Next weekend, May 30-31, the Parish will celebrate the sacrament of First Eucharist (Communion) at all three Masses. Check your Eucharist IQ with these questions and answers from *YouCat*, the Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church (208, 210, 211).

WHAT IS HOLY EUCHARIST?

Holy Eucharist is the Sacrament in which Jesus Christ gives his Body and Blood—himself—for us, so that we too might give ourselves to him in love and be united with him in Holy Communion. In this way we are joined with the one Body of Christ, the Church.

After Baptism and Confirmation, the Eucharist is the third sacrament of initiation of the Catholic Church. The Eucharist is the mysterious center of all these sacraments, because the historic sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross is made present during the words of consecration in a hidden, unbloody manner. Thus the celebration of the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life" (Second Vatican Council, Lumen gentium, 11). Everything aims at this; besides this there is nothing greater that one could attain. When we eat the broken Bread, we unite ourselves with the love of Jesus, who gave his body for us on the wood of the Cross; when we drink from the chalice, we unite ourselves with him who even poured out his blood out of love for us. We did not invent this ritual. Jesus himself celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples and therein anticipated his death; he gave himself to his disciples under the signs of bread and wine and commanded them from then on, even after his death, to celebrate "Do the Eucharist. this in

How did Christ institute the Eucharist?

"For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, 'This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way also the chalice, after supper, saying, 'This chalice is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me''' (1 Cor 11:23-25).



Christian Stewardship ~ Come Holy Spirit!

A challenge for the Christian steward is accepting, and even rejoicing in, the fact that our commitment to faith is often a counter-cultural one. Perhaps this is nowhere more striking than in the quick cultural "end" of the Easter season, and our own belief that Easter has now led us through May to the great feast of Pentecost on May 24.

We see this discordance in many Christian celebrations adapted by the popular, commercial culture. While we are still enjoying the season of Christmas and looking forward to Epiphany, many Americans have taken the Christmas tree to the recycling center and moved on to thoughts of Valentine's Day. During the sacrificial early days of Lent, there's something jarring about all those pastel Easter eggs and bunnies appearing in stores.

Christian stewards feel no surprise that as we break our Easter fast and begin our meditation on the Resurrection, we find that the stores have tucked those chocolate bunnies away on discount shelves, and we're off to the next commercially competitive venture.

Today, as the great feast of Pentecost beckons us, we realize that the society around us gives this occasion hardly a passing nod. Apparently, there's no money to be made from Pentecost, the day the Holy Spirit came among the apostles and imbued in them the courage to be true followers of Christ. **Courage, strength, faith, the Spirit—these are hard to market in the public square, aren't they?** Their willingness to live and to ultimately



die as martyrs for Christ, as the apostles did, these are things that are hard to package in bright paper. They don't fit well in the greeting card aisle.

As we now move past the Easter season and celebrate Pentecost (*my favorite*), it is a perfect time to examine our own willingness to step outside the culture in our own celebration of great Christian feast days.

Keep the reminders of the Resurrection around you. Let your family prayer reflect the marvels of the season. Help your children to be aware of the liturgical calendar. Explain the meaning of the changing colors of the priests' vestments. Dress in red for Pentecost Sunday. Most importantly, educate yourself and your family on how powerful it is to understand and celebrate the great markers and mysteries of our shared faith experience.
