#### Celebrating and Living the Paschal Mystery

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion and begin Holy Week. This week is the most sacred and the most important week of our liturgical year.

Through a continuous series of liturgies, we celebrate the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus and the union of our daily sufferings, deaths, and resurrections to his. In this union we find the heart and foundation of our faith as Christians—the Paschal Mystery.

In the Paschal Mystery, we are mindful that the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus continues to bring salvation to the world in and through our lives, through the willful union of our lives to his.

As we begin this Holy Week, I recommend and encourage you to read this book in the near future: *The Jesus I Never Knew* by Philip Yancey. This book will give you a fresh perspective on Jesus and make you think of him in ways that will be new to you.

All of the thoughts that follow are taken from Yancey's book and specifically from Chapter 10, *Death: The Final Week*.

Not only is the resurrection central to our faith, but also the death of Jesus is central! Death is not just the way leading to resurrection, but the death of Jesus is a focal point for our faith in and of itself. Our God allowed God to be killed. We have a God who, at a certain point in our human, planet Earth history, died! What is the meaning of this in terms of our faith?

Yancey says, "Of the biographies I have read, few devote more than ten percent of their pages to the subject's death—including biographies of men like Martin Luther King Jr. and Mahatma Gandhi, who died violent and politically significant deaths. The Gospels, though, devote nearly a third of their length to the climactic last week of Jesus' life. Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John saw death as the central mystery of Jesus."

What does this centrality of the death of Jesus teach us?

"In a sense, the paired thieves present the choice that all history has had to decide about the cross.

Do we look at Jesus' powerlessness as an example of God's impotence or as a proof of God's love?

The Romans, bred on power deities like Jupiter, could recognize little godlikeness in a crumpled corpse hanging on a tree.

Devout Jews, bred on stories of a power Jehovah, saw little to be admired in this god who died in weakness and in shame.

The cross redefines God as One who was willing to relinquish power for the sake of love.

Jesus became, in Dorothy Solle's phrase, 'God's unilateral disarmament.'

Power, no matter how well intentioned, tends to cause suffering. Love, being vulnerable, absorbs it. In a point of convergence on a hill called Calvary, God renounced the one for the sake of the other."

The challenge of faith for us, in our day, is to follow the example of Jesus who in his humanity and divinity has shown us the way to eradicate evil from our world.

"M. Scott Peck writes, 'I cannot be anymore specific about the methodology of love than to quote these words of an old priest who spent many years in the battle: "There are dozens of ways to deal with evil and several ways to conquer it. All of them are facets of the truth that the only way to conquer evil is to let it be smothered within a willing, living human being. When it is absorbed there like blood in a sponge or a spear into one's heart, it loses its power and goes no further."

The healing of evil—scientifically or otherwise—can be accomplished only by the love of individuals. A willing sacrifice is required...I do not know how this occurs. But I know that it does.""

May these reflections help us to enter into the spirit of Holy Week!

I encourage you to celebrate Jesus, not only on Easter Sunday, but join your Parish Family and participate in all the Triduum celebrations-Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday.

These are our most sacred days. Take seriously the responsibility to make them holy and special for you and your family.



#### **Christian Stewardship Almsgiving Covers Many Things**

The act of giving can be compared with throwing a stone into the water. The stone splashes into the water and sinks . . . a thing done. Yet, the effect of that single act ripples out in circles around us, touching first one person and then another.

The need to share love and laughter and human fellowship is within all of us. We communicate our love with acts of giving and sharing. It is a simple matter to do this within the circle of family and friends, and we do it as a matter of course. We don't often forget a birthday or anniversary or Christmas present.

But it is more difficult to give our time, our energy, and our possessions beyond this immediate circle. We live in a world of need. Sometimes we can show our concern directly to those who have needed us in our communities.

But some needs are too great or too complex or are in areas beyond our reach for any one person to meet. And so, we give some of our time, efforts, and money to the voluntary charitable organizations whose work interests us.

But always a question nags at us. How much should we give? Are we giving to the right things? Should we be giving more to some and less to others? These are good questions that any good steward must answer.

But, there is nothing uniquely Christian in answering these questions. Giving is Christian's hang-up when we ask, can we, through our giving, say God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that all men may know what it means to be truly human? Can we affirm, through our giving, that if any person be in Christ, he or she is recreated?



The nationally known liturgist, Gabe Huck, writes: "Almsgiving is the deeds we can do to remake the world, or, rather to restore it. It has to do with time and space, with money and goods. It is about the wholeness of things and people, the right relationship of those who dwell on earth to the earth and to each other. It aims to right the wrong distribution caused by greed or power or whatever else. It ignores neither the world nor what is in front of one's face."

# The Case

# Restorative Justice and Detention Ministry

Jesus said, "I was in prison and you visited me. What you did for the least of these you did for me."

Restorative Justice focuses on harms committed and making the offender accountable to the victim and the community, and to bring about transformation of all parties.

There are many components including Detention Ministry, Victim/Offender Dialogue, reentry practices, victim support, and support for the families of the incarcerated. These are corporal works of mercy; ministries of presence, compassion, hope, and love. Compassion, hope, and love flow out of our presence – by being there for them.

We impact the lives of those imprisoned in 27 different prisons, jails, and detention facilities, housing over 25,000 inmates. This includes eight sheriff's jails, five juvenile detention facilities, three state prisons, and four federal detention facilities. Many of these inmates are hungry to deepen their relationship with God.


We merely become the conduits, or channels, of the Holy Spirit.

Our diocese supports twelve chaplains to say Mass, administer the sacraments, and visit inmates individually. We provide assistance to 300 Catholic volunteers to conduct scripture, prayer, and discussion services. More than 60% of our volunteers have never volunteered for anything else in the Church.

This ministry of compassion, hope, and love is possible thanks to the support of the Annual Catholic Appeal. This is our special opportunity to transform lives on a person-to-person level.

# Youth Ministry



The Office for Youth Ministry serves parishes in our diocese so that they may cultivate the gifts and talents of young people, and empower them to be leaders in the Church and community. One of the ways in which we do this is through Camp Emmaus. This five-day leadership camp is intergenerational, community oriented, and led by the talents of the young people that participate. Our goal is to give these young leaders an opportunity to lead in a supportive community of faith, so that they may be able to go back to their parishes and serve effectively. One parish youth ministry coordinator said, "Camp Emmaus has been a wonderful tool for my parish's youth leaders. They learn how to strengthen their leadership skills and most of all our teens and young adults leave the camp more confident and motivated to share their faith with others."

Vibrant and comprehensive youth ministry programs help teens practice and experience their faith in a personal and meaningful way. A young person needs to be mentored into a parish community by caring and supporting adults. Youth ministers lead this effort through their work and dedication. The Office for Youth Ministry supports the formation and certification of Coordinators of Youth Ministry through programs and workshops in the areas of Catechesis, Social Justice, Prayer and Worship, Pastoral Care, and the Fundamental Principles of Ministry with Young People.

Your contribution to the Annual Appeal will ensure that efforts like these will continue to serve our Young Church. We are forming a new generation of leaders to serve the Church in the Diocese of San Diego.

We're doing it again! This Easter, join us to create a lamb made of butter for your Easter table. Jesus is our Pascal Lamb, and using your lamb as a centerpiece reminds us of this.

Bring: (1) two sticks of VERY COLD butter, (2) a small cooler to keep the butter cold, (3) a sharp paring knife, (4) a small plate for your lamb to sit on, and (5) if you have one, a garlic press. Parsley makes a great bed for your lamb to sit on!

In earlier times, meat and dairy products were excluded from the daily diet during the entire season of the Great Fast (Lent).

As the end of the strict fast approached, the people showed their joy and gratitude by taking their food to church to be blessed and eaten after the Easter Liturgy.



As we celebrate the Pasch, a feast of new life, we bless the food sustaining our physical life. Thus this custom has its meaning even today and, so we are encouraged to observe this ritual for our time.

The foods traditionally blessed for Easter can be reduced to three categories:

- 1. Easter bread:
- 2. Meat products, like ham, stuffed veal, suckling pig or lamb, sausage, bacon;
- 3. Dairy products, like butter, cheese, eggs (including your butter lamb!).

We will celebrate a Blessing of Easter Foods this year on Holy Saturday, April 4, at 11:00am on the lower level of the Parish Center.

Everyone is invited to come with an "Easter Basket of Food" and to partake in this ancient tradition and blessing.
