The Gift of the Holy Spirit

"When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were.

Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim" (*Acts 2:1-4*).

Our Catholic Church proclaims seven gifts of the Holy Spirit that help us to sustain the moral life. These are permanent dispositions that make us docile in following the promptings of the Holy Spirit: *Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of the Lord.*

In faith, as we accept the gifts of the Spirit, we begin to see effects in our lives. These effects then make changes for the better in our lives and in the world. The tradition of the Church lists twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit, perfections that the Holy Spirit forms in us as the first fruits of eternal glory: *Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Generosity, Gentleness, Faithfulness, Modesty, Self-control, and Chastity* (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1830, #1831, #1832).

"Come, Holy Spirit, fill my heart with your holy gifts. Let my weakness be penetrated with your strength this very day that I may fulfill the duties of my state in life conscientiously, that I may do what is right and just. Let my charity be such as to offend no one and hurt no one's feelings; so generous as to pardon sincerely any wrong done to me. Assist me in all the trials of life, enlighten me in my ignorance, advise me in my doubts, strengthen my weakness, help me in all needs and embarrassment, protect me in temptations and console me in all afflictions. Graciously hear me, O Holy Spirit, and pour your light into my heart, my soul and my mind. Assist me to live a holy life and to grow in goodness and grace. Amen" (Samuel Cardinal Stritch).

On this Feast of Pentecost, may we each seek the gift of the Holy Spirit! Take time in prayer in these days of Pentecost to reflect upon the gifts and the fruits of the Holy Spirit.

AN EMBARRASSMENT OF RICHES

If there is a better way to describe the invaluable gifts of God which we celebrate this month, I have not found it. Today, we have been blessed with an embarrassment of riches in the gift of the Holy Spirit (June 4), the Most Holy Trinity (June 11), and the Holy Eucharist (June 18). While none of these gifts can be earned, and we sinners are completely undeserving of them, nevertheless and true to his promises, Jesus has blessed us with all of them. In so doing,

may experience in his service.

there present heard them speak of the "mighty acts of God" (Acts). To bring home and affirm this message, we might rephrase Luke's "roll call" of the nations (Parthians, Medes, Elamites, etc.) to read: "We are Libyans, Syrians, Yemenites, Somalis, Sudanese, Iraqis, and Iranians. We are Russians, Mexicans, South Africans, Congolese, Canadians, Chinese, Americans..." No one people, no one country or creed has a monopoly on the Spirit. Indeed, this same Spirit inspires different people with different gifts (1 Corinthians), but our shared mission, as the Johannine Jesus has affirmed, is one and the same: peace and forgiveness, not suspicion, segregation, and hate.

Peace, forgiveness, and love! Would that these words touch our minds and hearts. Would that we take these words seriously and allow the Spirit of Jesus to penetrate to the depths of who we are so as to transform smallness into magnanimity. If only we would allow, the presence and power of the Holy Spirit can accomplish what seems to be more and more impossible. If we allow, the elusive peace that humans cannot seem to establish, can be given to us by God. But we, in faith and good will, must appropriate it, cultivate and preserve it and do our level best not to get in the way so that the Spirit can work through us.

In addition to the gift of the Spirit, the risen Jesus has also invited his disciples to share in the loving relationship which he knows and shares with God and the Spirit. We are never without companionship, support, and encouragement because our triune God dwells within each of us. In celebrating the Most Holy Trinity (June 11), we revel in the assurance that God relates to us as Father/Mother, as Brother/Mentor, and as Spirit/Advocate and Defender. How can this be? John assures us that this relationship from which we draw life and breath is due to nothing other than the love of God who gave Jesus in the incarnation and gave Jesus up to death on a cross so that we might more fully know and be known fully by God.

Inspired by the Spirit and rooted in a loving relationship with our triune God, we, as Jesus' disciples, are also nourished and sustained by him. Jesus' gift of his very self in the Eucharist is food for us

sinners on life's journey (June 18). Unlike any other food, which is assimilated into the one who eats, the Eucharist is not assimilated by us. Rather, we, by our eating of Jesus' body and blood, are assimilated into him. Fed by Jesus, we become one with him, beloved of God, children of God and heirs of the reign of God, here and forever. Those who are thus assimilated into Christ have both the privilege and responsibility to daily become more and more like him in the way we live and love, in how we make friends and do business, in the causes we support, and in how we vote. The more we are assimilated into Christ, the more effective and authentic will be our witness to the world. That witness rightly begins at the celebration of the Eucharist. When we approach to receive the sacrament, the Eucharistic ministers say "The body of Christ" ... "The blood of Christ," to which we respond "Amen." Our "Amen" expresses our acceptance and affirmation of Christ our Lord and Savior. But our "Amen" also voices our acceptance and affirmation of the body of Christ which is the church. That "Amen" affirms our rootedness in the believing community and our willingness to be both salt and light,

When this responsibility becomes burdensome or seems an impossible undertaking, we can look to the experience of those who have gone before us in faith. As Jeremiah shares his woes and worries with us on June 25, he is also careful to remind us that even in the depths of his misery, "The Lord is with me, like a mighty champion...sing to the Lord, praise the Lord." Lest we think our Creator is not paying attention as we labor and suffer, Matthew will assure us that God, who may seem distant and silent, is so attentive that every hair on our head is known to God. Moreover, God keeps careful account of every sparrow and how often each lights upon the ground. "So, do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows!"
