#### For All That Has Been—Thank You! For All That Will Be—Yes!

July 1 was my 12th anniversary as the Pastor of St. Thomas More Catholic Church. I share with you, once again, my first Pastor's Column dated July 6, 2003.

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

July 5, 2015

It is my desire each year to give you my first Pastor's Column in which I shared with you the words of Archbishop Daniel Pilarczyk, as he talks about the meaning and purpose of a parish. His words have become over the years of my ministry, in the various parishes in which I have served, my pastoral motivation and direction. May our yearly reflection upon these words help all of us in deepening our relationship with the Lord Jesus.

Over these twelve years, I have thanked God constantly for your overwhelming positive response in your willingness to work together as we continue to witness to the Kingdom of God and move into our future.

In my forty years of ministry, I have been in many faith-filled parishes, but I must admit that St. Thomas More has strengthened me the most in my pastoral responsibilities. This Parish helps me so much to be a faithful pastor!

"As I begin my journey with the Church of St. Thomas More and become a member of this Faith Community, I share with you the words of The Most Reverend Daniel Pilarczyk, the now retired, former Archbishop of Cincinnati, taken from his book, *The Parish: Where God's People Live*:

A parish, then, is a moment, a chapter in God's love affair with us human beings. And being a member of a parish does not mean just "belonging to something," but rather, being involved in a loving association with God in Christ Jesus and with each other in Him, and with all the world for Him.

Parish is therefore concerned with relationships—our relationship with Christ and our relationship with each other in Him.

Consequently, the main participant in every parish is the Lord Himself. It is He around whom the people gather in worship. It is He whose word the parishioners hear there. It is His work the parishioners carry out in the context of the parish's life and in their activity in the world, activity for which they are enlightened and strengthened in the parish.

It is for the strengthening and expression of His Body, the Church, that the parishioners build buildings and carry out programs.

It is in response to His love that the parish engages in care for the poor and in outreach to those who have forgotten Christ or have never known Him.

I now have the privilege of joining you, the Church of St. Thomas More, on its Faith Journey, its Love Affair with God, in and through the Lord Jesus Christ. I pray that, because our paths now become one, we will continue to deepen our relationship with the Lord Jesus, and that we will continue to center our lives more completely on Him.

As I begin my ministry as your Pastor, I commit all of my time, talent, treasure, and energy in building on the strong foundation that has already been set, that is, the ongoing creation of a climate and an environment of hospitality that says: 'The Church of St. Thomas More is holy ground. The Church of St. Thomas More is a people and a place where God is revered, and all God's People are treated with dignity, respect, and offered the opportunity to be challenged by the Gospel. The Church of St. Thomas More is the home of brothers and sisters in Christ who take time to support each other in deepening their relationship with Jesus the Christ for the purpose of making our world a better and safer place for all people.'

I promise all of you that I will do all that I can, during this time of transition, that as a Faith Community, we do not experience 'a loss of momentum,' but rather, that we experience a 'surge of energy.'

As we pilgrimage through life, as individuals and as a community of Faith, our book of Life is being written. Some chapters we write. Other chapters are written for us. Chapters end. New chapters begin. Today we begin a new chapter in the Faith Life of the Church of St. Thomas More. With me, I ask that you 'look forward to opportunities for growth that change affords.'

As we begin to walk together, may our prayer be: 'For all that has been—Thank You. For all that will be—Yes!''

#### Vocations

What to do if you think you have a calling to be a priest, religious, or deacon:

- 1. Pray over it. Ask God for guidance.
- 2. Pray over it. Listen for God's response. (Prayer is always the best way to determine any vocation...not just those in the Church.)
- 3. Ask questions. Find out what you will be getting into if you answer such a calling. The priests, nuns, and deacons in the Parish will always be happy to discuss your calling with you...so will the Office of Vocations at the Diocese...so will members of various orders.
- 4. Discuss it with family members or close friends whose opinions you value. They may have insights or questions that you have not thought of.
- 5. Do not be afraid to investigate such a calling.

#### Sr. Maureen Visits Rome!

This past month, at the invitation of Cardinal Oscar Rodriquez, a top advisor to Pope Francis, a delegation of 15 people from PICO traveled to Rome to meet individually with 15 cardinals, bishops and other top advisors. I was honored to be part of that delegation.

We carried a message of support for the Pope's visit to the United States and urged that he speak to the issues we believe are of deep concern to our American way of life: an economy of exclusion, immigration issues, mass incarceration, and racism. Those with whom we met were very impressed with the work of PICO, a National, interfaith organization of community organizing, founded by Fr. John Bowman, S.J. in 1972. PICO exists in 65 dioceses and other religious entities throughout the United States, representing over one million families.

As a follow up to this delegation, PICO organizers are planning multiple events not only to celebrate the visit of Pope Francis but to reflect on his message and to help us develop ways to implement that message in our daily lives and our local communities.

Such a declaration is a finding by a church tribunal, or court, that no valid marriage bond was formed because the requirements for valid consent were not met at the time of the wedding. More than 25 volunteer lay ministers are needed to help at every Mass we celebrate on the upper level, not counting the musicians, who number from two to as many as 50. All these faithful people assist the priest and deacon, and indeed the entire community, to ensure that our celebrations are worthy of the God to whom we offer our praise and prayers.

In January, the US Conference of Catholic Bishop's Office of Divine Worship distributed a discussion of the critical role these lay ministers play in our celebrations. Over the next weeks, I intend to share these thoughts from the bishops so that together we might better understand the importance of lay participation in our celebrations.

The Role of Lay Ministers in the Liturgical Life of the Church

"Servers, [readers], commentators, and members of the choir...exercise a genuine liturgical function. They ought, therefore, to discharge their office with the sincere piety and decorum demanded by so exalted a ministry and rightly expected of God's by them people. Consequently, they must all be deeply imbued with the spirit of the liturgy, each in his own measure, and they must be trained to perform their functions in a correct and orderly manner" (Sacrosanctum Concilium, no. 29). While all members of the faithful truly participate in the liturgy in an important variety of ways, including participation responses, in acclamations. dialogues, and litanies, by attentive listening to the

Liturgy of the Word and the presidential prayers, and by joining oneself to the gathered community through song, processions, and common posture and gesture, certain lay men and women fulfill necessary roles to ensure its orderly running.

#### Altar Servers and Readers

In the absence of instituted acolytes and/or lectors, lay men and women may take on their functions as altar servers and readers. Altar servers assist the priest and deacon; they "carry the cross, the candles, the thurible, the bread, the wine, and the water," and some may even be deputed as extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion (General Instruction of the Roman Missal [GIRM], no. 100). Likewise, lay readers who are "truly suited...and carefully prepared" proclaim the word of God to the gathered assembly (GIRM, no. 101). Readers are encouraged to continually meditate on Sacred Scripture, so that their faithful proclamation of the readings at Mass will in turn inspire the faithful to turn to God through his word.

#### Psalmist

Within the music ministry of a parish, a psalmist is the "cantor of the psalm" that occurs after the First Reading. He or she must carefully meditate on the Psalms and be able them "with to sing clarity, conviction, and sensitivity to the text, the musical setting, and those who are listening." When necessary, the psalmist may also sing the Gospel acclamation and verse (Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship [STL], nos. 34-35; see GIRM, no. 102).

cantor who also assumes the duties of the psalmist. Nonetheless, it may be useful for parish choirs to have one of its members devote himself or herself to contemplating the literary, theological, and musical aspects of the Psalms, in order to truly bring out the beauty of those texts to the gathered faithful at Mass. The psalmist may also be useful other liturgical at celebrations, including the Liturgy of the Hours or other rites.

## Background Information to Help Process Homosexuality and Marriage Equality in Light of the SCOTUS Ruling

In this Pastor's Column today, I share some information that I hope will be helpful as you process the US Supreme Court's recent decision on Marriage Equality.


As you read through these documents, please note the constant challenge to which we are called is to eliminate all forms of discrimination in regard to gay men and women and to welcome them into the circles of our families, friends, and churches.

For those who know people in the LGBT community, be it members of our families, or our friends, or those with whom we work, the challenge not to discriminate and call to love is much easier.

Unfortunately, many Catholics who do not know a gay man or woman, find it much easier to judge, and to discriminate.

I call to your attention the last document, which was written by Fr. James Martin, S.J., Editor at Large of *America* magazine. His views echo mine. Where does it all begin? It begins by getting to know gay men and women, and to welcome them into the life of our family, our neighborhood, and our Church, and to love them as we love all others.

From the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, published in 1994:

**2357** Homosexuality refers to relations between men or between women who experience an exclusive or predominant sexual attraction toward persons of the same sex. It

has taken a great variety of forms through the centuries and in different cultures. Its psychological genesis remains largely unexplained. Basing itself on Sacred Scripture, which presents homosexual acts as acts of grave depravity, tradition has always declared that "homosexual acts are intrinsically disordered." They are contrary to the natural law. They close the sexual act to the gift of life. They do not proceed from a genuine affective and sexual complementary. Under no circumstances can they be approved.

**2358** The number of men and women who have deep-seated homosexual tendencies is not negligible. They do not choose their homosexual condition, for most of them it is a trial. They must be accepted with respect, compassion, and sensitivity. Every sign of unjust discrimination in their regard must be avoided. These persons are called to fulfill God's will in their lives, and, if they are Christians, to unite to the sacrifice of the Lord's Cross the difficulties they may encounter from their condition.

**2359** Homosexual persons are called to chastity. By the virtues of self-mastery that teach them inner freedom, at times by the support of disinterested friendship, by prayer and sacramental grace, they can and should gradually and resolutely approach Christian perfection.

From the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Marriage and Family's 1997 statement entitled "Always Our Children: A Pastoral Message to Parents of Homosexual



Children and Suggestions for Pastoral Ministries":

For St. Paul, love is the greatest of spiritual gifts. St. John considers love to be the most certain sign of God's presence. Jesus proposes it as the basis of his two great commandments, which fulfill all the law and the prophets.

Love, too, is the continuing story of every family's life. Love can be shared, nurtured, rejected, and sometimes lost. To follow Christ's way of love is the challenge before every family today. Your family now has an added opportunity to share love and to accept love. Our Church communities are likewise called to an exemplary standard of love and justice.

Our homosexual sisters and brothers—indeed, all people—are summoned into responsible ways of loving.

To our homosexual brothers and sisters we offer a concluding word. This message has been an outstretched hand to your parents and families inviting them to accept God's grace present in their lives now and to trust in the unfailing mercy of Jesus our Lord. Now we stretch out our hands and invite vou to do the same. We are called to become one body, one spirit in Christ. We need one another if we are to "...grow in every way into him who is the head, Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, with the proper functioning of each part, brings about the body's growth and builds itself up in love" (Ephesians 4:15-16).

Though at times you may feel discouraged, hurt, or angry, do not walk away from your families, from the Christian community, from all those who love you. In you God's love is revealed. You are always our children.

Statement by Bishop Robert McElroy on the Supreme Court of the United States Ruling on Same Sex Marriage, dated June 26, 2015:

Today the United States Supreme Court ruled that the historic definition of marriage as a relationship between one man and one woman is unconstitutional.

The Catholic Church, along with other faith traditions, teaches that the nature of marriage and the family cannot be redefined by society, as God is the author of marriage and its corresponding gift of cocreating human life. The legal recognition of marriage is not only about personal commitment but also about the social commitment that husband and wife make to the well-being of their children. It is for this reason that it is important for government to give a unique status to marriage between one man and one woman both in law and in public policy. The Catholic community of San Diego and Imperial counties will continue to honor and embody the uniqueness of marriage between one man and one woman as a gift from God-in our teaching, our sacramental life and our witness to the world. We will do so in a manner which profoundly respects at every moment the loving and familial relationships which enrich the lives of so many gay men and women who are our sons and daughters, our sisters and brothers, and ultimately our fellow pilgrims on this earthly journey of life. And commanded by the Gospel of Jesus Christ we will continue to reach out to families of every kind who are encountering poverty, addictions, violence, emotional stress or the threat of deportation, and to attempt to bring them faith and care, service and solidarity.

The Catholic Church must do a much better job of teaching what the Catechism says: that we should treat our LGBT brothers and sisters with "respect, sensitivity, and compassion."

But God wants more. God wants us to love. And not a twisted, crabbed, narrow tolerance, which often comes in the guise of condemnations, instructions, and admonitions that try to masquerade as love, but actual love.

Love means: getting to know LGBT men and women, spending time with them, listening to them, being challenged by them, hoping the best for them, and wanting them to be a part of your lives, every bit as much as straight friends are part of your lives.
