Transforming Congregations for the Future

In light of the very sad and disappointing political conversation that is taking place in this Election Year, a conversation that for most part lacks any ethical content and moral direction, it becomes very evident that the role of Church, Parishes, Faith Communities is more important than ever...

As we continue to celebrate the Feast of the Resurrection, we are mindful that we, who believe in the Resurrection of Jesus, must witness to this belief in the way we go about our daily lives.

The priorities we set, the ways in which we spend our time through work and leisure, the use of our financial resources, the ways in which we handle conflict, and the ways in which we interact with each other become the external signs of our internal beliefs. The Resurrection of Jesus has transforming power that radically changes our own lives and the world in which we live.

A special responsibility falls upon Faith Communities, Parishes, which intentionally come together in the name of Jesus. We must live in this "new way" not only for ourselves but also for the world. Our society needs what Faith Communities have the potential of giving.

Loren Mead in his study, "*Transforming Congregations for the Future*," suggests that society needs the church and the community graces that the church generates.

He also lists several characteristics of the church community that are necessary for a healthy and wholesome public life:

- 1. The church is a place where befriending strangers is not only appropriate, it is expected.
- 2. The prejudices and stereotypes that foster fear and hatred and cripple the order of the secular world can be processed within a community of mutually respectful persons.
- 3. Resources are not hoarded but shared in a community that has transformed the fear of "not enough for me" into the joy of giving.

- 4. Resolution of conflict situations in congregations goes beyond just stopping them for a time, to ending them altogether, with reconciliation and forgiveness.
- Religious communities create liturgies, drama, music, and festivals to celebrate life together and to give as much "hype" to community as the general public gives to conflict.
- Society has conditioned people to lock themselves in for safety whereas believing communities are places where the insecure and the isolated will feel secure and wanted.
- 7. People in communities take responsibility for the well being of others.
- 8. Congregations bring hope and persistence to the political table, witnessing to a world torn apart by gangs, drugs, violence, and hatred that the lion and the lamb can truly dwell together.
- 9. People in congregations are given the power to share their leadership talents.

As St. Thomas More Catholic Church, we continue to journey through this Easter Season. As we journey, may we be strengthened to live in "the new way."

May we allow the transforming power of the Resurrection to touch us and heal us and in turn, through us, heal our society and our world!

EASTER SIGNS AND SYMBOLS

Wine

Through fermentation, yeasts convert the sugar in grapes into carbon dioxide and other byproducts, including alcohol. There obvious this energy in transformation. Fermenting grapes hiss and fizz with potentially explosive force. In Christian tradition, wine has become symbolic for the power of the Holy Spirit.

God's Spirit is the lifeblood of the body of Christ. Jesus commands us to drink deeply. On Pentecost the disciples drank so much of the Spirit that bystanders thought they were drunk. The pentecostal signs of the Spirit, such as fire and wind, share qualities in common. Like wine, they can be agents of destruction or forces for creativity and delight.

During Eastertime it seems as if the earth itself is filled with these signs. Orchards and vineyards blossom. Sunshine pours down and gentle breezes blow. And, on occasion, there are windy thunderstorms and even worse. Keep people in your prayers whose lives are disrupted when the weather turns wild.

with maywine and sweet liqueurs, with fiery barbecues and flickering candles. Make of this season a time to turn away from destruction and to renew your powers creativity and delight. In the eucharistic feast, drink deeply of the Spirit.

Wax

Eastertime is the 50-day-long season from Easter Sunday until Pentecost, May 15 this year. Throughout this time the paschal candle shines in church. This candle is an image of the risen body of Christ. It was kindled and consecrated with great ceremony at the Easter Vigil.

When people are baptized into the church, they are given candles lit from the paschal candle. They are told to keep their lamps burning brightly throughout their lives. At funerals the paschal candle shines on the dead, like a pillar of fire to guide them to the promised land.



burning candle is a sign of self-sacrifice. It consumes itself in a blaze glory. Traditionally, church's the candles are made from beeswax. Α beehive is a symbol of the church, where everyone called to work together for the common good.

Many households light a fine, fat candle every mealtime, and indeed, every time they gather to pray. It is a holy habit.

When you light a candle in prayer you might say, "Jesus Christ is the light of the world, a light no darkness can extinguish." Or say the words proclaimed at the Easter Vigil, "Light of Christ! Thanks be to God!"





Stewardship of Others: Our Life as Servant Leaders

During this Easter season we again immerse ourselves in the wonder of Jesus' resurrection and the story of the early Church through our Sunday liturgies. Each year, I look forward to hearing from the Acts of the Apostles during this season. I am inspired by the faith and courage of the apostles and those who came to believe in Jesus Christ as a result of their witness and stewardship of their community of faith.

I am also encouraged when reading the story of the early development of the communities of believers—not only they face immense challenges from the Roman and Jewish authorities. they were often challenged from within. thev as figured out what it



meant to be Christians in community with one another.

In his book on the gift of administration, Rev. Donald Senior, biblical scholar and president of Catholic past Theological Union, writes of the ways leadership emerged in the early Church. He writes:

The inspiration for all leadership in the New Testament is rooted in the example of Jesus. His qualities of compassion, integrity, and selfless service in the carrying out of his mission are reflected in the virtues lifted up in the examples of early community leaders such as Peter, Barnabas, Paul, Priscilla, and many others.

The fundamental responsibility of New Testament leaders is to foster the common good of the community—the example of Jesus is paramount. Jesus as healer and teacher was committed to the restoration and well-being of God's people. So, too, the charismatic leadership of Paul and the more administrative type of leadership exercised by Peter, Barnabas, Phoebe, and many others were directed to building up the Body of Christ."

Fr. Senior goes on to summarize this form of leadership, modeled by Jesus himself, as "servant leadership."
