As we approach our Dedication Day, I invite you to pray this Prayer of Dedication on a regular basis. It is the prayer that Bishop McElroy will pray as the altar in our Church will be anointed and consecrated:

Father in heaven, source of holiness and true purpose, it is right that we praise and glorify your name.

For today we come before you to dedicate to your lasting service this house of prayer, this temple of worship, this home in which we are nourished by your word and your sacraments.

Here is reflected the mystery of the Church.

The Church is fruitful, made holy by the blood of Christ: a bride made radiant with his glory, a virgin splendid in the wholeness of her faith, a mother blessed through the power of the Spirit.

The Church is holy, your chosen vineyard: its branches envelop the world, its tendrils, carried on the tree of the cross, reach up to the kingdom of heaven.

The Church is favored, the dwelling place of God on earth: a temple built of living stones, founded on the apostles with Jesus Christ its cornerstone.

The Church is exalted, a city set on a mountain: a beacon to the whole world, bright with the glory of the Lamb, and echoing the prayers of her saints.

Lord, send your Spirit from heaven to make this church an ever-holy place, and this altar a ready table for the sacrifice of Christ.

Here may the waters of baptism overwhelm the shame of sin; here may your people die to sin and live again through grace as your children.

Here may your children, gathered around your altar, celebrate the memorial of the Paschal Lamb, and be fed at the table of Christ's word and Christ's body.

Here may the prayer, the Church's banquet, resound through heaven and earth as a plea for the world's salvation.

Here may the poor find justice, the victims of oppression, true freedom.

From here may the whole world, clothed in the dignity of the children of God, enter with gladness your city of peace.

We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

Let us prepare well to receive his message and to understand the issues he will be addressing!

Here are the events that will be occurring in our Parish and neighborhood!

Sunday, September 20—Diocesan Event, 3:00-4:00pm, at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish in San Ysidro. An Interfaith Prayer Service: *Church of the Border* with Bishop McElroy. Make a day of it! Check *www.gonctd.com* for Coaster and Trolley options and maybe plan for an early dinner in Old Town on the way back. Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Parish is a five minute walk from the Beyer Blvd. Trolley Station! The Prayer Service will be outside—dress accordingly!

Tuesday, September 22—Prayer Vigil at 7:00pm at St. Thomas More praying for the spiritual success of the Pope's visit, that we will grow in our desire to care for our Mother Earth, and that delegates to the United Nations and members of our U.S. Congress will receive his message on matters of utmost importance for global peace and justice. You are invited to bring a symbol from nature (a shell, rock, small plant, flower, branch). These will be placed at the foot of the altar as a reminder of Pope Francis' recent encyclical on care for our common home.

Friday, October 2—7:00pm at St. Thomas More. View a screening of one of the Pope's homilies with dessert and discussion: "How do we take his message to heart in our local community?"

Wednesday, October 7—7:00pm at Franciscan School of Theology at Mission San Luis Rey. Speaker: Dan Misleh, founding Director of the Catholic Climate Covenant will speak on Pope Francis' encyclical on the environment, *Laudato Sí*.

St. Bonaventure Clothing Drive (November 7-8)

It is hard for many to believe that there is abject poverty in this great country...but it does exist! And in our own back yard. St. Bonaventure Indian Mission in New Mexico supports approximately 100 miles of the large reservation (a relatively small portion). On the Reservation, unemployment runs at about 70% of the population...many do not have utilities or running water...while there are some wells, much of the underground water has been contaminated with uranium from mining done during World War II. (When people use it for drinking or for crops, they become ill and die.) For over 20 years STM has conducted the only dedicated clothing drive to support the Mission. They are in great need of clothing of all sizes, shoes and work boots, and blankets. Please help us again this year with your used but serviceable clothes, shoes, and bedding. CHANGING COURSE

marking the onset of our journey to Jerusalem

This weekend, the aspiring liturgists among us will notice a change in the congregational service music that we sing during Mass.

No, the music director has not gotten bored after sixteen weeks of Dan Schutte's *Mass of Chris the Savior*. Rather, the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time marks a turning point in the first reading and gospel as we turn toward the close of the liturgical year on the feast of Christ the King.

Setting his "face like flint" (first reading), Jesus begins his resolute journey to Jerusalem, where he will face his passion and death and then be raised to new life (gospel). He makes explicit to his disciples that they, too, must lose their loves if they wish to save them.

The *Mass of Renewal* was written by Curtis Stephan for parishes to use when the new *Roman Missal* texts were introduced in 2011.

"For me, the challenge of setting any liturgical music is always to make it accessible for congregational use while keeping it musically compelling," said Stephan. "As a parish music director, I found that the settings we use most simply work in many situations—weekend parish Masses, daily Masses, Ordinary Time, or Lent—so in this case, flexibility was an added ingredient for me."

"My goal was to make it easy for the faithful to truly pray the...prayers in a way that edified the Mass," said Stephan. "We have the beautiful opportunity go to new depths of understanding and to rediscover what it is that we proclaim and celebrate every time at Mass."

I hope you will come to like the new Mass setting as much as we do!

A Light in the Darkness

For centuries, lighthouses have been placed along coasts and islands across the world. Their beacons have prevented countless shipwrecks and saved countless lives. It's not surprising that many people feel affectionate toward them and want to preserve those which are in danger of being torn down.

Today, lighthouses still in use are automated. But before modern times, lighthouse keepers led lonely lives. Maintaining the light required long hours of work. The pay was usually low. And yet, these people rarely complained. They knew the importance of their task.

The greatest gift of the keepers was their time spent building fires, polishing lenses, and repairing rescue equipment.

Day by day, often for years, the keepers gave this time to save others. Because they used their time unselfishly, sailors and travelers lived who otherwise would have died.

Lighthouses sometimes used as symbol Christ. He too provides constant guidance, just as the keepers did. In return for his help, shouldn't we also spend more time helping others?

On Care for Our Common Home Encyclical Letter of Pope Francis: *LAUDATO SI'*

Laudato Si' is the appeal from Pope Francis to "every person living on this planet" for an inclusive dialogue about how we are shaping the future of this planet. Pope Francis calls the Church and the world to acknowledge the urgency of our environmental challenges and join him in embarking on a new path. - USCCB

This issue of Just News features excerpts from Laudato Si' with paragraph numbers included for reference.

Climate as a Common Good

"Many things have to change course, but it is we human beings above all who need to change. We lack an awareness of our common origin, of our mutual belonging, and of a future to be shared with everyone" (202).

"Our throw away culture affects the entire planet" (22).
"...it is not possible to sustain the present level of consumption in developed countries and wealthier sectors of society, where the habit of wasting and discarding has reached unprecedented levels" (27). "We have not yet managed to adopt a production model capable of preserving resources for present and future generations while limiting the use of non-renewable resources, moderating our consumption, maximizing our efficient use, reusing and recycling our resources" (22).

"Humanity is called to recognize the need for changes of lifestyle, production and consumption in order to combat this warming or least the human causes which produce or aggravate it" (23). "These problems are closely linked to a throw away culture which affects the excluded just as it quickly reduces things to rubbish" (20).



Pope Francis' Appeal

"The urgent challenge to protect our common home includes a concern to bring the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development" (13).

"I urgently appeal, then, for a new dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet. We need a conversation which includes everyone, since the environmental challenge we are undergoing, and its human roots, concern and affect us all" (14).

Tips to Care for Our Common Home

- "...promote a new way of thinking about human beings, life, society and our relationship with nature" (215).
- "For poor countries, the priorities must be to eliminate extreme poverty and to promote the social development of their people" (172).
- "...show concern for a public place (a building, a fountain, an abandoned monument, a landscape, a square), and strive to protect, restore, improve or beautify it as something belonging to everyone" (232).

"We have to dare to speak of the integrity of human life, of the need to promote and unify all the great values. Once we lose our humility, and become enthralled with the possibility of limitless mastery over everything, we inevitably end up harming society and the environment" (224).

"Climate change is a global problem with grave implications...this in turn affects the livelihood of the poor, who are then forced to leave their homes, with great uncertainty for their future and that of their children. There has been a tragic rise in the number of migrants seeking to flee from the growing poverty caused by environmental degradation. They are not recognized by international conventions as refugees; they bear the loss of the lives they have left behind" (25).



"Our world has a grave social debt towards the poor who lack access to drinking water, because they are denied the right to a life consistent with their inalienable dignity" (30).

"Both everyday experience and scientific research show that the gravest effects of all attacks on the environment are suffered by the poorest" (48).

"Let us sing as we go. May our struggles and our concern for this planet never take away the joy of our hope" (244).
