

Advent Awakening

"Advent is a time for rousing. Human beings are shaken to the very depths, so that they may wake up to the truth of themselves. The primary condition for a fruitful and rewarding Advent is a renunciation, a surrender...a shattering awakening; that is the necessary preliminary. Life only begins when the whole framework is shaken."

—Alfred Delp

As we reflect upon our lives, and as we remember those tragic events—the sudden death of a loved one, an unexpected illness, financial failure, divorce, or betrayal—we know the truth of these words.

When we are shaken to our roots, when we need to "put it all together" one more time, we then experience our fragility and we see life once again, as for the first time.

When we surrender to this reality, we then begin to really live and take hold of life.

In the Gospel today, as we begin this Season of Advent, we hear Jesus say to us: "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come."

"The time," whatever that event may be, will come upon us, and shake us to our roots, maybe for the first time, maybe for the second, third, or fourth time. Advent is meant to be a season in which we are to prepare ourselves in faith so that we continue to trust in God as we go through what we know we could not go through without God.

The only constant is life is change. All is transitory and imperfect. We are a people waiting for the return of the Lord. One day we will die and will have to give all back to God.

Advent, with the help of the Scriptures, offers an opportunity to reflect upon these realities.


Our present culture rallies against such thinking. These days before Christmas we "medicate" ourselves with parties, food, drink, gifts, and continuous busy-ness; and we do so relentlessly, more than during any other time of year.

It is a challenge, but let us attempt to infuse this Season with Advent reflection. May this be a time in which we do not run away from life, but a time in which we more fully embrace it, with all of its beauty, but also with all of its tragedy and pain.

May Advent shake us to our roots, once again!

BRINGING FORTH THE CHRIST

Decades ago, a friend and mentor gave me what I then thought to be quite an unusual gift. As I look at it today, where it stands upon my bureau, the seven-inch brown wooden representation of an obviously pregnant Mary, head bowed, hands clasped in prayer, reminds me of the wisdom of its giver. This small figure represents who each of us is called to be, said my mentor of years ago, that is, believers who embody Jesus Christ and bring him forth into the world. Mary, in her humble cooperation with God, brought forth her Savior into the world; so are we to continue to do so for

one another. During this month, which is almost entirely given over to Advent, this special responsibility becomes all the more significant.

There are so many people and places in our world where the presence of Christ is difficult if not impossible to detect; those are the people and the places who beg for our active and positive intervention. A kind word, a service rendered, a deliberate act of love can transform an empty void into a source of God's presence. Bringing Jesus to birth in every person and place is to acknowledge that God is already present there but, perhaps, not so perceptibly. Through our positive and purposeful efforts, we might draw attention to the God who awaits discovery and rejoice in our recognition and acknowledgment of that great and graced gift.

A special season within the liturgical year, Advent speaks to the heart of who we are, pilgrims on the way, companions on the journey, fellow explorers, always making our way toward God, yet also a people in waiting and hope, knowing that our journey will end only when God intends that it will. Until then, we join together in passionate anticipation of what God has in store.

Our word advent, derived from the Latin *adventus*, means coming and calls to mind the Greek word *parousia*. Scholars agree that during the fourth and fifth centuries in Spain and Gaul, Advent was a season set apart for the preparation of catechumens who would be baptized on the feast of the Epiphany. During this special period of preparation, the faithful devoted 40 days to penance. However, by the sixth century C.E., Christians in Rome had come to associate Advent with the coming of Christ, not so much in his first coming through his humble birth in Bethlehem, but in his second coming at the end of time and as judge of all the world. Only in the Middle Ages was Advent explicitly celebrated in remembrance of Christ's first appearance at Christmas *and* in anticipation of Jesus' future coming in glory.

In order to celebrate these two elements of remembrance and anticipation, Advent's first two Sundays focus on Christ's final appearance among humankind, while the last two Sundays draw

attention to Jesus' first appearance. In remembering one appearance, we prepare worthily for the other yet to come.

As the first season in the liturgical year, Advent engages believers in a process of growth and is intended to be a transformational experience. As Henri Nouwen (Eternal Seasons, Ave Maria Press, Notre Dame, IN: 2007) has explained, the liturgical year, beginning with Advent, engages believers to hear and acquiesce to an entirely different rhythm. It a journey from *chronos*, chronological world of clocks and calendars, to kairos, time viewed as opportunity or encounter. Kairos is the fullness of time, that time made sacred and full by Jesus Christ; it is a time for welcoming in the Christ and allowing him to come to birth in us and in our world.

Therefore, while some may be caught up with shopping, parties, gifts, and decorations, Advent believers appreciate, enjoy and then see beyond the secular accoutrements of the season and find joy and hope in the Christ who is being revealed among us. He is Son of God, Lord of All, Hope of the Hopeless, Joy of the Sorrowing, Healer of Hearts, Lover of Sinners, and Forgiver of All. This is the God, the Christ whom we are to bring forth to the world, as Mary did. Therefore, this Advent, as we strike the careful balance between remembering and anticipation, let us be ever mindful that "Advent offers the opportunity to deepen my memory of God's great deeds in time and sets me free to look forward with courage to the fulfillment of time by him who came and is still to come" (Henri Nouwen, The Genesee Diary: Report from a Trappist Monastery, Doubleday, New York, NY: 1989).



Empowered by God's Grace and Love In Everything Stewards Give Thanks



Every November, the United States celebrates a great national holiday: Thanksgiving. Canada celebrates a similar feast in October. Although the origins of the US festivity are somewhat historically murky, it's evident that some of the earliest immigrants to America celebrated this day as an expression of gratitude to God for bringing a healthy harvest

which would ensure their colony's survival through the winter. In those days, it was the most primal kind of thankfulness:

You have spared our lives, O Lord, and we are grateful!


Over the years, Thanksgiving in the U.S. has become a national expression of gratitude, but sometimes it veers into the area of cliché, and often it strays away from the source of our gifts.

Television hosts will remind us we should be thankful for all the "stuff" we have, including some non-tangible items like freedom, but to whom are we grateful? In some circles, it's unfashionable to mention that it is God, the source of life and goodness, to whom we owe our deep, humble sense of appreciation.

The faith of the Christian steward, on the other hand, proclaims gratitude to God as its wellspring and cornerstone. The Christian steward is aware of thankfulness to God twelve months of the year, not just in November, and the steward knows, as St. Ignatius of Loyola taught us, that we "find God in all things."

Therefore, we find reason to thank God in all things—for health of mind and body, for our families, our livelihoods, our successes, and the gifts of education, intelligence, and freedom that make our lives full and rewarding.

We also thank God for the embarrassing moments of our lives, for the sorrows, disappointments, even the mistakes, because we know that God was present in each of those moments, ready to teach us and to guide us. The Christian steward can go deep in prayer and thank God for lessons learned in times of trouble as well as in times of bounty.



Gratitude, for the Christian steward, is not just given in times of plenty, but also in times of sadness and deprivation. Perhaps the challenge for stewards during November is to be a source of reminder to those around them that thanksgiving is a fundamental lifetime habit, rendered to the God of mercy and plenty.






