Faithful Citizens in St. Thomas More Catholic Church!

As we approach the Mid-term Elections on Tuesday, November 4, I have, in my Pastor's Columns the last few weeks, reminded everyone that we are called to be faithful citizens.

Because of our Baptism, we are called to participate in promoting the common good by taking an active role in public life. One of the main ways in which we can participate is by voting in the various elections that come before us.

As the Catholic Church, we do not endorse any specific candidates, but we do, at times, endorse and support various propositions that are presented to us.

This year, the California Catholic Bishops are endorsing Proposition 47, "The Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act."

As faithful citizens, we are called to take time to become familiar with the candidates and their various positions and we are called to become knowledgeable about the variety of propositions that are included in the ballots as well.

Then, as always, we are, after prayerful discernment, encouraged to vote our conscience which is the most sacred gift that our God has entrusted to us.

Our participation in voting is public record. In recent years, the "San Diego Organizing Project" (SDOP) in conjunction with its mother organization "People Improving Communities through Organizing" (PICO National Network) have developed software that can compare the public record of voting with the Parish Data System (PDS) of any given parish.

With a letter of mutual understanding between St. Thomas More Parish and PICO National Network that this process would be completely confidential and that the only information that would become public would be the percentage of people in our Parish who are registered and the number of people who have voted in the last five elections, we then entered into the process.

Amazingly, and our Parish should take pride in this fact, we have a phenomenally high voter registration rate. Of 2,215 members only 403 are unregistered. This is an 82% registration rate!

The San Diego County registration rate is around 60%. Oceanside's registration rate is 48.5% and Vista's registration rate is around 40%.

Here is the breakdown of voter frequency. The list shows how many people in our Parish voted and in how many elections they voted in the last five elections:

5-517 people of the list of 1,812 registered voters voted every time in the last five elections

0-168 people... (These are a mixture of newly registered young people, who will vote for the first time this year, and those who have moved into the area recently.)

Unregistered – 403 people

These results indicate that the People of St. Thomas More Parish are faithful citizens and we take our Baptismal Call to engage in public life for the common good seriously!

FROM ONE YEAR TO THE NEXT, GOD IS

scripture themes for November

When the late newscaster Walter Cronkite ended his nightly report, he'd say, "And that's the way it is." Those of us old enough to remember Jimmy Durante will recall that he ended every program with "Good night, Mrs. Calabash, wherever you are." Comedian Carol Burnett would say, "Goodnight" and tug her left ear as a message to her grandmother. "See you on the radio" was the classic signoff of journalist Charles Osgood.

Each year at this time, we experience a signoff of sorts, as one liturgical year comes to an end and another begins. But we do not offer a signature goodbye. We rejoice in the fact that the God who was with us last year will be with us in the next—and forever.

On the feast of All Souls (Nov. 2), the sacred texts are both sober and celebratory. We are reminded of our mortality and that one day we will be called to say goodbye to life as we know it in order to know the peace and joy of everlasting life with God (Wisdom, John). Paul (Romans) will assure us that these forever joys are possible because of the love of God poured out for us in Jesus, who died for us while we were still sinners.

On the feast of St. John Lateran on Nov. 9, we hear Ezekiel encouraging his exiled contemporaries with the news that even though their beloved Jerusalem temple has been destroyed, a heavenly temple awaits them. With abundant life-giving water flowing everywhere and fruit trees that can be harvested every month, God's people will be well provided for when they are called home to God.

John's Gospel will feature Jesus, consumed by zeal for God's holy place, turning away the sellers and moneychangers. The evangelist used that occasion to predict the death of Jesus and his resurrection: "Destroy

this temple and in three days I will raise it up." Paul (1 Cor) brings home the message of this feast with the question "Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit dwells in you"? How might the realization of this truth influence the way we treat ourselves and one another? We are holy people—holy places where others should be able to encounter God. By grace, God is building us upon the same foundation of Jesus Christ. All our words and works should reflect our belonging.

As we draw nearer to the end of this liturgical year, Paul will remind us on Nov. 16 that the end will come upon us like a thief in the night (1 Thess). At that time, there will be a reckoning: We will be called to account for the way we have used the gifts each of us has received from God. In the parable of the talents, Matthew will speak the words that we so long to hear: "Well done, my good and faithful servant....Come share your master's joy!" While we do not earn the gift of salvation, nor can we merit it, we are nevertheless for responsible being active participants in the process of being saved. This process does not require tremendous or dramatic feats. Rather, it is the simple and pure, quiet and often unwitnessed acts of love that best prepare us for God's gifts. In the figure of the worthy wife, the authors of Proverbs will point the way. With loving hands and heart, she cared for those entrusted to her by God. Yet she was also attentive to the poor and needy as she extended herself to help them. Simple acts, done worthily and well—these prepare believers for the reckoning that is to come.

Preparation for meeting the Lord in glory is also featured on Nov. 23, the feast of Christ the King. In the Gospel, unique to Matthew, the scene is one of judgment. The risen Jesus announces that those who would

meet him and share eternity with him must first have met him in the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the ill, and the imprisoned. Having recognized Jesus' face and presence in these poor ones, believers are also called upon to minister to their needs. To ignore and neglect those with whom Jesus chose to identify is tantamount to a forfeiture of eternity. While we still have time, let us seek his face and serve him in God's least ones.

With November's last Sunday, Advent begins. I am reminded of something Henri Nouwen shared in his book Gracias: A Latin American Journal (Orbis Books, Maryknoll, N.Y.: 2009). Nouwen said he kept and shared this journal of his sixmonth sojourn in Peru and Bolivia in an effort to discern God's voice and find the way to be obedient to that voice. When he was in Bolivia, he was touched by a sermon of Oscar Uzin, who said of the Advent season, "Be alert, be alert so that you will recognize your Lord in your husband, your wife, your parents, your children, your friends, your teachers, but also in all that you read in the daily papers. The Lord is coming, always coming. Be alert to his coming. When you have ears to hear and eyes to see, you will recognize him at any moment of your life.

Life is Advent, life is recognizing the coming of the Lord." As we move from one liturgical year into the next, let us, like our brother Henri, listen carefully and obey the voice of God.
