### Soul And Business

The following thoughts were written by Gary Zukav, an American philosopher, and taken from his book, **Evolution and Business:** 

As the human species awakens to itself as a collection of immortal souls learning together, care for the environment and the earth will become a matter of the heart, the natural response of souls moving toward their full potential. By placing itself at the pinnacle of the hierarchy of life from the point of view of the five senses, and assigning maximal value to that position, humanity has created a world in which exploitation of the environment appears natural. The results of this orientation now confront us in every aspect of our environment—air, water, soil, and everything that grows.

This is the learning domain of the five senses at work: We are facing the consequences of what we have chosen in the past, and, simultaneously, being given the opportunity to choose again. Each choice that we make now determines our experiences in the future, and so on. This process is continual, we are surrounded by what we have created, and, through our responses, creating anew.

The lack of reference for all of life that allows the CEO to be more important than his driver, the physician to be more important than her receptionist, and the engineer to be more important than the welder also allows the needs of humanity to be more important than the needs of the species with which it shares the earth, and more important than the environment.

As individuals begin to recognize themselves and others as immortal souls, and as they begin to function as multisensory rather than five-sensory humans, they begin to see life wherever they look, and to revere it where they see it. This leads naturally to an attitude of care and protection for the environment that is based not only upon the realization that our physical survival depends upon it, but upon the desire of the soul to care for life, to contribute to it, and to value it in all its forms.

As businesses and employees awaken to the deep bonds of life that connect them to each other, they awaken also the deep bonds that connect all life. The environment and the world—our tiny precious planet—become important not as resources, but as the home that we as immortal souls have chosen for our learning and that now terribly needs care and healing. As the human species awakens to itself as a collection of immortal souls learning together, care for the environment and the earth will become a matter of the heart, the natural response of souls moving toward their full potential. Businesses will strive to heal the earth, rather than to exploit it, because business will no longer reflect the pursuit of external power, but the authentic power of each of the individuals within the business Pastor's Column (continued from page 1)

May these words provide an opportunity for us to reflect a bit more carefully on life, all creatures, and the created world in which we live.

### "four and a half sometimes conflicting lists"

After a couple of weeks of serious reasons to sing, here's a few with tongue firmly inserted in cheek. Enjoy!

### *Top Reasons* for Being a Soprano:

- The rest of the choir exists just to make you look good.
- Can you name an opera where an alto got the man?
- When sopranos sing in the shower, they know the tune.
- You are never going to sing the alto part by accident.
- How many world famous altos can you name?
- When the fat lady sings, she's usually singing soprano.
- When you get tired of the tune, you can sing the descant.

for Being an Alto:

#### *Top Reasons for Being a Bass:*


- You don't have to tighten your belt to reach your note.





### **Missionary Cooperative Appeal**

Fr. Antony Gaspar, a missionary from the Diocese of Dindigul in India, shared with us about their work and asked for our prayers and financial support on the weekend of August 16-17.

The Diocese of Dindigul was newly created in 2003 and serves the needs of 2.95 million people of different faiths, but Catholics are only about 133,000. So the need for evangelization work is huge. But the resources to train catechists and faith educators and construct faith formation centers, churches, mission chapels, schools, orphanages, and primary health care centers are all daunting tasks for their diocese. Currently their diocese has the responsibility to support 73 seminarians and 35 catechists who are in formation at various levels in order to meet future spiritual, pastoral, and missionary needs. In addition, they provide housing, education, and medical services to 300 poor and orphaned children in a diocesan-administrated orphanage.
