WHAT WOULD YOU DO?

Eight years ago this month, ABC launched a program hosted by John Ouiñones called "What Would You Do?" Each episode features actors who play out scenes of conflict or illegal activity in a public setting while hidden cameras record the results; the focus of the program is on whether bystanders will intervene and how they will do so. Sometimes the genders, races, or clothing of the performers will be changed during a given scenario, to see whether these factors will alter the reactions of the unknowing public. At the end of each scenario, Quiñones appears to interview bystanders regarding their responses.

Some of the scenarios have included: three teenagers beating and taunting a homeless man; a woman needs to fill a prescription at a pharmacy but doesn't have enough money to pay for it; a pregnant young woman offers to sell her baby to different couples passing by; a grocery bagger with Down's syndrome is insulted by an impatient shopper who calls him/her a "retard." In a sense, our daily or weekly encounter with the word of God offers us a similar experience. With each text we hear, the inspired author presents us not with a fictional scenario but with the truth of God's word. Within each text lies a challenge and a question: "What would you do?"

As Isaiah shares his call to prophesy and Luke tells us of Peter, James and John being called to discipleship (Feb 7), we marvel at their willingness to set aside whatever plans they had for their lives so as to follow wherever God would lead and to serve those to whom they were sent. If we experienced a similar challenge to relinquish our will to God's will, and our future to God's plan, what might we do? As we ponder the answer to this, we

might experience hesitance. We would probably have many questions. Logic would seem to rule out such an unsure endeavor. Nevertheless, with God and with grace, we can acquiesce and follow.

In the season of Lent and its ambience of repentance reconciliation, we think about the times we have faced temptation to turn from God's will-and we are reminded that Jesus, too, was tempted (Feb 16). In keeping with his identity as God's Son and Savior, he was tempted to use his power to benefit himself, to turn stones into bread to ease a 40-day fast, to reign over all the kingdoms of the earth, to boast of his special place in God's eyes by forcing the angels to come to his rescue. In each instance, Jesus countered his tempter with the truth of scripture; and, in each instance, Jesus was strengthened to resist. What would you do? It is relatively easy to succumb and then to blame someone else for our downfall. Excuses leap from our lips so readily. But Jesus has offered the example we are to emulate. The more truthful we are with ourselves and the more at home we are with God's word, the greater will be our strength and resistance to evil.

On Lent's second Sunday (Feb 21), we proclaim the Lucan Gospel of Jesus' transfiguration in glory. A voice from heaven leaves no doubt as to who Jesus is: God's chosen Son, to whom we are to listen. Herein lies the key to faithful discipleship. Before all else, listen to Jesus. Before attempting to respond to the question "What would you do?" we are first to consider what Jesus might do.

London preacher Charles Spurgeon used the phrase "What would Jesus do?" several times in a sermon he gave on June 28, 1891, citing

Luke 4:22

Thomas à Kempis' 15th-century masterpiece *The Imitation of Christ* as his source. "What would Jesus do?" was also the subtitle of the 1896 book *In His Steps* by American minister Charles Sheldon. This question makes it clear that Jesus is the ultimate example and inspiration for all who believe.

Jesus went about doing good; so must we. Jesus offered a welcome to all, regardless of their social status, gender, ethnicity, age, or sinfulness; so must we. Jesus was never afraid to speak truth to power or to defend the defenseless; so must we be fearless in our support for God's least ones. Jesus fasted and prayed and set aside time in his life to commune with God; we are to do likewise. Jesus was patient with sinners, offering them many chances and time to repent; we should be similarly kind and merciful to one another. Jesus willingly suffered and died for the salvation of sinners; am I willing to pay the cost of discipleship? Jesus revealed to sinners the love and mercy of God; how authentically is God reflected in my life? An itinerant preacher and healer, Jesus was willing to forego a comfortable life in order to bring the good news to as many people as he could; what am I willing to surrender for the sake of the Gospel?

What would Jesus do? What ought we to do? We are to strive so that the answers to both of these questions will be the same.

Transcript of Finance Update

January 31, 2016 by Bill Ipsen

I'm Bill Ipsen, Parish financial resources liaison.

Stewardship is an ethic that embodies the responsible planning and management of resources. The concept of stewardship can be applied to many things...health, property, nature, and yes, economics.

The message of stewardship regarding time and talent has been addressed by others in the last weeks, and today by Chris Smith, our Director of Stewardship and Development. My time today is devoted to treasure.

It has been my responsibility to communicate to the congregation information regarding our monthly operations, as well as our mortgage offering; and to reiterate in this month of stewardship how important a role everyone plays in the financial well being of our parish.

We have heard how important the need is for people to donate their time and talent to the many programs and activities offered at St. Thomas More throughout the year.

The same can be said for the financial needs of the Parish. With our new House of Worship, our new Church Home, now complete, we have two buildings to support in addition to Parish staff and other ancillary expenses through our monthly operations budget.

In the first six months of our current fiscal year, July through December, we are \$8,000 below budget with offertory collections. During this period we were maintaining one building on our campus. We now have two buildings to maintain.

Our Campus is growing and we need to grow our offertory collection as well.

At the same time, as you know, we have a monthly mortgage in the amount of \$45,000 with approximately 18-1/2 years remaining.

Presently we have a \$12,000 deficit in our mortgage payments. That is not much, but let me explain why...





Recently we received a dedicated gift of \$90,000 directed to pay down our mortgage. While this gift was received with joy, it was highly unusual, doesn't happen very often, and not something we can count on to make our regular monthly mortgage payment.

At the same time, our mortgage offering over the last months continues to be approximately \$6,500 per month short of our payment.

The financial success of our Parish does not rest on the backs of the few; it rests on the backs of the many. If you are not currently involved in ongoing support of our Parish, now is a good time to become involved, no matter the amount...\$5, \$10, \$20. Every gift, no matter the size, makes a difference. If you are currently supporting our Parish, perhaps you can increase your offering by that same \$5, \$10, \$20, or more if circumstances allow.

As you can see from our brief update today, we have a very real need to increase the monthly offering and the mortgage offering as we go forward in 2016. If everyone in our Parish community is able to contribute in some capacity, we will surely be able to raise the funds necessary to reach our goals.

In closing, I would like to announce that after 15 years as the spokesman for fundraising and financial information, this weekend will be my final update. A very special thank you to Fr. Mike for his support and encouragement throughout the years, and to the many other people involved in our capital campaigns and finance committee, who have assisted me in creating updates and reports to present to our Parish. And thank you to the many Parishioners who have also encouraged, supported, and offered many suggestions and comments during my service. It has represented a challenge and an opportunity I will not soon forget.

At the same time, I am pleased to announce that Fr. Mike has appointed Doug D'Agrosa as the new financial resources liaison. Doug and Laura and their family have been members of our parish community for 25 years, Doug most recently being chairman of the Pastoral Council. He is an excellent choice, and I ask you to welcome him, in his new role at St. Thomas More.

Sacrificial Giving is the process of consciously examining one's household income and making a decision to give a percentage of it to the Church. If the "leap of faith" of tithing seems to be too great for you, we ask that you consider the "gradual approach." Please examine and review not only the dollar amount that you presently give to St. Thomas More, but the percentage of your gross household income that dollar amount represents.

When you add up all your gifts to St. Thomas More, what percentage is that amount of your gross household income? Maybe it is ½%, 1%, 3%, or more? You are encouraged to

increase it by a percentage each year until you have made that leap of Faith and are tithing.

Tithing is the biblical concept of sacrificial giving that encourages 10% of all we earn be returned to the Lord as an act of Faith.


