"More Guns" Is Not the Answer

After the murder of our nine brothers and sisters in Christ in their Church in Charleston, South Carolina, Charles L. Cotton a Board Member of the National Rifle Association (NRA) blamed the Pastor for the tragedy. The Pastor was one of the nine who were murdered. The Pastor is also a State Legislator in South Carolina. Recently he voted against a law that would allow guns to be brought into Churches. This NRA Board Member's position was that if the Pastor would have voted for guns in Churches, there would have been guns present that day, and the murders could have been avoided. To me this is a very untenable position, and one that lacked any human compassion in light of the situation.

I am sharing with you the column I wrote after the Sandy Hook tragedy several years ago. We need responsible gun control. We need responsible gun owners to come forward and support responsible gun control. More guns is not the answer!

Recently a number of people have asked my thoughts about the Sandy Hook Elementary School tragedy in Newtown, Connecticut, and the debate regarding "gun control." I share with you my personal thoughts. I hope what I say can be of some assistance in your conversations with others about this issue.

The NRA's response to this tragedy makes absolutely no sense to me.

Its response says this to me: If there were a shooting within the Church of St. Thomas More and a number of people were killed during a Sunday Mass, then the NRA's response to us would be that we should make sure that there are armed security guards on the parking lot, that a number of our hospitality ministers would also need to be trained to carry and use guns, and finally, the priest celebrating Mass would need to be sure that he too is packing a gun under his vestments.

Is this what we would want to see? Obviously, this is not what I would want to see. "More guns" is not the answer.

From my perspective, there is good legislation that could go forth to address gun violence in our society: universal background checks, a ban on assault weapons with high-capacity clips, and a greater attention to mental health issues in our society.

Recently on Facebook, there were a number of people using this analogy, and we have heard it before: "Guns do not kill people. People with guns kill people." But to make their point, they push the analogy further: "Cars do not kill people. People driving cars kill people. So should we ban all cars?"

Obviously, all cars should not be banned. That is ridiculous! But this analogy limps badly.

First of all, no one is talking about banning all guns—just certain guns that kill like the gun responsible for the killings that took place in Newtown, Connecticut.

Why is it anti-American or anti-Second Amendment to ban assault-style weapons, weapons that are used in warfare as in Iraq or Afghanistan?

We have banned armored assault vehicles (tanks) like the ones used in Iraq or Afghanistan from the streets of our cities, states, and our country. Why? We do so because they are dangerous.

Is this anti-American? Are our rights being violated or taken away, because we cannot drive the kind of vehicle we would like? It would give better protection while driving, would it not?

Assault weapons as well as assault vehicles belong in warfare, not in our homes, schools, churches, temples, and mosques, and not on the streets of our country.

First-responders are only now beginning to publicly share what they saw in the classrooms of Sandy Hook Elementary. They were never prepared to see the carnage before their eyes, the ways in which those innocent children were so mutilated and torn apart.

Do we really need such weapons in order to feel secure in maintaining our Second Amendment Rights? I think not.

If you saw the movie, "Lincoln," there is a scene in which one man is trying to shoot and kill another man. The scene almost becomes hilarious, because he fires and misses, then he has to "clean the barrel of his shotgun, and then he has to reload with another bullet." In the meantime, his target has high-tailed it and is down the street. He had time to flee.

I tend to think that many people still think about these kinds of weapons when we are talking about gun control. We are not familiar with or aware of the killing machines now available to the average person and household.

I am not anti-Second Amendment. I grew up in a family of hunter—my father and my four brothers. I grew up in a house with rifles for deer hunting. They enjoyed the hunting.

"More guns" is not the answer!

THEOPNEUSTOS, THE INSPIRED WORD

Among his spiritual writings, Danish philosopher Søren Kierkegaard shared a reflection about birds (*Provocations*, Plough Pub. House, Farmington, Pa: 1999). There is a kind of understanding, he said, between tame geese and wild geese. When a flock of wild geese is heard overhead, tame geese are instantly aware of it; they beat their wings, cry out and fly awkwardly along the ground. Then it is over.

But once, Kierkegaard wrote, a wild goose migrating southward decided that it would try to win over the tame geese so they would join the flight and be saved from the wretched mediocrity of a life waddling around on earth.

In a sense, Christianity employs a process similar to what that wild goose did. Christianity teaches conversion, teaches us what we can become in life if we only give ourselves over to God, embrace grace, and remain open to the Spirit, who is ever calling us upward and outward. Christianity abhors mediocrity. It urges courage upon those who witness to God in a world so much in need of God's presence and care.

And who are the "wild geese" among us, calling us to transformation? Aren't they the prophets? Aren't they women and men called by God and graced by the Spirit to speak God's word to their contemporaries during the historical circumstances in which they find themselves? In so doing, the prophets among us affirm that the Word of God is relevant to every human situation.

Prophets from both Testaments garner our attention this month in order to keep us mindful of God's truth and urge us to be transformed daily by that truth. Ezekiel (July 5), Amos (July 12), Jeremiah (July 19),

and Elisha (July 26), along with Paul and, of course, Jesus, were all speaking to their respective contemporaries, yet their works have the capacity to continue to speak to us because they are theopneustos, "God-breathed" or "inspired." This theopneustos, was mentioned in scripture in the second letter to Timothy (3:16-17): "All Scripture is inspired by God and for profitable training righteousness that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." The prophets' inspired words became the catalyst for the transformation of those who heard and heeded them, as well as the norm by which they were challenged to further growth.

The word of God, as spoken by the prophets, was continuously evolving and adjusting to ever-changing circumstances. For example, initially Ezekiel's (July 5) prophetic message was a harsh one, warning the people that severe consequences would befall them if they did not repent and reform their lives. Then, when those consequences were realized in the form of the exile in Babylon, Ezekiel's message shifted to one of hope in God, who could effect a new beginning for the exiles.

A prophet's life was not always an easy one, and his or her message was not always welcome. This is affirmed in the experiences of Amos (July 12) and Paul (July 5) and in Jesus himself (July 5 and 12). Amos was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. A man from the rural south, he was called by God to speak truth to the religious authorities of the urban north. He was rebuffed: and yet, because the word of God had to be spoken, he persevered in preaching justice where there was none. His words about the sinful gap between rich and poor and about

social reform continue to challenge the authenticity of the church's preferential option for the poor.

Paul (July 5) begged God to relieve him of something he called a "thorn in the flesh." We cannot know what that was, however much we speculate, but God's response to Paul is appropriate to all who suffer the burdens of the prophetic and preaching ministries: "My grace is sufficient for you!" Even Jesus (July 5) knew those burdens and admitted as much: "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place, among his own kin, in his own house." Prophesying will hardly ever result in popularity. May we be careful not to ignore the prophets who speak among us, regardless of how familiar or unlikely they may seem in our eyes. doubt encountering such attitudes of rejection caused Jesus to go off frequently to a quiet place and rest awhile with God (July 19).

July will come to an end with the complementary narratives about Elisha feeding a hundred people with 20 barley loaves and Jesus feeding the hungry multitudes with five barley loaves and two fish. They nurtured bodies as well as spirits. The bread of the prophet's word is food indeed. Let us not turn a deaf ear to the authentic prophets among us. Instead, let us hungrily hear their message, accept its truth and challenges, and be transformed.



Bishop Robert W. McElroy's Statement on the Supreme Court of the United States Ruling on Same Sex Marriage

Today the United States Supreme Court ruled that the historic definition of marriage as a relationship between one man and one woman is unconstitutional.

The Catholic Church, along with other faith traditions, teaches that the nature of marriage and the family cannot be redefined by society, as God is the author of marriage and its corresponding gift of co-creating human life. The legal recognition of marriage is not only about personal commitment but also about the social commitment that husband and wife make to the well-being of their children. It is for this reason that it is important for government to give a unique status to marriage between one man and one woman both in law and in public policy.

The Catholic community of San Diego and Imperial counties will continue to honor and embody the uniqueness of marriage between one man and one woman as a gift from God--in our teaching, our sacramental life and our witness to the world. We will do so in a manner which profoundly respects at every moment the loving and familial relationships which enrich the lives of so many gay men and women who are our sons and daughters, our sisters and brothers, and ultimately our fellow pilgrims on this earthly journey of life. And commanded by the Gospel of Jesus Christ we will continue to reach out to families of every kind who are encountering poverty, addictions, violence, emotional stress or the threat of deportation, and to attempt to bring them faith and care, service and solidarity.
