...But What Good Is That for So Many?

"...But what good is that for so many?" This phrase taken from today's Gospel represents sentiment that often causes paralysis in our lives and in our world. In turn it prevents us from doing the good that can make a difference.

We sell ourselves short. We feel that what we have to offer will not make a difference, so we think, "Why even try?"

The miracle that takes place in today's Gospel, "The Feeding of the Five Thousand," is not so much about what happens to the bread and fish, but rather, about what happens to the people.

The young boy has five barley loaves and a couple of dried fish that he is willing to share. The number of people who need to be feed does not daunt him. The Apostles, on the other hand, find the situation paralyzing: "Not even with two hundred days' wages could we buy loaves enough to give each of them a mouthful." It is the child-like Faith that wins the day.

The young boy is willing to simply and trustingly share what he has and let God take care of the rest. In this account, we experience the basis of miracles. It is not a matter of the quantity and quality of our time, talent, and treasure. The basis of miracles is the willingness of each individual person to share, in faith and trust, whatever they may have, at that moment, to give. One's responsibility is simply to give, not to anticipate how the gifts will be received and used as a determinant as to whether the gifts should be given in the first place.

In this kind of approach, one can easily find a reason every time not to give, and not to help out. This attitude causes paralysis that prevents us from doing good.

Often times in today's world, we hear people say, "Why doesn't God cause a miracle to feed the hungry of the world?" "Why are people starving to death, especially children?" "Why doesn't God intervene?" Indeed, God has intervened by showing us how to feed the hungry and take care of the hurting. In any given moment, we are called to share what we have and who we are. In that faithful and trusting response that we must initiate, God is then "freed" to make miracles happen! God needs our "yes" and our cooperation.

Today, give your "yes" to God. Be willing to share who you are and what you have. It will make a difference. You will have created a space in which God's miracles happen!



DARING TO DREAM

The following showed up in my inbox in early June, thoughts from one of my well-intentioned colleagues who works in the academic arena—you know, those who are off doing other musical (or non-musical) things away from their school campuses for many, many weeks of the summer.

+++

Except for a very few holdouts, the academic year is over. Time for a little rest and rejuvenation. A change of scenery is in order, as is some time for reflection. Here, then, is a little something to ponder from your hammock. The following is by Kevin Peter Hand, a planetary scientist/astrobiologist in Pasadena, California and a 2011 National Geographic Emerging Explorer:

The drumbeat of human civilization is the pursuit of new knowledge. We explore, we discover, and we advance. From fundamental research on cancer to revolutionizing our understanding of the universe, it is not an either/or: we must do it all. Anything less is a sign that our priorities as a race have been hijacked by agendas beneath our potential. As has become a refrain in my community, the drumbeat continues and we echo the wise words of Teddy Roosevelt:

Dare mighty things.

What will YOU dare to advance the choral art next season?

+++

At the moment, I am planning for the coming year, choosing music for choirs and congregation, working on the liturgy (including music) for the Dedication Mass in the fall, reworking our liturgical minister guidelines and instruction sheets for the new church, continuing my score study of the Fauré *Requiem* that the Sanctuary Choir will be singing next spring, and, in general, trying to clean off my desk.

My colleague's short note reminds me of the very important part of what I do that has nothing to do with planning and preparing the neverending march of liturgies that is both blessing and bane for every director of liturgy and/or music, perhaps for every person who ministers in a faith community setting.

It reminds me to *dream*.

And with the many milestones and anniversaries in our recent past, dreaming is in order.

What shall I do—what might the music ministry accomplish—during my next ten years at St. Thomas More? What might the Tower Bells do once we have acquired all the bells in our fifth octave (just two more to go!)? What might the Sanctuary Choir do now that we are participating at weekend liturgies on a near-weekly basis? The Praise Team? What might we *all* do once the Parish finishes celebrating its first thirty years?

What might we do? What does the Holy Spirit have in store for us? How might we explore, discover, and advance?

For the music ministry, there is much on the horizon beyond our ongoing service to the people of St. Thomas More. The biggest "event" is, of course, the dedication of our permanent church. This "once-in-a-lifetime" celebration fulfills some of our grandest dreams, for ourselves as we minister to our community, and for generations to come. On a smaller level, our musicians will "go and announce the Gospel of the Lord" in a variety of ways in the coming year, traveling

to musical gatherings (as our youth are traveling to Steubenville this weekend!) to enjoy faith and fellowship. The Tower Bells will journey to Modesto next summer for a multi-state handbell conference presented by the Handbell Musicians of America, and in June the Sanctuary Choir will be in residence for three days at San Francisco's Grace Cathedral with 100 other singers to prepare and perform Gabriel Fauré's Requiem, which we also will sing here at a Memorial Day Weekend concert honoring those who have died in service to our country. All of these things stem from our desire to be better musicians, better servants of God in all that we do for this Parish.

These are some of the dreams I have been dreaming that will become realities in the coming year. And there are more that the Spirit will inspire in me, and in us, in the days and months and years to come.

Teddy Roosevelt had it right, and Jesus requires no less in this time and this place, challenging us to dare mighty things.

Christian Stewardship and the Joy of Giving

My twelve year-old daughter was asked to babysit the nursery at church for three dollars an hour. I thought it was a great way for her to be introduced to the world of work and earning money.

Three weeks after starting, no check had arrived. I figured it must have just been an oversight and said so at the dinner table.

"Dad, it doesn't matter. That's not why I did it," Alexandra said. "You help out in Men's Ministries because you enjoy it and that's your way of helping the church out. Mine is keeping the toddlers entertained so their parents can focus on the worship and the sermon."

I couldn't believe the maturity and selflessness my little girl was displaying. Jesus said we must become like little children to enter his Kingdom. Often times as we get older, we tend to look at gifts like our time, money, or abilities as if they were our own, and sometimes we hang on a



little too tight. Once again, I learned a valuable lesson from my children that when we give of our time or talents, there is far more joy if we don't look for anything in return!

Everyone knows about "helping hands." But have you ever really thought about all the different things hands can really do?

- ♥ Hands reach up to paint, clean, and tend to the church.
- ♥ They can do the same for the homes of those in need nearby.
