A TIME FOR LEARNING AND GROWING

the excitement of going back to school. As a child, my mother would take my older brother and me to our local supermarket to pick out school supplies: pencils, pens, scissors, a ruler, binders, and lots of lined paper. At home, I would take special care in labeling each of the larger items with my full name and then placing everything in my brand new backpack. Now, I am a mother with three children of my own to take school shopping.

I have always loved September and

These past few years I had the privilege of joining in the fun as I pursued a graduate degree in pastoral studies. Each semester I'd gleefully shop for my books and sometimes even pick up a new binder, a fancy set of pens, and crisp, loose-leaf paper to fill with all the great thoughts I was destined to have

This year, when the children head back to their classrooms, I'll stay home. But never fear, "mother church," in her wisdom, has given all of her children a time for learning and growing in the faith. In the liturgical calendar, we know it under the name of "Ordinary Time." This time (between our great feasts of Christmas and Easter and before we embrace the practice of preparation in Advent and Lent) is far from mundane, however. This is a time of journeying and expansion. Just as the children in our communities and families embrace learning anew, we are called to join them and the psalms of September point the way.

On the **22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time** the psalmist sings, "My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God." This thirst is not a comfortable metaphor, but a physical ache involving pining flesh and dehydration "like the earth, parched, lifeless and without water." One can

only grow in faith if one desires to. All teachers know that learning requires collaboration. The best teaching in the world will make no difference if the student does not desire the learning being offered. And, so it is with us, the first step in growing in our faith is to be in touch with the thirst deep within us that only the Lord can quench. For it is only in fully experiencing this thirst that we shall be satisfied.

On the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time the psalmist tells of a time when human (not spiritual) thirst was satisfied—in the desert at Massah and Meribah. The Israelites had followed Moses into freedom from Egypt, but still needed to be formed as a people after God's own heart before entering into the promised land. Their time of learning and growing lasted for 40 years and was not without its trials. Early in their journey, the people began to grumble against Moses because of their human thirst. Not yet trusting in the One who had brought them out of Egypt by splitting the Red Sea in two, they asked, "Why then did you bring us up out of Egypt? To have us die of thirst with our children and our livestock?" (Exodus 17:3). And, though God told Moses to use his staff to produce water from a rock to satisfy the people's thirst, their hearts remained hardened. Only with a thirst for knowledge and an open heart can we grow in God's love. They are the necessary preconditions for learning, and only once they are fulfilled can we encounter the true source of wisdom, pointed to in the last two Sundays of the monthemulating God.

"The Lord is kind and merciful, slow to anger, and rich in compassion," the psalmist proclaims on the **24th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. This description of God is

how we are also called to be. When asked how many times we are to forgive in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus replies, "not seven times but seventy-seven times," a symbolic number meaning infinitely. The only way it is possible to extend this forgiveness to others is if we have received it ourselves and have truly experienced the God who has removed our sins from us "as far as the east is from the west."

The inclusivity of God's love and mercy is made clear on the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time when the psalmist states, "The Lord is near to all who call upon him." Our God's generosity is not dealt out according to merit or human justice as the workers in the vineyard in the Gospel discover. God's mercy and love are bestowed upon all people in abundance beyond our human understanding. This is the abundance and mercy we are called to imitate. This is the way of love into which we are to grow.

In this month of September, as school bells ring throughout many of our communities, may we also return to the school of love and learn from the wisdom of the psalms about the wonder of our God.






