Pastor's Column

The Vineyard

The vineyard is a popular Christian symbol. It appears a number of times in the New Testament

Very simply, the earth is the vineyard. We are workers in that vineyard. There were workers before us. There will be workers after us.

While we are in the vineyard, we are called to tend it and to bear fruit. One day, for each of us, there will be an accounting of our efforts in the Owner's vineyard.

God is the Owner. We are the workers. We are God's stewards. We get ourselves into trouble when we begin to create illusions that we are the owners.

Failing to recognize that all is pure gift, and that we enjoy the gift just for a short time, we fantasize that we own things; that these things, whatever they may be, belong to us.

We get caught up in our ownership and begin to use God's vineyard for our own purposes.

We cloud our vision with ownership. We clear our vision with stewardship.

When we, deep in our hearts and souls, come to the realization that we are just "passing through" the vineyard, as invited guests of the Owner, we begin to see clearly.

Our time, our talent, and our treasure are products of God's vineyard. It is the "stuff" of the vineyard, the Owner's "stuff" that has given us the ability to create our time, talent, and treasure.

To be in right relationship with the Owner, we must recognize the Owner and carry an attitude of praise and gratitude, and a desire to give back what has been given to us.

The Scriptures remind us over and over again that the "first fruits" belong to the Owner, they belong to God, and they become our gift of praise and thanksgiving. The "first fruits" keep us sensitive to the fragility and timeliness of life, remind us that we are stewards, not owners, and help to keep our vision clear and crisp.

May each of us take time to reflect upon our relationship with God, and rededicate the "first fruits" of our time, talent, and treasure to the Owner of the vineyard!

MINISTRY BEYOND THE "USUAL"

It is very easy to get caught up in the "usual" things we do.

I find myself eating the same food for breakfast, wearing the same tie for funerals, driving the same roads to visit my family in Northern California, going to the same restaurant for pizza.

Of course, my world won't end if I were to look in a different part of the cupboard for breakfast, to wear a red tie for funerals, to take the slightly longer route to see my folks, or to try a "new" pizza place. But sometimes it feels like it.

We get caught up in our regular activities, and ministering at a church is no different. A while back, I got a note from someone that said, "How are we going to do this, this year?" Emphasis on the second *this*.

I had been planning to do "this" the same way we had done it for years, but clearly the Spirit—in the guise of my colleague—was reminding yet again that Jesus' last seven words were not "We've always done it this way before." (Alternatively translated, "We've never done it this way before.") So we did something different. I am not sure it was better—or worse—but it was another opportunity for us to try something new, to see if it resonates in a different way.

Working in church ministry, it is easy for me to think I do plenty for God. My professional work is intimately involved in my faith, and I am very blessed by that. But it is also tempting to say that I do enough for God by "working" at a church.

Don't get me wrong, I love what I do, serving God in word and deed through the liturgy and the music. And I find it exceedingly rewarding. But it is important that my work in God's vineyard includes time spent

outside my professional activities.

For instance, last night, my wife and I cooked dinner at her church for Shelter Network's Interfaith Rotational Shelter. The Network involves over 120 congregations of all denominations county-wide in the Rotational Shelter program. About 70 of the congregations host the program in their facilities for two or four weeks a year and the remainder serve in a valuable support role, providing volunteers for meals and overnight hosting, transportation and donations. St. Thomas More has helped to support the Rotational Shelter in the

Through congregations linking with others, people are sheltered where there are no shelters and receive the understanding and support of congregations when previously all they knew was fear and uncertainty. Congregations benefit by getting to know homeless individuals personally and the mutual sharing of stories is beneficial to both.

Each year—and sometimes twice a year—up to 20 people come to stay at my wife's church for two weeks. The church provides overnight accommodation, including beds, showers, dinner, breakfast, and a sack lunch to take for the day. For these weeks, members of our community—single, married, with without children-who temporarily find themselves in a tough spot can have a safe place to stay while they find a job, find an apartment, gain critical new skills, or work out their next step. Then, they move to another church, somewhere in San Diego County, where another group of volunteers minister to them.

I find my ministry to these sisters and brothers in need to be

exceedingly beneficial and, yes, important to my spiritual wellbeing. They are certainly not the "least of these" that Jesus talks about in Matthew 25, but they are in need, and ministering to them reminds me that my usual, professional activities to minister in God's vineyard are not enough.

The good news is that there are lots of opportunities outside our usual activities if we listen carefully for the Spirit's guidance.




