#### STM's Shakedown Cruise

"A shakedown cruise is a cruise intended to prepare a new vessel for regular service by accustoming the crew to its features and peculiarities, breaking in and adjusting machinery, etc." (www.dictionary.com).

The year of 2016 is STM's shakedown cruise! Bishop McElroy, the Bishop of San Diego, led us in our Dedication Mass on December 16, 2015, a little over seven months ago. Since then, and it is good for all of us to remember, that we are on our shakedown cruise and will be at least through the rest of this year.

So many people seemed to think that once we walked into our new Worship Space that everything would be completed and in perfect working condition. For those who thought this, there can be a significant amount of frustration...

Our Worship Space continues to be a work in progress. A few examples:

Our Parishioner, Jim Treat, whose background and career is as a sound technician, was implementing and overseeing all of the sound components for the Worship Space. When we moved into the Building, there were still many pieces that had to be installed and tested. Unexpectedly, Jim and his wife, Janice, made a decision for family reasons to move to Minnesota. This decision caused us to look for a sound technology company to be hired to complete all the wonderful work that Jim had begun and was in the process of completing. This is now in process.

After assessing our own needs, interviewing a sound technology company, waiting for their bid, assessing the bid, and making the decision to go forward with their suggestions, we are now underway.

We have at least \$20,000 worth of more work that needs to be done.

There are still several major "pieces" that have yet to be installed in our Worship Space: the Marian Shrine, the Resurrected Christ for the Daily Mass Chapel, and a painting in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel.

These are all in process and we are waiting for the artists to complete their work.

Once these major pieces are installed, then we will be able to "add" smaller pieces of religious art in various places. But it is important to wait for these major pieces to be installed, and then build around them, rather than putting in a variety of smaller pieces now that may not aesthetically coordinate with the major pieces.

There have been a myriad of minor, yet important and practical, items that we have and are attending to: proper signage for reserved seating and wheelchairs, bathrooms, the Reconciliation Chapel.

Some tweaks in the air conditioning, a window shade that is needed here and there, etc., etc., etc.

Much of what is needed is unknown until you are living in the space for a while.

Finally, there are "pieces" that have been installed, and we now recognize that they need immediate attention, because some things are not working as well as the artist had hoped.

Our Tabernacle is one example. We have difficulty with the opening and closing of its door. With the artist and with others, we have sought solutions to this problem. The solution for this is now underway.

There are a number of other items, small and large that need attention. And they are being addressed. But it all takes time!

Someone said to me recently: "Father, it must feel great now that you are in the Worship Space. Everything is done and you can relax." I looked at the person with disbelief, but I immediately realized that he did not understand the situation. I told him that these past seven months have been more difficult than when we were going through the building process, because it seems so many people expected that when we walked through the doors at the Dedication Mass that everything was complete and perfect. And in a very real sense, we are still so very much on our way to completion.

But many people's expectations and, yes, impatience, have made these last months very difficult for me and for our staff.


I hope this column will give some background to our reality, and will encourage everyone to join me on this shakedown cruise.



#### THOSE PESKY MISSING VERSES

From time to time people ask me about the missing verses in our readings.

Take, for example, next week:

Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23 Psalm 90:3-6, 12-14, 17 Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11 Luke 12:13-21

A quick look at the list shows that there are verses missing in three of our four readings.

Part of the answer can be found in the introductory material of the current *Lectionary for Mass*, which we began using in 1998:

76. In readings for Sundays and solemnities, texts that present real difficulties are avoided for pastoral reasons. The difficulties may be objective, in that the texts themselves raise profound literary, critical, or exegetical problems; or the difficulties may lie, at least to a certain extent, in the ability of the faithful to understand the texts. ... Often a difficult reading is clarified by its correlation with another in the same Mass.

Here, the concern is that parts of some texts require more explanation than can be offered from the homilist during Mass, and so is reserved for deeper study in a more suitable environment.

Speaking of which, have you signed up for the "Adventures in Acts: The

Spread of the Kingdom" Wednesday morning bible study OR the "Adventures in Matthew: The King and His Kingdom" Thursday evening bible study, both beginning in September?

But what about those specific verses? First, we need to know that it is nothing new:

77. The omission of verses in readings from Scripture has at times been the tradition of many liturgies, including the Roman liturgy. Admittedly such omissions may not be made lightly, for fear of distorting the meaning of the text or the intent and style of Scripture. Yet on pastoral grounds it was decided to continue the traditional practice in the present Order of Readings, but at the same time to ensure that the essential meaning of the text remained intact. One reason for the decision is that otherwise some texts would have been unduly long. It would also have been necessary to omit completely certain readings of high spiritual value for the faithful because those readings include some verse that is pastorally less useful or that involves truly difficult questions.

The compilers of the Lectionary wanted to maintain the three-year cycle that was crafted following the Second Vatican Council, balancing concerns about the overall length of

the texts with a desire to ensure our full understanding of them. It sounds like a baby-and-bathwater issue, omitting the few verses that require deeper understanding allows us both to understand the message and to be enticed to dig deeper into the scripture at a later date.

Remember too, that if you don't "get" the Old Testament reading—and next week's reading from Ecclesiastes is a doozy the first time you hear it!—the Gospel and the Old Testament readings are arranged to be harmonious, that is, they usually relate to each other with the Old Testament reading chosen on account of its relationship to the Gospel.

The second reading during Ordinary Time is usually a semi-continuous reading, taking up where last week's reading left off, and only rarely does it relate, especially during Ordinary Time. But that's an article for another week!
