The Forty Days of Lent

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. We begin the Season of Lent. In these days, we are called to embrace the disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as we focus upon the Passion of Jesus the Christ.

Through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving we clear our minds and hearts a bit in order to make more room in our lives for the Paschal Mystery of Christ, his suffering, death, and resurrection.

We dare to ask ourselves "What meaning does the Passion of the Christ have for me?" and "How am I uniting my life to the Paschal Mystery of Christ?"

I encourage you to take seriously what our Parish offers you during this Season of Lent. Let your Lenten journey be not only private, but also communal.

Begin your walk with your Parish Family on the road of renewal and refreshment by attending Mass on Ash Wednesday and being signed with ashes. This external sign is a commitment of your desire and readiness for interior renewal. Take advantage of the Stations of the Cross that will be prayed on Friday evenings.

Attend Mass each Sunday as a family, ALL household members present together. Plan ahead for the Triduum—Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday...



Let us continue to pray for peace in our world.




Why Brother Benno's?



OUR PRAYERS LIKE INCENSE

Lent — a sense of the season

We mark our days, not according to the numbers and squares on a calendar, but according to the observances of the liturgical seasons. Lent is the time for prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These ageold disciplines reflect our basic concerns; our relationship with God (prayer), with our bodies (fasting), and with each other (almsgiving), which ultimately help us to reflect on our life with Christ and prepare to renew our baptismal vows.

We keep our eyes focused on the Sanctuary, mindful that Lent is a time for visual fasting; it is a time to journey with our catechumens; it is a time to be personally confronted by the Gospel's demand for our ongoing conversion. 

Christian Stewardship ~ Our Journey with God

In Akron, Ohio there was a medical doctor, Charles Casto, who embodied his faith. Dr. Casto began manifesting his faith in life through pro bono work in Bolivia. Taking two of his children with him, he participated in medical missionary work with other medical personnel among indigenous Bolivians.

What is particularly remarkable is the fact that Dr. Casto himself was severely handicapped through two major physical problems: first, when a young boy, he played in a pick-up sandlot softball game and during the game injured his hip. He received medical attention



for the injury, but the cure was worse than the affliction. His hip never properly healed, and by the time proper medical attention was given to it, the damage was irreparable.

Secondly, when on a hunting expedition in Canada with a group of other physicians, Dr. Casto was caught unaware in his hunting, by a cow moose, who trampled him and damaged his good leg. He had the good fortune of being among doctors (the only thing that saved his life) but he then was crippled in his other leg.

Recently, with his hips and knees replaced by plastic and steel, Dr. Casto undertook medical mission work in Central America. The site was a two-hour walk up a mountain trail, a trip he could not undertake on foot, and even mule-back travel was impossible because he couldn't sit on the animal.

The villagers fashioned a sedan chair from an old wooden dining room chair and two two-by-fours wrapped with padding and carried him to the work site. Even with that accommodation, Dr. Casto was drenched with sweat and in pain. Still, he spent the next week from dawn to dusk with medical situations brought on by neglect and lack of available health care. Why did he endure this pain and labor? In his words, "I'm a Christian, and I can't imagine not using my skills in the service of others."

The saying, "charity begins at home," is not found in the Bible, but it does make a point. We should help those in need, beginning with those closest to us: our family, our relatives, our neighbors.

It may be easier to help the anonymous poor of Ethiopia than a relative who can't manage money, but both the Old and New Testaments agree that our generosity should begin with those we are bound to in one way or another.

The difficulty saying only "charity begins at home" is that it is often used to justify charity ending there. This idea is something Scripture does not teach. On the contrary and when possible, our acts of charity are to ripple ever farther out to the needs of the world.




