Catechesis and the Proclamation of the Word

Today we celebrate Catechetical Sunday here at St. Thomas More and in the Universal Church. A special ceremony of blessing and dedication takes place at our 8:30am and 10:30am Sunday Masses in which we recognize the many catechists among us who commit themselves in this coming Parish Year to "hand on the faith" to others, especially the young, in our midst.

We, so often, take a Parish for granted. It is "here" and we avail ourselves of its resources dependent upon our needs. A Parish, though, doesn't just happen. A Parish, and, especially a Parish with a lively faith, is created and maintained by conscious and very deliberate choices "to be."

St. Thomas More is an intentional Faith Community. God has called us and we respond to God by gathering together in the name of Jesus. In that intentional gathering, the Lord Jesus is present and, through us, Jesus' mission and ministry continue.

As Pastor, I am grateful to the many Parishioners who have made a conscious choice to order the priorities in their lives in such a way that they can give of their time and talent to be Catechists within the St. Thomas More Faith Community. I am grateful for their desire to share Jesus and the Faith Life of this Community with others.

A special "thank you" is extended to Debbie Fredette, our Director of Faith Formation, who oversees the catechetical ministry of this Parish! Her faithfulness and dedication to this ministry is so appreciated.

May the fidelity of our catechists inspire all of us to deepen our commitment to St. Thomas More. Remember, a Parish with a lively Faith doesn't just happen; we must choose to make it happen. Let us, once again, make that choice!

Is There a Doctor in the House?

In the list of readings that appears in the bulletin each week, there are sometimes names referenced on particular dates. This week, for example, we will see:

Sep 19 Januarius, bishop, martyr Sep 20 Andrew Kim Tae-gŏn, priest, Paul Chŏng Ha-sang, and companions, martyrs Sep 21 Matthew, apostle and

evangelist

Sep 23 Pius of Pietrelcina, priest

The Church's General Calendar lays out an annual cycle of celebrations "of those Saints who have universal significance...and of other Saints who demonstrate the universality and continuity of sainthood within the people of God" (Missal 49).

Next to the names in the Calendar (and in our bulletin) are references that tell us something about their circumstance in life and in death.

St. Januarius was Bishop of Benevento, and was thrown to bears under Diocletian (c. 305 CE).

St. Andrew Kim Tae-gŏn was ordained Korea's first native priest, and he and his lay associate, a seminarian, St. Paul Chŏng Ha-sang were beheaded in 1846. The "companions" refer to the 103 martyrs that gave their lives for the faith on Korea between 1839 and 1867.

St Matthew is *the* St. Matthew, one of the Twelve. The four Gospel writers are sometimes referred to as the evangelists.

St. Pius of Petrelcina is better known as Padre Pio, a Capuchin priest who received the stigmata.

Other descriptors include: religious, deacon, virgin, hermit, pope, abbot, archangel, and doctor.

Most of these titles are self-evident, and some saints are more than one

on Church terminology

thing—St. Matthew, for example.

Here, I would like to expand just a bit on the word "doctor" as it has a specific meaning with the Roman Catholic Church.

"Doctor of the Church" is a title given by the Church to men and women whom it recognizes as particular been of importance, particularly regarding their contribution to theology or doctrine. (In Latin, the word doctor translates as teacher.) This title indicates that the writings and preachings of such a person are useful to Christians "in any age of the Church." While the writings of the Doctors are often considered inspired by the Holy Spirit; this does not mean they are infallible, but it does mean that they contributed significantly to the formulation of Christian teaching in at least one area.

The Doctors' works vary greatly in subject and form. Some, such as Pope Gregory I and Ambrose, were prominent writers of letters and short treatises. Catherine of Siena and John of the Cross wrote mystical theology. Augustine and Bellarmine defended the Church against heresy. Bede's Ecclesiastical History of the English People provides the best information on England in the early Systematic Middle Ages. theologians include the Scholastic philosophers Anselm, Albertus Magnus, and Thomas Aquinas.

Until 1970, no woman had been named a doctor in the church, but since then four additions to the list have been women: Saints Teresa of Ávila (St. Teresa of Jesus) and Catherine of Siena by Pope Paul VI; Thérèse de Lisieux (St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus and of the Holy Face), "the Little Flower," by Saint John Paul II; and Hildegard of

Bingen (patron saint of music and musicians) by Benedict XVI.

There are 36 men and women who have been given the title of Doctor of the Church. The latest was Gregory of Narek (951-1003), an Armenian monk, poet, mystical philosopher, theologian, and saint of the Armenian Apostolic Church and Catholic Church, who was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church on April 12, 2015, Divine Mercy Sunday, by Pope Francis.




