

Pastor's Column

What Manner of King Is This?

In this celebration of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, we hear words like "triumphant," "King," and "Blessed is the King Who Comes in the Name of the Lord."

Does this celebration of Palm Sunday have a triumphal edge to it? Are we honoring a king, as the world understands a king with all the trappings of privilege, comfort, and luxury?

What and who do we celebrate on this Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion?

The words of Philip Yancey, from his book, **The Jesus I Never Knew**, may help us in better understanding what and who we celebrate this day:

The triumphal entry has about it an aura of ambivalence and as I read all the accounts together, what stands out to me now is the slapstick nature of the affair.

I imagine a Roman officer galloping up to check on the disturbance. He has attended processions in Rome, where they do it

- right. The conquering general sits in a chariot of gold,
- with stallions straining at the reins and wheel spikes

flashing in the sunlight. Behind him, officers in polished

armor display the banners captured from vanquished armies.

At the rear comes a ragtag procession of slaves and prisoners in chains, living proof of what happens to those who defy Rome.

In Jesus' triumphal entry, the adoring crowd makes up the ragtag procession: the lame, the blind, the children, the peasants from Galilee and Bethany. When the officer looks for the object of their attention he spies a forlorn figure, weeping, riding on no stallion or chariot but on the back of a baby donkey, a borrowed coat draped across its backbone serving as his saddle.

Yes, there was a whiff of triumph on Palm Sunday, but not the kind of triumph that might impress Rome and not the kind that impressed crowds in Jerusalem for long either. What manner of king was this?

As we begin this Holy Week, as we walk with Jesus and unite his Paschal Mystery to ours, let us reflect upon what kind of king we honor and for whom we give our lives.

Journeying with Jesus

he great Orthodox liturgical theologian Fr. Alexander Schmemann reflected on the fact that the Triduum reveals more to us about the core doctrines of the Church (including the creation, fall, redemption, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ) than any other experience we can have, because this great prayer allows us to fully enter through powerful ritual into these mysteries. We don't need them explained, because in this great we both witness prayer and participate in "one all-embracing Event from which stems everything else: understanding and power, knowledge and joy, contemplation, and communion."

To pray in this liturgy is to walk with Jesus and the disciples on a profound journey. It is a path that

allows us to more deeply embrace our Baptism, the fullness of being a member of the Body of Christ. It is an "Amen" to the Lord, who went freely to his Death and in whose Resurrection the world is redeemed.

All of this is essential if we are to be people who can carry his message to the world. Pope Francis reminds us that he is our model and his manner our goal:

Jesus himself is the model of this method of evangelization which brings us to the very heart of his people. How good it is for us to contemplate the closeness which he shows to everyone! ... Jesus' sacrifice on the cross is nothing else than the culmination of the way he lived his entire life. Moved by his example, we want to enter fully into the fabric of society, sharing the lives of all,

listening to their concerns, helping them materially and spiritually in their needs, rejoicing with those who rejoice, weeping with those who weep; arm in arm with others, we are committed to building a new world. ... Jesus wants us to touch human misery, to touch the suffering flesh of others. He hopes that we will stop looking for those personal or communal niches which shelter us from the maelstrom of human misfortune and instead enter into the reality of other people's lives know the power and of tenderness. Whenever we do so, our lives become wonderfully complicated and we experience intensely what it is to be a people, to be part of a people (Evangelii Gaudium, 269).

The Triduum is our journey with Jesus, our direct encounter with his Death and Resurrection the events which are made real everv Eucharistic liturgy we celebrate. The Triduum is a peak moment in our liturgical lives that offers us a profound, personal journey with Jesus Christ. It is our path to a deeper experience of being those who can say, "We have seen the Lord" (John 20:25).



God's Mercy Extends to Those in Prison

Have you ever had one of those jaw-dropping experiences? For me it was a simple conversation with my son who works for the Department of Corrections. He rarely talks about his work, but on one occasion he mentioned that an inmate had passed away on his last shift. Trying to imagine what that was like, I asked him who is "with" a dying inmate.

He said that there would be a corrections officer present, but that other inmates were trained in pastoral care and in hospice. The knowledge and image that came to mind made my heart skip a beat. Tears still come when I think of it. Who knew? May the message of mercy reach everyone? Of course! Jesus finds his way into the heart of anyone who is open to Him.



We know the "good thief" found himself face-to-face with God in paradise. And may no one be indifferent to the call to experience mercy. There is something so uncomplicated about the event my son shared with me that day. The inmate who would go through special training and be on 24-hour call to sit at a dying inmate's side has experienced God's mercy in his own life. He was being a good steward of a special gift of compassion and of God's mercy.

If as stewards, we are to receive God's gifts gratefully, nurture them responsibly, share them generously, and return them to God in abundance, then it can happen anywhere at any time.

Blessed are the poor in Spirit! I do not know the circumstances of the inmate who died. I do not know if the inmate who served as his caretaker will ever leave prison, but I believe that this event was so powerful for me because I could actually visualize the all powerful presence of Jesus in that room.

Let us be thankful for, and remember in prayer, those who, on our behalf, fulfill the gospel imperative to care for the imprisoned and who use their gifts to help those incarcerated encounter.

Ministry for Priestly Formation and Seminarian Support

We are blessed with a rich heritage of men who have dedicated their lives to the service of our Church. They are a living example of Jesus Christ in our midst, as teachers, fathers, friends, and brothers, having enriched us with their sacrifice and dedication to Our Lord. This past year we ordained 3 priests and 1 transitional deacon.

The future of our diocese is strengthened by the number of men who answer the call to a priestly vocation and the responsibility, both spiritually and financially, of providing sufficient priests for the diocese belongs to all of us. Thanks to the support of the Annual Catholic Appeal we are currently supporting 15 seminarians with an average cost of \$45,000 per year.

Our Office for Priestly Formation administers the diocesan program for both pre-seminarian and seminarian candidates, and is located at the St. Francis Center on the University of San Diego campus. As a house of formation, St. Francis Center helps prepare men in each of the four areas of formation: spiritual, intellectual, community, and apostolic for admission to a seminary school of theology. Those who are called to priestly service touch all our lives, the lives of our family members, neighbors, friends, and our entire communities. Our parishes have benefited from their leadership and guidance. Our communities have been inspired by their presence, demonstrating that living the life of Christ daily is possible.

Easter and the Blessing of Food

In earlier times, meat and dairy products were excluded from the daily diet during the entire season of the Great Fast (Lent).

As the end of the strict fast approached, the people showed their joy and gratitude by taking their food to church to be blessed and eaten after the Easter Liturgy.



As we celebrate the Pasch, a feast of new life, we bless the food sustaining our physical life. Thus this custom has its meaning even today and, so we are encouraged to observe this ritual for our time.

The foods traditionally blessed for Easter can be reduced to three categories:

- 1. Easter bread;
- 2. Meat products, like ham, stuffed veal, suckling pig or lamb, sausage, bacon;
- 3. Dairy products, like butter, cheese, eggs (including your butter lamb!).

We will celebrate a Blessing of Easter Foods this year on Holy Saturday, March 26, at 11:00am in the Parish Center Lower Level.


