel in surprise.

'Your son went to serve at a distant place, and became a centurion. He was just and good. One afternoon, one of his servants fell ill, and it appeared that he would die. Your son had heard of a rabbi who was able to cure illnesses, and he rode out for days and days in search of this man. Along the way, he learned that the man he was seeking (Continued on page 2)

was the Son of God. He met others who had been cured by him, and they instructed your son in the man's teachings. And so, despite the fact that he was a Roman centurion, he converted to their faith. Shortly thereafter, he reached the place where the man he was looking for was visiting.

He told the man that one of his servants was gravely ill, and the rabbi made ready to go to his house with him. But the centurion was a man of faith, and, looking into the eyes of the rabbi, he knew that he was surely in the presence of the Son of God.'

'And this is what your son said,' the angel told the man. 'These are the words he said to the rabbi at that point, and they have never been forgotten: "My Lord, I am not worthy that you should come under my roof. But only speak a word and my servant will be healed."'

The alchemist said, 'No matter what he does, every person on earth plays a central role in the history of the world. And normally he doesn't know it.'

The boy smiled. He had never imagined that questions about life would be of such importance to a shepherd.

'Good-bye,' the alchemist said.

'Good-bye,' said the boy."

We need to always be mindful that who we are and what we do is very important and does make a difference in this world. Many times we may know nothing of it.


That is what faith is—doing the right things, because they are the right things, even though we may never see or experience the results or the consequences of our actions!

A MOVEABLE FEAST

Scripture Themes for June

Just three years before his death in 1961, Ernest Hemingway completed A Moveable Feast (Scribner, New York: 1964). In this, his last literary effort, Hemingway shared his experiences of living in Paris in the 1920s when he worked as a foreign correspondent for the Toronto Star. He and his wife Hadley celebrated Paris with all its charm and culture and enjoyed the company of other expat artists and authors like Gertrude Stein, James Joyce, Ezra Pound, Pablo Picasso, and F. Scott Fitzgerald. Although his book reads like a day-by-day account of his Paris exploits, it was written almost 40 years after the events it chronicled. Perhaps the reason for its freshness can be traced to Hemingway's own assessment of the reality that is Paris: "If you are lucky enough to have lived in Paris as a young man, then wherever you go, for the rest of your life, it stays with you, for Paris is a moveable feast."

Hemingway's idea of a moveable feast could serve us well as we reflect upon the importance of the liturgy in our lives. Each time we are gathered together by God to be nourished with the bread of the Word and the bread of the Eucharist, we are given an opportunity to take that experience and those graces with us wherever we go. Liturgy is a moveable feast that stays with us if we avail ourselves of its treasures.

This month, those treasures amount to an embarrassment of riches, with so many significant feasts in June to remind us of God's love and compassionate care. We begin the month with the eleven apostles in the Upper Room. Along with Mary, they are praying, thus setting the example for us, who continue to await the returning Jesus. June 8 (Pentecost) finds us rejoicing in the gift of the Spirit, whose presence enables all the diverse peoples of this earth to speak the same language of faith. Blessed be that Spirit, who gifts each of us with an ability to serve the needs of others. Blessed and holy be that Spirit, who brings us peace and graces us with the desire and the capacity to forgive. This same Spirit goes with us and, like a moveable feast, remains an ever-present resource for us in all we do, in all we become.

Midmonth (June 15), the praying assembly is regaled with the reality that ours is a God of three Persons: Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier. Through this community of persons, God relates to each of us as Father/ Mother, as Brother, and as Lifegiving Spirit. Each of us is called to live in a manner that will reflect well on our human family—and in a manner worthy of our divine family, loving as we are loved, forgiving as we are forgiven, all the while seeing and valuing others as God sees and values them.

Henri Nouwen suggested that in order to live this way, we keep ourselves ever aware that all our relationships are to be lived in God (Sabbatical Journey, Crossroad, New York: 1998). Most human suffering comes from broken or wounded relationships. By claiming the Holy Trinity as home for our relational lives, we are assured that each of our relationships has the capability of being healthy, holy, and wholesome. As we carry this gift with us, we are to bear worthy witness that we are God's, and God is ours.

suffered and died for us is present. Unlike other food, which is assimilated by the body, this sacred food assimilates the believer unto the body of Christ, head and members. Our "Amen" to the sacramental body of Christ commits us to a lifetime of saying and living "Amen" to all the members of the body of Christ, especially the poor and the voiceless victims of hatred and violence.

In all our efforts, we strive to be true to those who have gone before us, setting the example and laying the foundation on which we continue to build. Two of our heroes will be celebrated on June 29, Peter and Paul. Neither man was perfect, but both were fierce in their love for Christ and the church. They did not see eye to eye on every issue, but they did not give up or go their own way. Rather, they worked together, always striving to preserve the unity of the church and its mission.

Blessed as we are with such fine ancestors in the faith and rich as we are with so many of God's gifts, we carry this heritage with us wherever we go...like a moveable feast.



Christian Stewardship and Mercy

Choosing to be a disciple of Jesus Christ transforms our lives. For example, we take on a new identity, which includes that of a steward; we adopt an entirely new set of priorities; and, we are called to live a life of mercy.

The Catholic Church has blessed us with a concretely defined model for living a life of mercy in the Corporal and Spiritual Acts of Mercy. Note that they are called 'Acts'. Mercy is love and compassion in action–it requires that we take action.

Corporal Acts of Mercy are obvious expressions of stewardship: *Give Drink to the Thirsty - Clothe the Naked - Shelter the Homeless - Visit Those in Prison - Comfort the Sick - Bury the Dead.* One of the **Spiritual Acts of Mercy** is to Admonish Sinners.

In one's initial consideration of Spiritual Acts of Mercy, a person might consider the most challenging to be "Admonishing Sinners." However, this merciful act has often been referred to as the **greatest act of mercy**.

When we admonish sinners, we allow God to work through us, to set the conditions for souls to be saved because people may turn to God and receive His mercy and salvation. Admonishing others takes *courage and tact*. Good stewards do this less by their words and more by living a Christian lifestyle that others are attracted to!

"It is not by proselytizing that the Church grows, but by attraction" (Pope Francis, *Evangelii Gaudium*). The definition of admonishing actually makes the idea quite attractive–Admonish: to advise, caution, counsel against something especially in a mild and good-willed manner.



How are we being good stewards by doing this? In the Word of God and Church Teaching we find truth, and this is a gift that we can share in many ways, primarily by our actions but also with our speech. A good admonisher is always careful to choose the right words and the right moment, and most importantly it should be done in a manner that affirms the dignity of the person they are admonishing.
