The Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA)—Time to "Pay It Forward"

This week we will begin this year's Diocesan Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). "Love letters" from me will be in the mail in a few days. Please take time to read and reflect on this information. I pray that it will move you to support this Appeal. This year's goal is \$3.5 million. As we, the Parish of St. Thomas More, have been helped by the Diocese, it is now our time to help our Diocese and our sister Parishes.

If you have not supported the ACA in the past, this is the year to begin to do so. If you have supported the ACA in the past, and you are in a position to increase your gift, this is the year to do so.

Here are some facts and figures that are important information for you to have as you reflect upon your gift to the ACA.

Know that all that you do is much appreciated by me!

Did You Know?

- 1. The **ten acres of land** on which our Parish Campus is built was a **GIFT** from the Diocese of San Diego. It has been the policy of the Diocese that it provides the land on which new Parishes will build their Campuses.
- 2. The Diocese of San Diego provided St. Thomas More Parish with a **\$2 million INTEREST FREE** loan to help us in the building of our Parish Center. We had been paying down this loan sporadically between 1999 and 2006. Then in January 2006 we began paying down the debt at \$11,000/month. Our last payment was in December 2011.
- **3.** The Diocese of San Diego helped us to secure a **\$6.6 million loan** with the National Office of the Knights of Columbus which allowed us to move forward and build our Permanent Church. Due to our good financial standing, the Diocese easily agreed to be the "second" on this loan.
- 4. The **Annual Catholic Appeal** (ACA) is our yearly opportunity to engage in the

Diocesan effort to participate in Jesus' mission of teaching, sanctifying, and serving.

5. The goal of this year's ACA is **\$3.5 million**. The money will be directed for these purposes:

†	Catholic Schools & Tuition Assistance:	\$1,400,000
†	Catholic Charities:	\$500,000
†	Retired Priests:	\$500,000
†	Seminarian Support:	\$500,000
†	Young Adult Ministry:	\$200,000
†	Prison Ministry:	\$150,000
†	Formation in the Faith:	\$250,000

- 6. Our **Fair Share Assessment** this year is **\$50,000**. This provides us with the opportunity "to pay it forward" and to assist not only the ongoing mission of Jesus on a Diocesan level, but to directly help other sister Parishes in our Diocese who are in need. Just as we have been helped, it is now our turn to help other Parishes.
- 7. Last year, only **375 STM households** out of **1,178** chose to participate in the ACA. Last year our assessment was \$50,000. We raised \$59,796 from 32% of the Parish. The average gift was \$159. Let us double the number of households participating in the ACA this year. I know that we can do this!
- 8. **100% of the money raised over** our \$50,000 assessment will be returned to our Parish and it will be directed to the Operations Budget to ensure that we continue to balance our bottom line. Last year, a little over \$9,000 was returned to the Parish and was directed to our Operations Budget.
- Beginning this weekend, and continuing for the several weekends, you will find Bulletin inserts describing how the ACA money is directed and used. Please take time to read these inserts each week.

Please respond favorably to my "love letter." Please prayerfully reflect upon this information and act accordingly.





SINGING CHANGES YOUR BRAIN

lower stress, relieve anxiety, and elevate endorphins

Whether you sing in the pews or in one of our music ensembles, you already know that there are many *spiritual* benefits to "praying twice," as St. Augustine called it. Indeed, the US Bishops began their 2007 document on singing as follows:

God has bestowed upon his people the gift of song. God dwells within each human person, in the place where music takes its source. God, the giver of song, is present whenever his people sing his praises (Sing to the Lord 1).

As we approach Lent and church musicians all over the world begin their preparations for Easter, it is a good time to remind everyone about *non-spiritual* reasons for singing in church. I share the following article with you to encourage you to keep singing in the pews, and, if you aren't already, to sing in the choir for Lent and Easter!



When you sing, musical vibrations move through you, altering your physical and emotional landscape. Group singing, for those who have done it, is the most exhilarating and transformative of all. It takes something incredibly intimate, a sound that begins inside you, shares it with a roomful of people and it comes back as something even more thrilling: harmony. So it's not surprising that group singing is on the rise. According to Chorus America, 32.5 million adults sing in choirs, up by almost 10 million over the past six years. Many people think of church music when you bring up group singing, but there are over 270,000 choruses across the country and they include gospel groups to show choirs like the ones depicted in Glee to strictly amateur


As the popularity of group singing

grows, science has been hard at work trying to explain why it has such a calming yet energizing effect on people. What researchers are beginning to discover is that singing is like an infusion of the perfect tranquilizer, the kind that both soothes your nerves and elevates your spirits.

The elation may come from endorphins, a hormone released by singing, which is associated with feelings of pleasure. Or it might be from oxytocin, another hormone released during singing, which has been found to alleviate anxiety and stress. Oxytocin also enhances feelings of trust and bonding, which may explain why still more studies have found that singing lessens feelings of depression and loneliness. A very recent study even attempts to make the case that "music evolved as a tool of social living," and that the pleasure that comes from singing together is our evolutionary reward for coming together cooperatively, instead of hiding alone, every cave-dweller for him or herself.

The benefits of singing regularly seem to be cumulative. In one study, singers were found to have lower levels of cortisol, indicating lower preliminary stress. Α very investigation suggesting our heart rates may sync up during group singing could also explain why singing together sometimes feels like a guided group meditation. Study after study has found that singing relieves anxiety and contributes to quality of life.

It turns out you don't even have to be a good singer to reap the rewards. According to one 2005 study, group singing "can produce satisfying and therapeutic sensations even when the sound produced by the vocal instrument is of mediocre quality."

Singing groups vary from casual affairs where no audition is necessary to serious, committed professional or avocational choirs like the Los Angeles Master Chorale or my chorus in New York City, which I joined when I was 26 and depressed, all based on a single memory of singing in a choir at Christmas, an experience so euphoric I never forgot it.

Group singing is cheaper than therapy, healthier than drinking, and certainly more fun than working out. It is the one thing in life where feeling better is pretty much guaranteed. Even if you walked into rehearsal exhausted and depressed, by the end of the night you'll walk out high as a kite on endorphins and good will.

Stewardship of God's Word Reading the Bible



February is a transitional month, especially in 2017 with its 28th day right on the doorstep of Ash Wednesday, March 1, and the season of Lent.

What better time than February, before Lent and the advent of spring, to settle in for some reading and praying with sacred scripture? February can be a quiet time of patient reflection for the Christian steward. The psalms, like so many biblical passages, remind us of the benefits of reading God's word: "Your word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path" (Ps.119:105).

Our liturgical year offers us a wonderful pathway to the Bible by providing Lectionary readings for each day. Our Sunday Gospel readings this year come to us mainly from St. Matthew. This month we have an opportunity to reflect on Christ's teachings in his Sermon on the Mount with its hope-filled Beatitudes. This Gospel is ideal for spending time with the Lord in quiet meditation.

In the Gospel of St. Matthew Jesus gives us a guide to Christian living. If you choose to read this great book of the Bible, consider just one episode in the Gospel each time you read it. Put yourself into the scene. See what words strike a chord in you. Ask the Lord to help you know him through the Gospel reading.

One of the hallmarks of St. Matthew's Gospel is his emphasis on discipleship and what it means to follow Jesus. Christian stewards look to this Gospel to gain new insights into their journey of faith; and much like the desires of gardeners, long for the seeds of the Gospel, especially the Beatitudes, to be planted in their own hearts. Find some quiet time. Pick up your Bible. And use God's gift of these quiet February days to deepen your knowledge of Christ through sacred scripture.


