Pope Francis Reveals Top 10 Secrets to Happiness

In an interview published in part in the Argentine weekly "Viva" July 27, the Pope listed his Top 10 tips for bringing greater joy to one's life.

- 1. "Live and let live." Everyone should be guided by this principle which has a similar expression in Rome with the saying, "Move forward and let others do the same"
- 2. **"Be giving of yourself to others."** People need to be open and generous toward others because if you withdraw into yourself, you run the risk of becoming egocentric. And stagnant water becomes putrid.
- 3. **"Proceed calmly in life."** The Pope used an image from an Argentine novel by Ricardo Guidaldes in which the protagonist—gaucho Don Segundo Sombra—looks back on how he lived his life.

He says that in his youth he was a stream full of rocks that he carried with him; as an adult, a rushing river; and in old age, he was still moving, but slowly, like a pool of water.

The Pope said that he likes this latter image of a pool of water—to have the ability to move with kindness and humility, a calmness in life.

4. "A healthy sense of leisure." The pleasures of art, literature, and playing together with children have been lost.

Consumerism has brought us anxiety and stress, causing people to lose a healthy culture of leisure.

Their time is swallowed up so people can't share it anyone.

Even though many parents work long hours, they must set aside time to play with their children; work schedules make it complicated, but you must do it.

Families must also turn off the TV when they sit down to eat because, even though television is useful for keeping up with the news, having it on during mealtime doesn't let you communicate with each other.

- 5. **"Sundays should be holidays."** Workers should have Sundays off because Sunday is for family.
- 6. "Find innovative ways to create dignified jobs for young people." We need to be creative with young people. If they have no opportunities they will get into drugs and be more vulnerable to suicide. It's not enough to give them food.

Dignity is given to you when you can bring food home from one's own labor.

- 7. "Respect and take care of nature." Environmental degradation is one of the biggest challenges we have. I think a question that we're not asking ourselves is: "Isn't humanity committing suicide with this indiscriminate and tyrannical use of nature?"
- 8. "Stop being negative." Needing to talk badly about others indicates low self-esteem. That means, "I feel so low that instead of picking myself up I have to cut others down." Letting go of negative things quickly is healthy.
- 9. "Don't proselytize. Respect other's beliefs." We can inspire others through witness so that one grows together in communicating.

But the worst thing of all is religious proselytism, which paralyzes. "I am talking with you in order to persuade you." No. Each person dialogues, starting with his and her own identity. The Church grows by attraction, not proselytizing.

10. "Work for Peace." We are living in a time of many wars. The call for peace must be shouted. Peace sometimes gives the impression of being quiet, but it is never quiet, peace is always proactive and dynamic.



WHY SING?

"a few words from my particular soapbox"

As all of us do, I view the world from a particular perspective, mine being formed by my background as a musician, music minister, and educator. So here are a few words from my particular soapbox.

The beginning of the school year offers us an chance to look ahead to the future—our own, and that of our children and grandchildren.

Schools have changed from when I grew up, and I imagine that you've noticed this change too. At many elementary, middle, and high school music programs, my colleagues are constantly being reminded that electives must support the core curriculum. Yes, the basics of reading, writing, and arithmetic are vitally important, but what might be missed in the discussion is that music enhances learning in all these areas. The research is very clear. Moreover, music teachers impart life-changing lessons to students that these girls and boys will not receive anywhere else.

So, why should people sing?

Music is language.

Singing enhances our understanding of words on the page. Singers bring authors' points of view to life, consequently deepening their own understanding of language through idioms, analogies, metaphors, and similes. Singers both analyze and respond to text. Music challenges singers to critique both themselves and others in oral, choral, and written presentations.

Music is science.

Music is exact, specific; and it demands exact acoustics. A singer's sheet music is a chart, a graph which indicates frequencies, intensities, volume changes, melody, and harmony all at once, and with the most exact control of time.

Music is math.

Music is rhythmically based on the subdivisions of time into fractions which must be done instantaneously and continuously, not worked out on paper, and often in multiple combinations.

Music is foreign language.

Most of music's terms are in Italian, German, or French; and the notation is certainly not English, but a highly developed kind of shorthand that uses symbols to represent ideas.

Music is history.

Music usually reflects the environment and times of its creation, and often even the country and/or racial feelings therein. Music tells us of our past and intuits our future.

Music is physical education.

Music requires fantastic coordination of fingers, hands, arms, lip, cheek, and facial muscles, in addition to extraordinary control of the diaphragm, back, stomach, and chest muscles, which must respond instantly to the sound the ear hears and the mind interprets.

Music develops insight.

In music, patterns are analyzed, similarities and differences are identified, and style and period characteristics are observed.

But mostly, music is art.

Music allows a human being to take all these dry, boring (and sometimes difficult) techniques, and use them to create emotion. This is something that science cannot duplicate: humanism, feeling, emotion—call it what you will. Young people should study music not because we expect them to major in it (though some of them will), and not because they will sing or play music all of their lives



Matthew 14:29-30

(though many of them will), and not only so they can relax and have fun—although most of them will.

Young people should study music so that they will be human, so that they will recognize beauty, be sensitive, have something to retain for enrichment forever, have more love, more compassion, more gentleness, in short—more LIFE!

Of what value will it be to our young people to make a prosperous living unless they know how to live!

As the school year begins (and the music ministry year in a couple of weeks!), consider music-making—for your children, for your grandchildren, for yourself, for your school, for your God.



Christian Stewardship

There is a Nigerian proverb that offers a great insight regarding stewardship: It is the heart that gives, the fingers just let go.
