

Nothing Less than All of You Is What I Want

Tuesday, January 31, 2017, marks the 42nd anniversary of my Ordination to the Priesthood.

I give thanks to God for the gift of my vocation and God's willingness to allow me to share in the Priesthood of Jesus Christ. I pray for continued strength as I head into "the home stretch."

I am so grateful for St. Thomas More Parish, this Community of Faith that I have the privilege and joy to pastor.

A Pastor needs to be fed, just as the flock needs to be fed. Please know that I am being fed by you, the People of St. Thomas More Parish! Your commitment, your desire, and your efforts to live as Disciples of Jesus, and to witness to God's Kingdom in this time and in this place mean much to me. You feed me and you strengthen my commitment to be faithful to my promises and vows. Always remember that we need each other. You need a pastor, and, just as importantly, a pastor needs his community.

As I celebrate 42 years of ministry, two phrases come to mind: "permanent commitment" and "humor."

Firstly, the most important charism that is needed for our time is, I believe, "permanent commitment." There are many people in our world today who believe that people cannot make a commitment that lasts "until death." All of us, married, vowed religious, and ordained are called to give to this generation the gift of "permanent commitment."

Our young people, especially, need to see that people can make commitments that last a lifetime. That is what I have chosen to do. No matter what the problem or difficulty, I choose to believe that, with the help of God, it can be worked out.

On January 31, 1975, in Mt. Clemens, Michigan, Bishop Thomas Gumbleton, the Auxiliary Bishop of Detroit, ordained me. I will not walk away from this commitment because I believe that this generation needs to see the charism of permanence. People can say "yes" and that "yes" can last until death.

Secondly, what has "saved" me in my ordained ministry over and over again is "humor," the ability to laugh at myself and to laugh, not at others, but with others. Our very existence is Mystery. Continually we face the unknown, and as we face the joy, the turmoil, and the tragedy of life, humor is a vital gift that sees us through.

I give thanks to God that, in my 42 years of ministry, the gift of humor has found its way into my life and ministry. So much of life is unknown, and, at times, may seem meaningless and even absurd! So, in the face of "not knowing" and consciously "living the questions", I choose to laugh, regale, and enjoy the Mystery, and to be in awe of what life places before us, knowing that God walks with us through it all.

These are the words of my Ordination Prayer Card. I pray this prayer often. Please pray it with your household when the opportunity arises:

Who is that Figure walking by the waters, along the shore white, shining and terrible? He looks at me with Knowing eyes that hurt. I think He sees my every fiber with those Eyes... glowing, blazing, probing, loving Eyes, dreadful, asking Eyes. They say straightforward Nothing less than all of you is what I want.

I feel that I am giving more of myself to the Lord today than I did 42 years ago, but I still have a long way to go before I am able to give the Lord everything. I encourage you to join me on the journey.

Let us pray that all of us, as Disciples of the Lord Jesus, each day, give a bit more of ourselves to Him until the transformation is total and complete!



the basic law such that this law is stretched far beyond those four short words to include not just killing but anger and insult. Not only that, the injunction not to kill should also include a path to reconciliation such that the integrity of one's worship depended on it: "If you bring your gift to the altar and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift...go first and be reconciled to your brother, then come and offer your gift" (Feb. 12).

Similarly, the law against adultery was extended to include lustful looks. The rule versus false oaths was broadened to pertain to dishonest speech of any kind. Perhaps the most difficult of all these antitheses was that which reinterpreted the centuries-old and deeply ingrained law of retaliation: "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth" (Feb. 19). This law was regarded as a safeguard against the common practice of seeking such a degree of vengeance on another that he/she would be rendered totally incapacitated and his/her goods completely squandered.

The "lex talionis," as it is called, was intended to seek only a "fair" measure of revenge, i.e., one eye for one eye, one tooth for one tooth. But the way of Jesus calls its adherents to seek no revenge whatsoever. How unappealing for those who keep careful account of the wrongs done them! How impossible for those who savor revenge! How downright challenging for those who want to take the demands of the Great Sermon to heart but just can't believe that Jesus is serious. Nevertheless, these are the demands, and these are to be embraced if we are to be authentic believers in Jesus.

"Blessed are they...." Matthew 5:1-12a

Decide for yourself whom you will serve, and then remain loval and faithful. For those who decide to serve anything or anyone other than God—what do they have in the end? Each of us knows very well the answer to this question. But those who choose God should not worry, says Jesus. Even though believing and having total trust in and reliance on God may seem impractical and even imprudent, God will never disappoint or neglect us. Even if a mother forgets, God never forgets (Feb. 26). On the contrary, those who allow themselves to be gripped by God's love need not waste any time or energy worrying about food. shelter, clothing, or any other worldly care. As did the earliest believers who formed a community of sisters and brothers whose love for God made them sensitive to the needs of others, we have been called to care for our brothers and sisters here and now. To that end we must be willing to share of our own substance so that no need is left unattended. So it was then; so should it be now.




